Results of 2022 national polls

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Key Findings

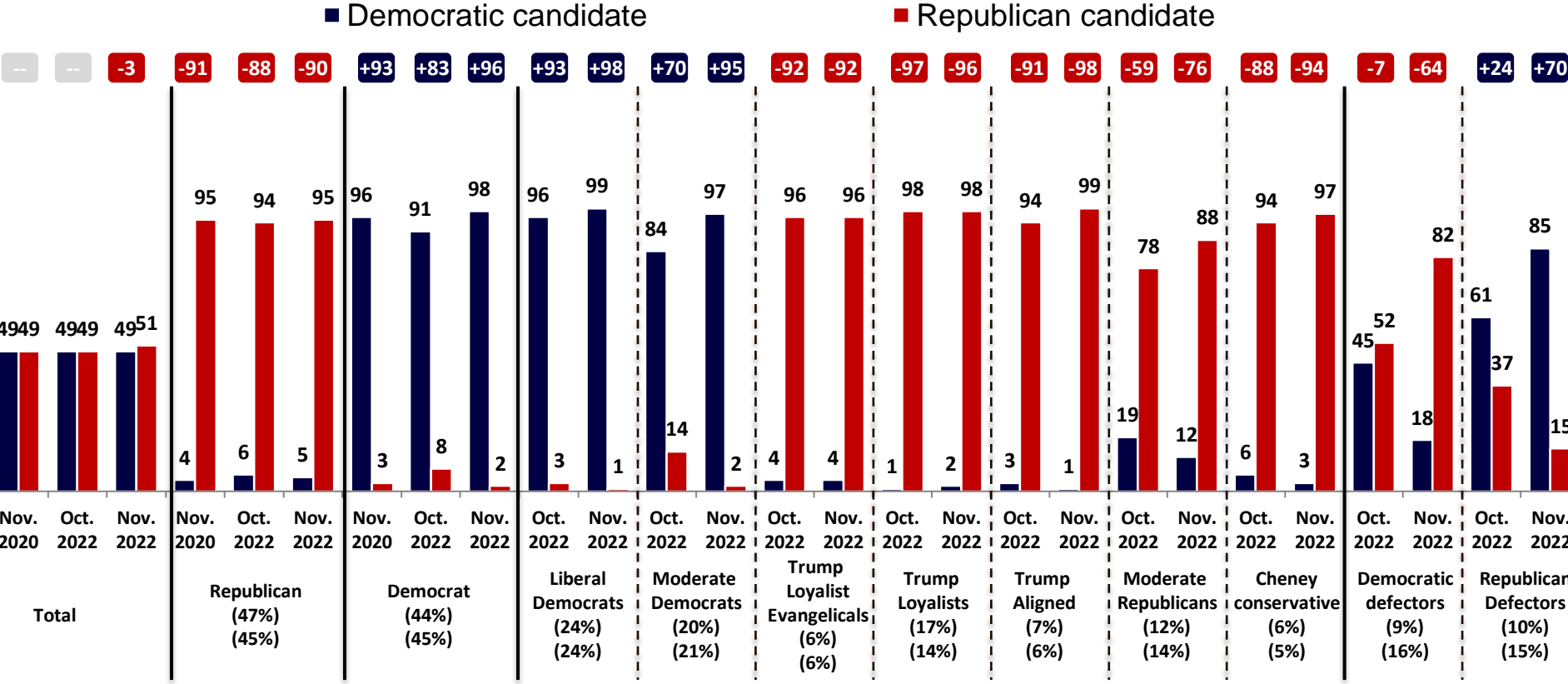
- This is now a party with a base of Trump loyalists but also groups of non-Trump, anti-MAGA voters.
- The Trump loyalists are 58 percent of the party. His control has been contested, and it made it insecure. In primaries, his candidates got 55 to 60 percent, reflecting the proportion who are Trump loyalists.
