Definition of Battleground

<u>Total 16-state Presidential and Senate battleground</u>: Arizona, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Iowa, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Mexico, North Carolina, Maine, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, Wisconsin

<u>8 Diverse States</u> = AZ (+5), CO (+1), FL (+2), GA (+5), NV (+1), NM (+3), NC (+3), VA (+1)

<u>8 Blue Wall States</u> = IA (+3), MI (+1), ME (+3), MN (+1), NH (-), OH (+3), PA (-), WI (-)

<u> 4 Regions :</u>

- Northeast (ME, NH, PA),
- Midwest (IA, MI, MN, OH, WI)
- South (FL, GA, NC, VA)
- West (AZ, CO, NM, NV)

*(Republican PVI advantage) (PVI – even) (Democratic PVI advantage)



Methodology

TWO BATTLEGROUND WEB POLLS, WEIGHTED TO PHONE POLL

AUGUST BATTLEGROUND WEB POLL: A1,000 sample web survey of registered voters in a 16-state battleground as conducted online September 9-13, 2020 from a voter-file sample..

- The registered voter web surveys are voter-file matched to produce a high-quality samples of real voters with the added advantage of known vote history. They are also well-suited for conducting experiments to test message strategies and executions.
- One survey of 1,000 registered voters included core content to track movement over time, while another survey of 1,000 was fielded simultaneously to conduct experiments and test message strategies.

WEIGHTING TO PHONE POLLS: A phone poll of 1,00 registered voters in this 16-state battleground was conducted by phone September 8-13, 2020 from a voter-file sample. 67% of respondents were reached on cell phones in order to accurately reflect the American electorate. The margin of error is +/- 3.5 percentage points.

- The phone survey includes core demographic and ideological questions, including key thermometer measures, and is used to compare and apply political and cultural weights the web survey results to offset bias of online sample.
- Only with such a survey can we properly weight our web surveys, which we know are often biased to be culturally liberal and more educated.



Key Findings:

- Biden is successfully structuring the race to dominate the blue wall states of Minnesota, Wisconsin, Michigan, Pennsylvania, New Hampshire, and Maine, but elsewhere, he is reducing his and US Senate margins.
- These are the powerful new dynamics: total consolidation of Sanders voters and further growth of millennial and young support; further growth of women's support across RAE; and surge in support with white college grads, both men and women. That could help in suburban seats.
- But the white working class (44 percent of the electorate) is a different.
 White working class men have pulled back sharply from Biden, and Trump now enjoys a 40-point lead on track to match his 2016 margin.
- White working class women have not yet moved: Biden trails by only 10 points), but they are consumed by health care and Biden's ads, say "build on the progress." The women instead want to see big health care changes, wealth tax, & reforming government to work for the middle class.



But simulated race with new messages can change this:

- The new information included a Republican voter attack on conservative values; Biden respecting Trump voters by not asking to regret vote, but explain how both parties left divided and rigged and can now be united; a policy agenda prioritizing reducing health care costs; and Biden posing a choice of Biden for the middle class, not Wall Street and CEOs.
- The simulated campaign raised Biden's margin by 2 points, reversing the pull back in this survey.
- The new information raised Biden's vote 9 points with GOP defectors, 8 with whites under 30, 7 with millennial women, and most importantly, 4 points with white working-class women.

Biden's message on mom-and-pop over Trump cronies; middle class built country, not CEOs and Wall Street

Less than a third of economic relief during the pandemic has gone to mainstream businesses. Instead, it went to Trump's cronies.
