Sample methodology

• Democracy Corps conducted a web survey with 2,357 voters from November 14 to November 22, in the presidential, House seats and US Senate battlegrounds for the 2024 general election. The data include a **base sample** of 1,296 registered voters representative of the battleground states and Congressional districts overall, with oversamples of 528 Black voters, 503 Hispanic voters, and 314 Asian American or Pacific Islander voters. The oversample data are statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, age, and gender composition reflects that of projected 2024 general election voters in the collective battleground.

- This was a change election that was made amazingly close by voters wanting the middle class to govern, not the richest and for women to have equal rights. Harris ran an effective campaign that ran well with white unmarried women, women college graduates, Asians, and Cheney conservatives.
- Trump won above all because of the border out of control and wanting him to deport the
 undocumented. Also, because of the economy and his economy "being good for me," and
 calling out "woke," liberal policies, including promoting transgender "operations" and
 "participation in sports." He dominated which candidate was better on the border and
 immigration, every policy issue issue, including China, and who was a "strong leader."
 President Biden's high disapproval created strong headwinds with white working class
 voters, Hispanics, and millennials.
- Trump and House Republicans gained and tipped the election at the end by shifting key parts of the Democratic base white Gen Z voters, Hispanics and Blacks, particularly, the men and those under 45 years. One in ten voters decided in the last week, and a majority of those under 45 voted on Election Day.





- The Democrats' priorities in government and the last three elections with Trump made it key
 to champion the middle class and its priorities at this key juncture. They wanted safe
 communities with less violent crime, not open borders with competition for public services.
 They wanted the richest to not have so much power. They wanted help with the cost of
 living and opportunity for their kids. Look at the intense support taxing billionaires, the
 expanded monthly Child Tax Credit, and getting monopolies making super profits to help
 with high prices.
- This election was lost by Democrats because of their weak support with Hispanics, white Gen Z voters, and younger and Black men.
- The elite, activists, and leadership of the key groups are just not able to see what these voters really care about. It is most marked for Hispanics. They are the group most angered by current immigration policies and most in support of deporting the undocumented. They want education to provide opportunity for their kids, and they see Democrats prioritizing non-gender bathrooms and transgender participating in public school sports.





- White Gen Z and voters under 30 flagged as a reason to vote for Harris "her help with the cost of living, like the monthly Child Tax Credit, the cost of housing and small business." But they were intensely opposed to transgender participation in sports and were clearly impacted by Trump's closing campaign.
- Blacks, especially the men and under 45 years, were the voters most concerned with violent crime and not police excess and angry at the flood of undocumented immigrants. They were also uncomfortable with transgender policies. But they were most upset about the excess power held by the big corporations and the voters who gave the highest priority to the Child Tax Credit. They did not hear those priorities from Democrats.
- The result: the Democratic Party gets its most "Fs" on "citizens having priority over non-citizens," "listening to you, not the elites," and "sharing your values."
- This poll showed 4 percent of Trump voters switched their vote to Harris if they heard
 messages that I tested during the election and shared publicly. She would have won
 comfortably. One said Hispanics are a priority to me, one addressed crime and the other, the
 border. The overall message spoke of empowering the middle class, with reassurances on
 crime and the border.






- There are many structural reasons why Democrats have their current issue priorities, and it won't be easy to change them. A Democratic presidential primary might have done that.
- But there is no reason to think that Trump's current winning coalition is at all stable. Much of it depended on running against Joe Biden in a period of accumulating anger over inflation, the loss of control at the border, and Biden prioritizing America's legacy of slavery.
- Trump has strong support for getting the border under control and deporting undocumented immigrants. Raiding hospitals and schools will get pushback but don't assume he will lose support with Hispanics on the policy direction.
- Voters are unforgiving if you don't get prices down, and they are not looking for the oligarchs to shephard huge tax cuts for big corporations, cuts in federal health care programs, and public support for working people the middle class.
- Harris performed even more poorly than Biden with white working class women and men, indeed, worse with all working class voters. Addressing their discontent represents the biggest challenge facing Democrats.










Harris nearly tied in Rust Belt; made North Carolina & Georgia close, while weakest in Arizona & Nevada









Trump and House Republicans gained at the campaign close



Harris ran strong with Asians, white unmarried women, and college women; underwhelming with Blacks, Hispanics, & white Gen Z/millennials. White working class below 2020








Trump made big gains with Blacks, Hispanics, and white Gen Z


In the base, only white unmarried women gave Harris big gains.





Trump made significant gains with independents, while Harris gained with Cheney conservatives












About 10 percent of voters decided who to vote for in the last week — and they broke for Trump by 7 points (44 to 51 percent)



Trump voters who considered Harris put cost of living ahead of deporting, but both high. Also, because kept us at peace.








The border and deporting the top reason for nearly all groups, from the base to the white working class



Moderate Democrats put the transgender policies in third rank.








Top reason to oppose Harris is open border, pushed up by all white working class and white college and unmarried women

Hispanics put the open border as top reason to oppose.








Banning transgender participation in women's sports strongly supported by all, including with Democratic base groups



The Trump considered Harris voters make no mention of fascism but do mention the ACA and help with the cost of living.








Voters who supported Kamala Harris wanted to protect democracy, healthcare, and social safety net

Black voters put help with the cost of living in close 3rd place, with help with Child Tax Credit and housing.








The child tax credit remains overwhelmingly popular



Trump voters who considered Harris put corrupt self-dealing, Elon Musk, and deporting immigrants, but none stand out








Top reason to oppose Trump follow what campaign stressed — threat to democracy, corruption, and threats to ACA and health programs








Harris led with intensity on issues that put the race very close — women's rights, addressing climate, and will not work for the richest






Trump led intensely on the border, immigration, and strong leader, but also on foreign policy issues












Across the board, voters also overwhelmingly support raising taxes on billionaires

White women of all classes & Blacks offer intense support for taxing billionaires.





Over half of white union households and working class are very warm about attacking the monopolies' super profits to lower costs.








Elon Musk's base is white working class men and white Gen Z

A majority of Hispanics and 1/3rd of Blacks have favorable view of Musk.








Overwhelming support for efforts to fight climate change, but especially among Blacks, white Gen Z, millennials, & Hispanics; but also white union households & WWCW