- Trump dominates the party, not because of his support across all factions, but because of the intense loyalty of those who strongly approve of him. The Trump loyalists raise their share of the vote to 63 percent in actual elections, and the moderates lower theirs.
- Because of the insurrection, you now have two groups for potential defection: Cheney conservatives and the moderate Republicans. The election days survey shows conclusively that a significant number of these voters abstain rather than go to polls and vote for the Democrat. However, Democrats gain from both ticket splitting and abstention.
- All factions intensively dislike Nancy Pelosi, Black Lives Matter, undocumented immigrants, and transgender people participating in sports. They worry about whites becoming a minority and would ban the teaching of CRT.
- Potential fractures are there now on MAGA, taxing billionaires, Obamacare, and overturning Roe v. Wade. The last is important to moderate Republicans. The ACA may be a factor with Evangelical Trump loyalists.
- The two parties are at parity nationally, and I believe that is because Democrats are out of touch on the economy and crime and not able to address them. That will be taken up in the working class project.

Trump's party unified in deep hostility to Speaker Pelosi, Black Lives Matter, and undocumented immigrants

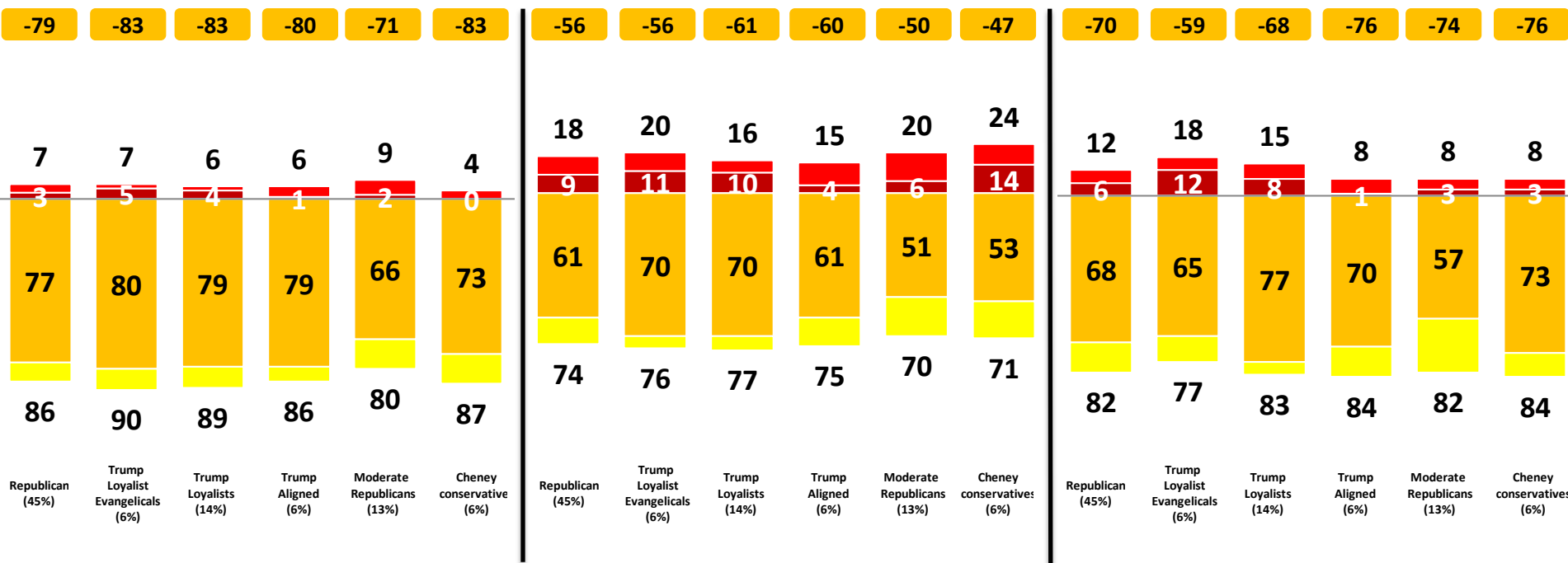

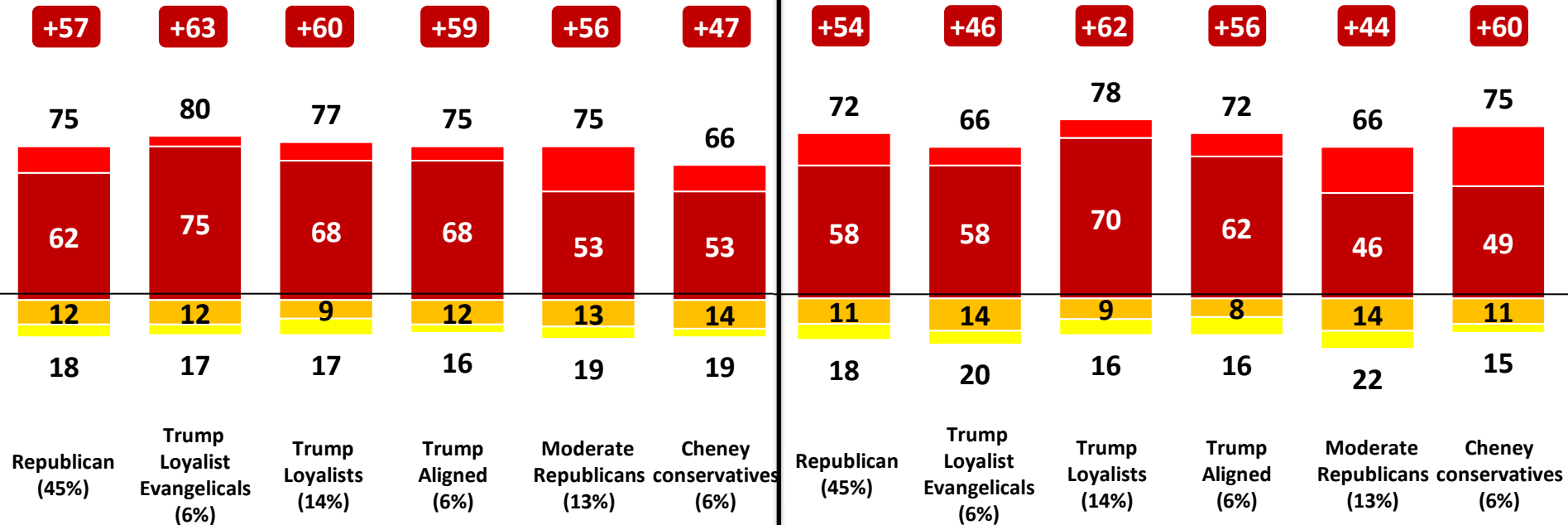
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Banning transgender athletes from participating in women's sports

