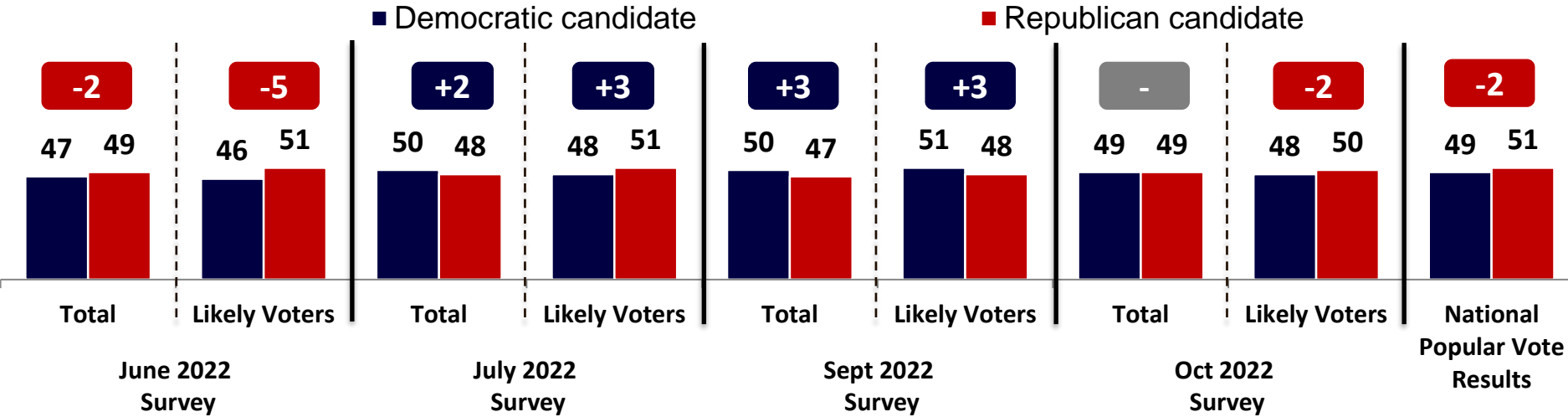
Democracy Corps conducted a web survey with 2,500 voters from Nov. 5-11, 2023 in the presidential, House seats and US Senate battlegrounds for the 2024 general election. The data include a base sample of 1,000 registered voters, with oversamples of 500 Black voters, 500 Hispanic voters, and 500 Asian American voters. The oversample data are statistically weighted to ensure the sample's regional, age, and gender composition reflects that of projected 2024 general election voters in the collective battleground.

The total data set of 2,500 registered voters (1,000 base sample plus 1,500 oversample of voters of color) were weighted down to an effective sample size of 1,000, representative of the battleground states and districts. The sample used voter file data for proportions on race, age, and gender, along with 2020 CNN exit polling data to ensure that difficult-to-reach conservative subgroups by race, gender, and education were properly represented. And it weighted the cultural thermometers (NRA and pro-life groups), to offset the bias of on-line panels.

The total sample of 2,500 Registered Voters (1,000 Weighted) includes:

- 1,534 Registered Voters in Presidential Battleground States (685 Weighted)
- 1,194 Registered Voters in Senate Battleground States (553 Weighted)
- 533 Registered Voters in Congressional Battleground Districts (188 Weighted)
- 742 White Voters (750 Weighted)
- 633 Black/African-American Voters (120 Weighted)
- 574 Hispanic/Latino Voters (80 Weighted)
- 511 Asian American (Asian) Voters (30 Weighted)

Key findings

- President Biden trails Donald Trump by 5 points in the battleground states and loses at least another point when we include the independent candidates who get 17 percent of the vote. Biden is trying to win these states where three quarters believe country is on the wrong track and 48 percent say, “I will never vote for Biden.”
- Can the President get back to win these voters and states? I believe the answer is yes, though not if you think next year’s partisan polarization, the abortion issue and the risk of a Trump presidency will bring them home. That is a dangerous strategy when the base of Blacks, Hispanics, Asians, LGBTQ+ community, Gen Z, millennials, unmarried and college women give Trump higher approval ratings than Biden.
- The Democrats enter the election year in a more competitive position than the Biden-Trump contest. These very same voters are putting Democrats even in the congressional battleground seats and 2 points ahead in the likely electorate; 6 points in the Senate. They are 12 points with a broad future message.
- The starting point is all Democratic campaigns understanding why these voters are so angry and disappointed and building a focused strategy from there.
- The most important starting point is recognizing that 76 percent believe the country is headed in the wrong direction. They desperately want to change. Dwelling on how much you have accomplished turns off these voters.

Key findings

- Why do so many voters think the country is off track?
- Above all, they are desperate about inflation and the cost of living: 64 percent choose it as the top problem — about 30 points higher than any other. The Biden presidency is defined by that inflation and the longer it extends, the angry people get. They want leaders to get it and government to help. The survey shows how this has become the only issue for Gen Z, millennials, unmarried women, & white working class voters under 50. Not created by media.
- Democrats talking about this strong economy and things moving in the right direction sounds like you are talking about a different country. Voters and our base most of all are worried about inflation and the cost of living, crime, homelessness and violence, the economy and employment and immigration and the border.
- Black, Hispanics and Asian voters put crime, homelessness and violence as their second worry. Democratic erosion is multi-faceted. Our own voters give Trump and Republicans higher ratings on wages staying ahead of prices, handling crime and the border. Many in our base would welcome policies that come with a potential Trump term.
- The Trump-led polarization has put on steroids the worry about what happens if the other party wins. A Biden victory, most worry, will bring open borders allowing millions of impoverished migrants and drug dealers and violent cities, with homelessness killing business and criminals killing police.

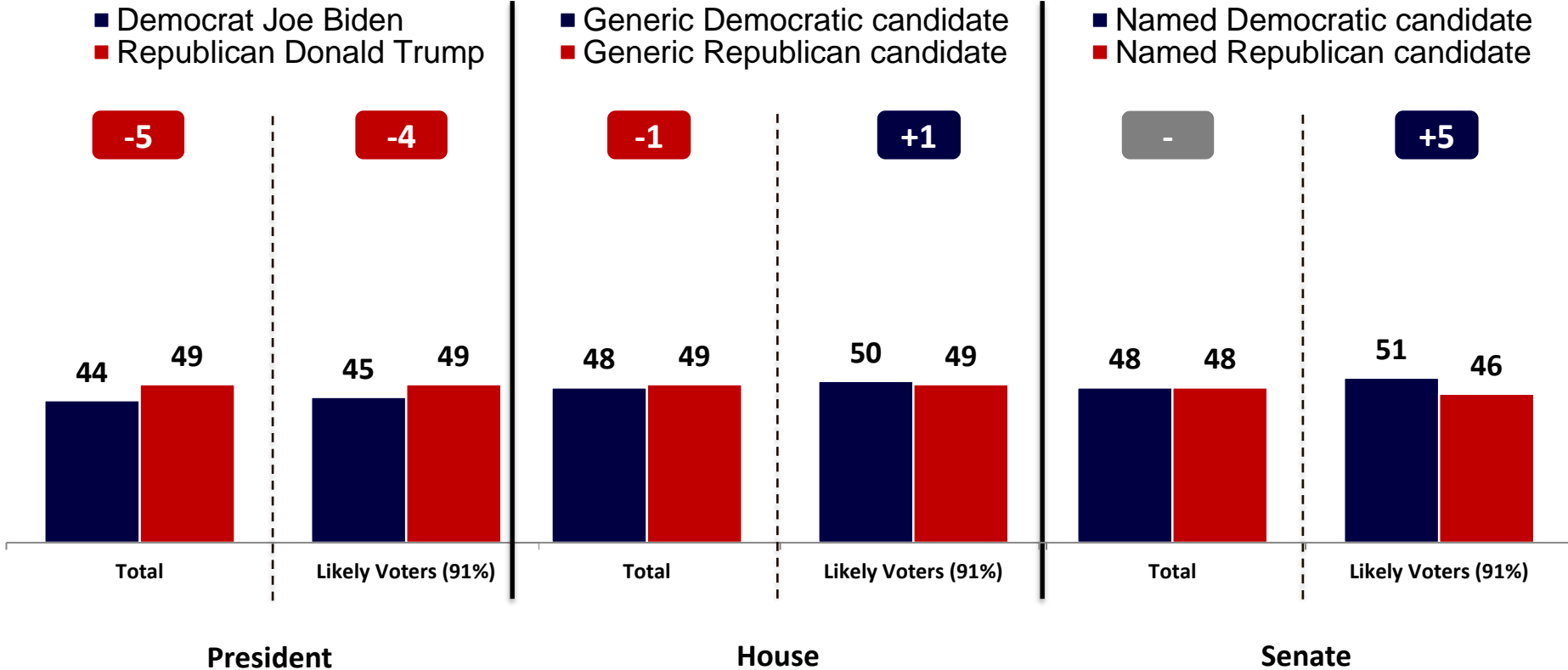
Key findings