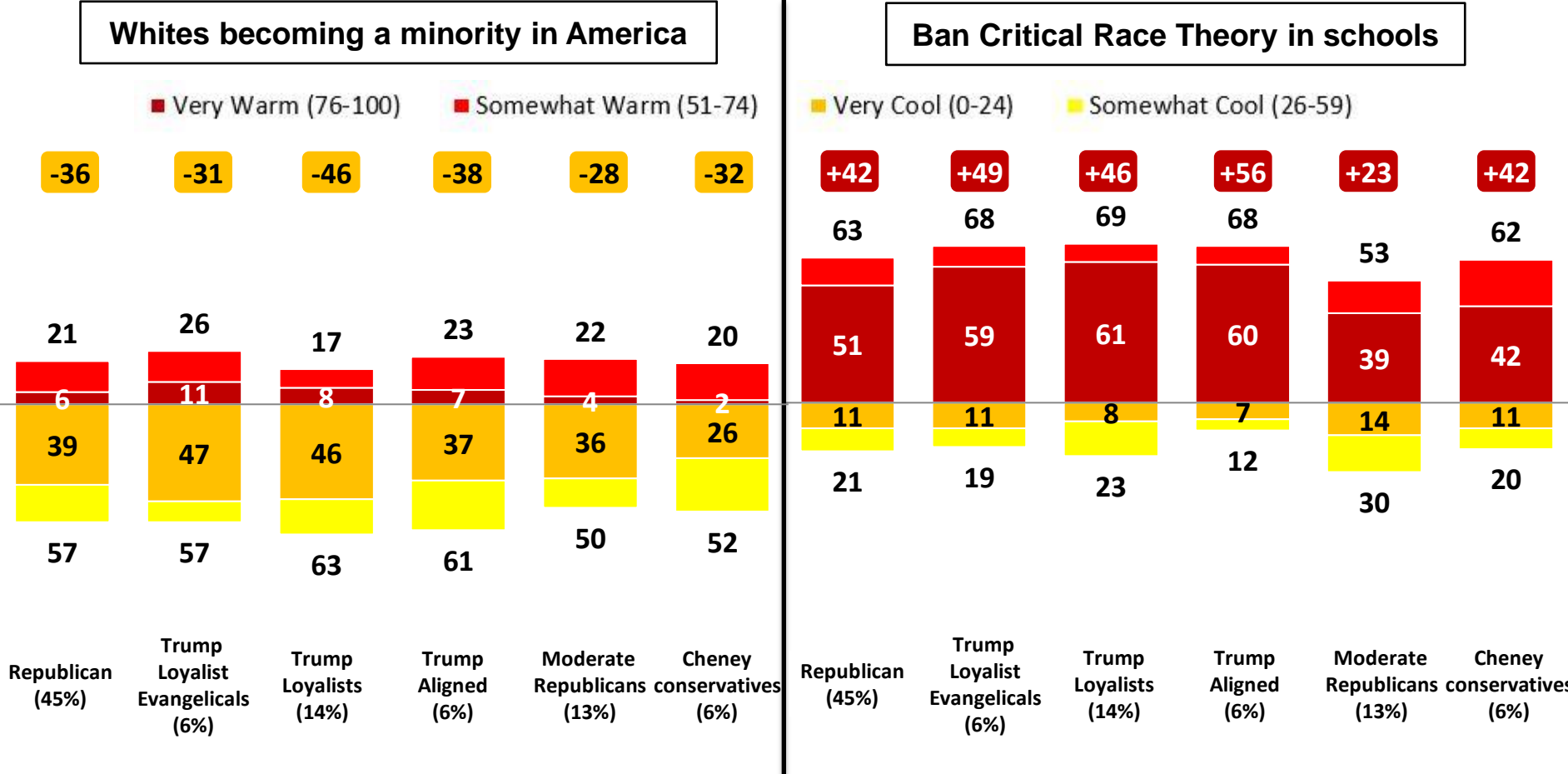

Trump's GOP: Potential Fractures

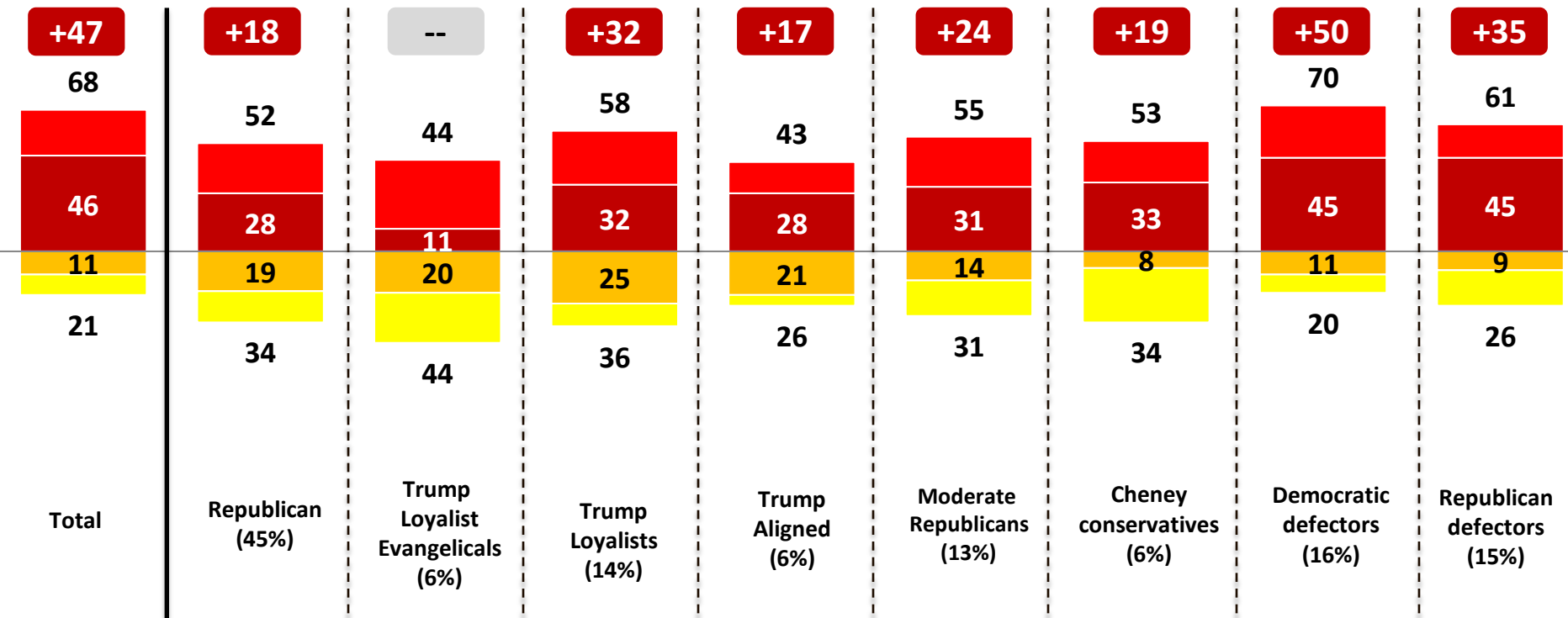


Almost 60% of Trump loyalists – the heart of Trump’s GOP – want to tax billionaires

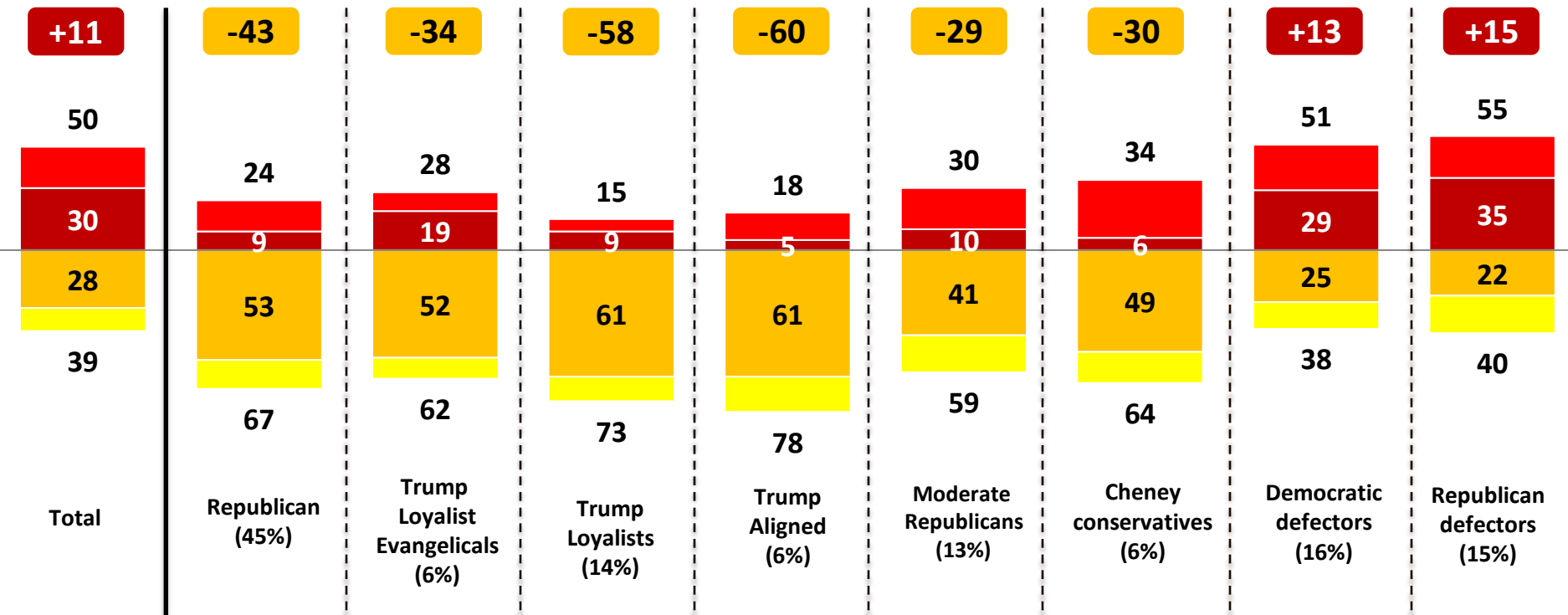

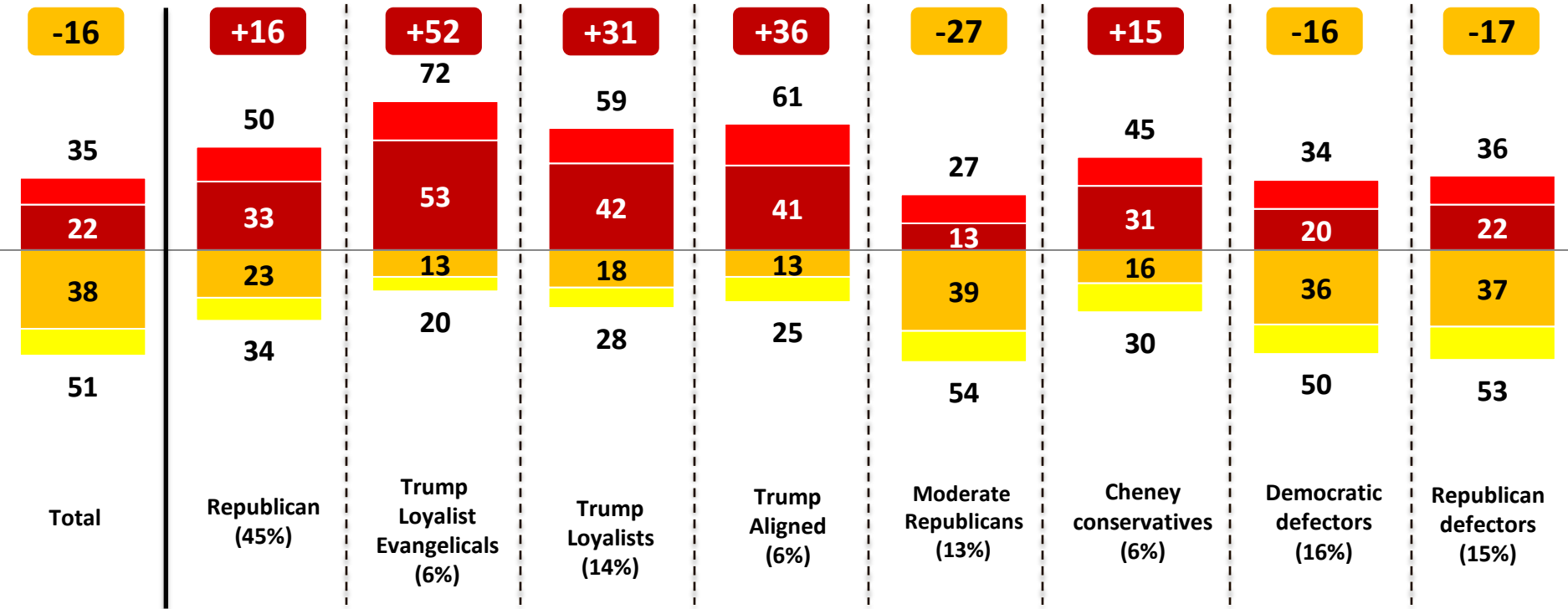

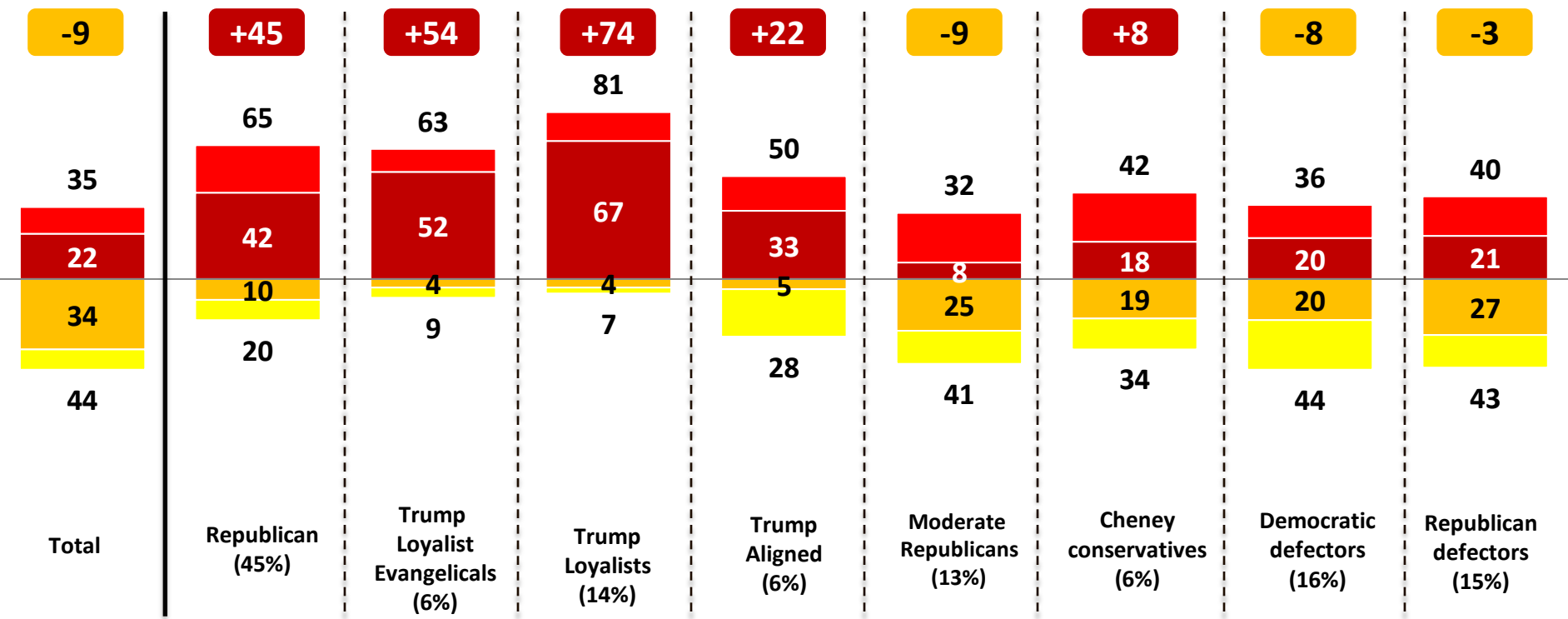