- Trump winning, large pluralities believe, bring the country sinking into chaos, violence, emboldened white nationalists, an unchecked autocrat and democracy lost, as well as the right to a legal abortion.
- This is a climate ripe for “dual haters” who are a quarter of the electorate. One in ten say they won’t vote for either Trump or Biden. Both means a historic 3rd party vote, which usually raises turnout and uncertainty.
- President Biden and the Democrats, this polls shows, can make major gains in this daunting election year. They need to talk only about the rising prices and the help Democrats are providing (reduced drug costs and the monthly Child Tax Credit). Then, they need to show who they are fighting for. The strongest narrative tested in the poll is Biden shifting economic power away from the big corporations to workers. The most popular policy is raising their taxes.
- This survey finishes with a powerful message that is received positively with a 12–point margin. It builds on what Biden and Democrats have. But most importantly, it creates a future choice as Democrats help with family costs, protecting Social Security, the right to an abortion and create American jobs. It attacks Republicans for blocking help, threatening Social Security, and siding with the biggest corporations.

Biden trails Trump in battleground states by 5 points, though Democrats reach parity in both the House and Senate battlegrounds

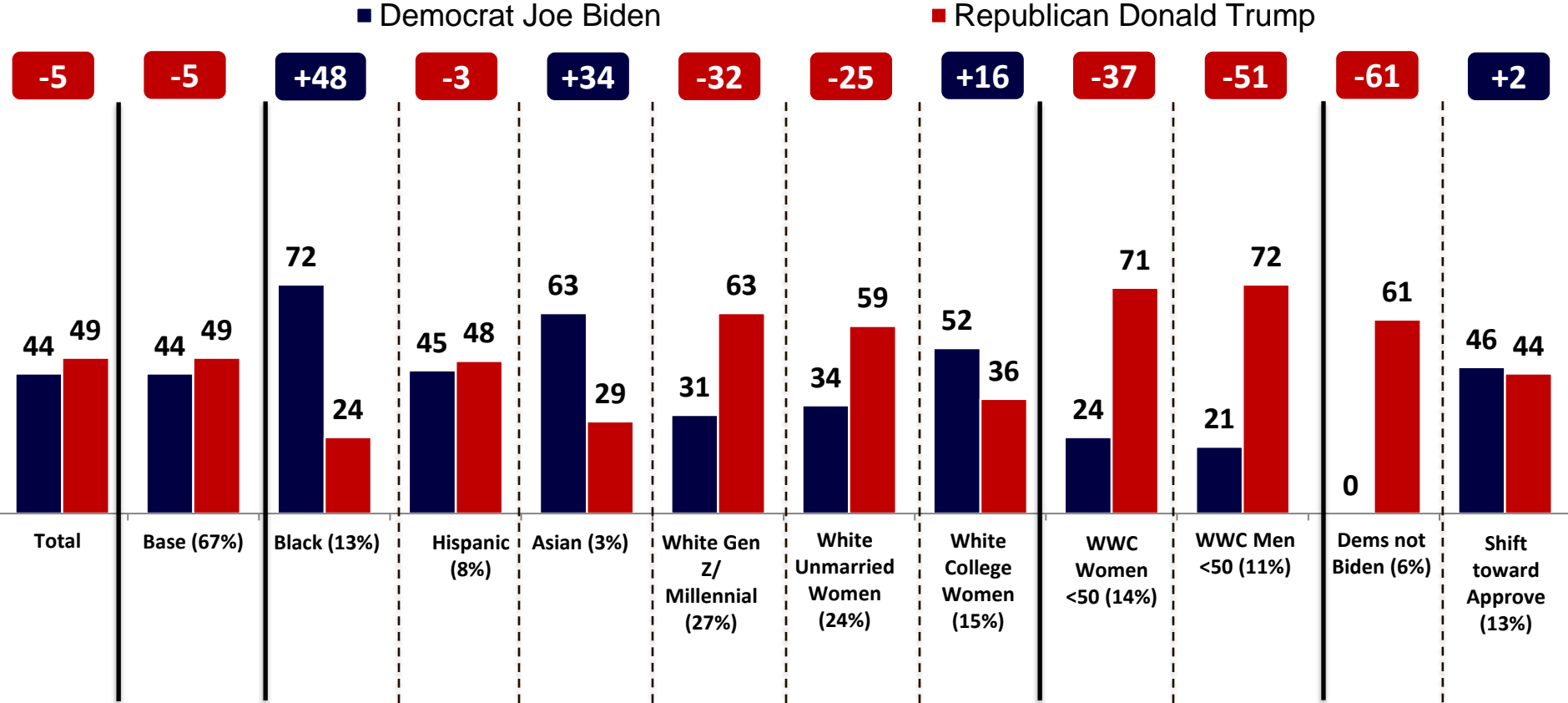
TWO-WAY VOTES (RELEVANT BATTLEGROUNDS)

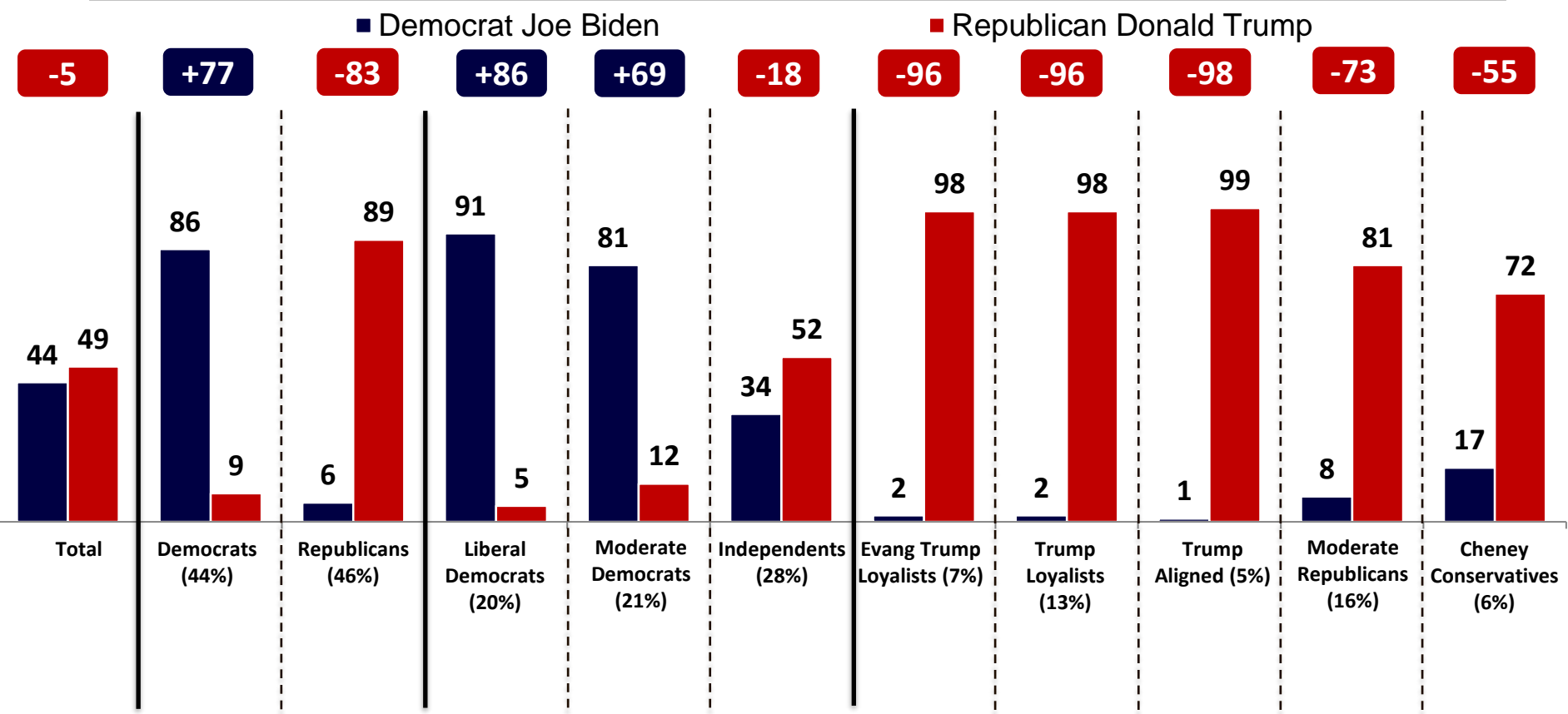
2024 TWO-WAY PRESIDENTIAL VOTE (PRES BATTLEGROUND)

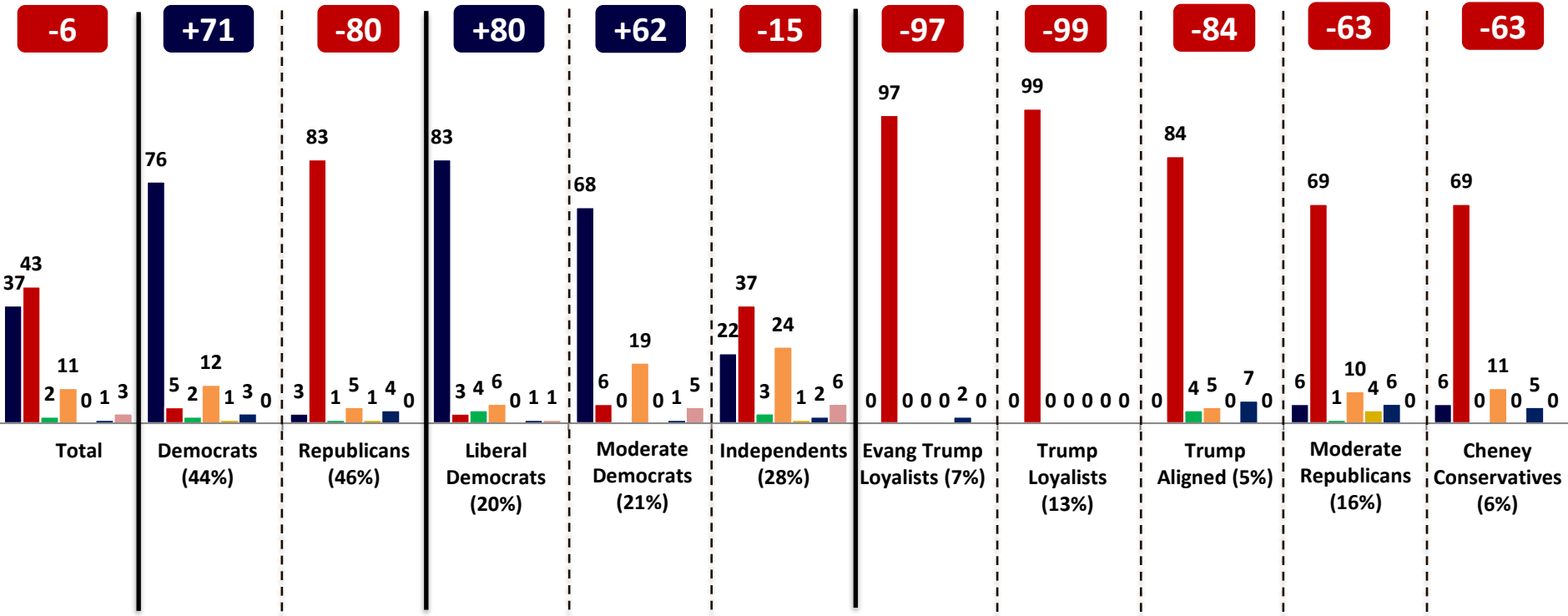

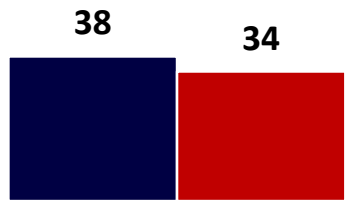

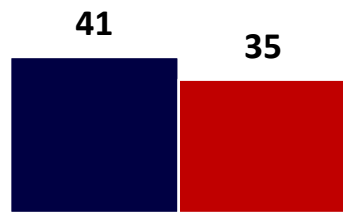
2024 TWO WAY PRESIDENTIAL VOTE (PRES BATTLEGROUND)

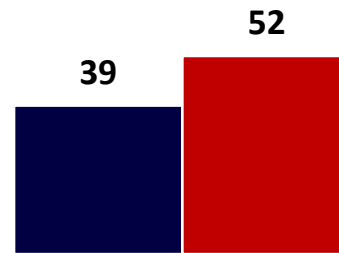

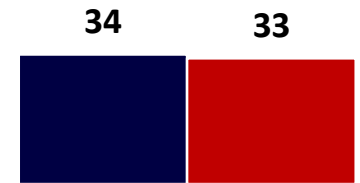

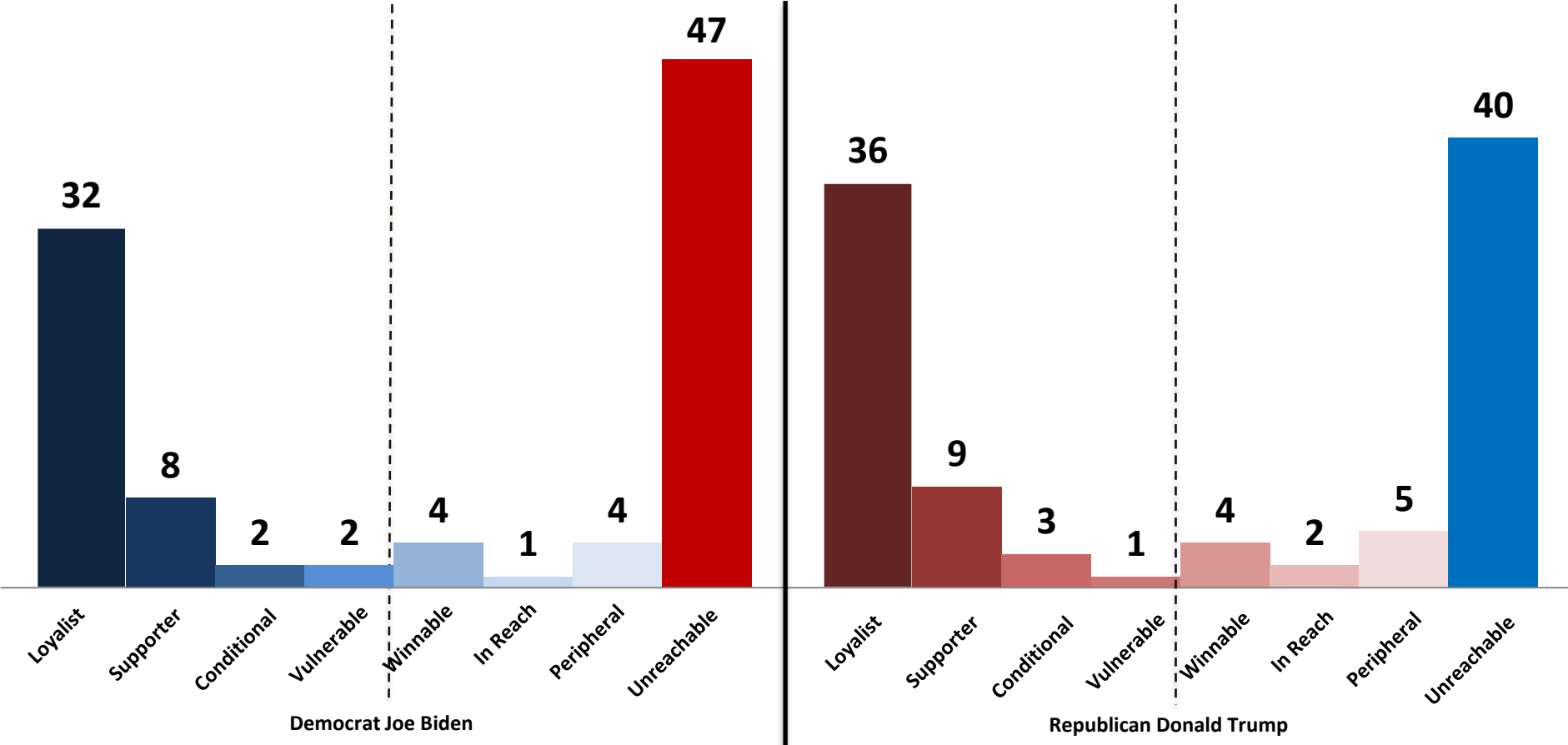

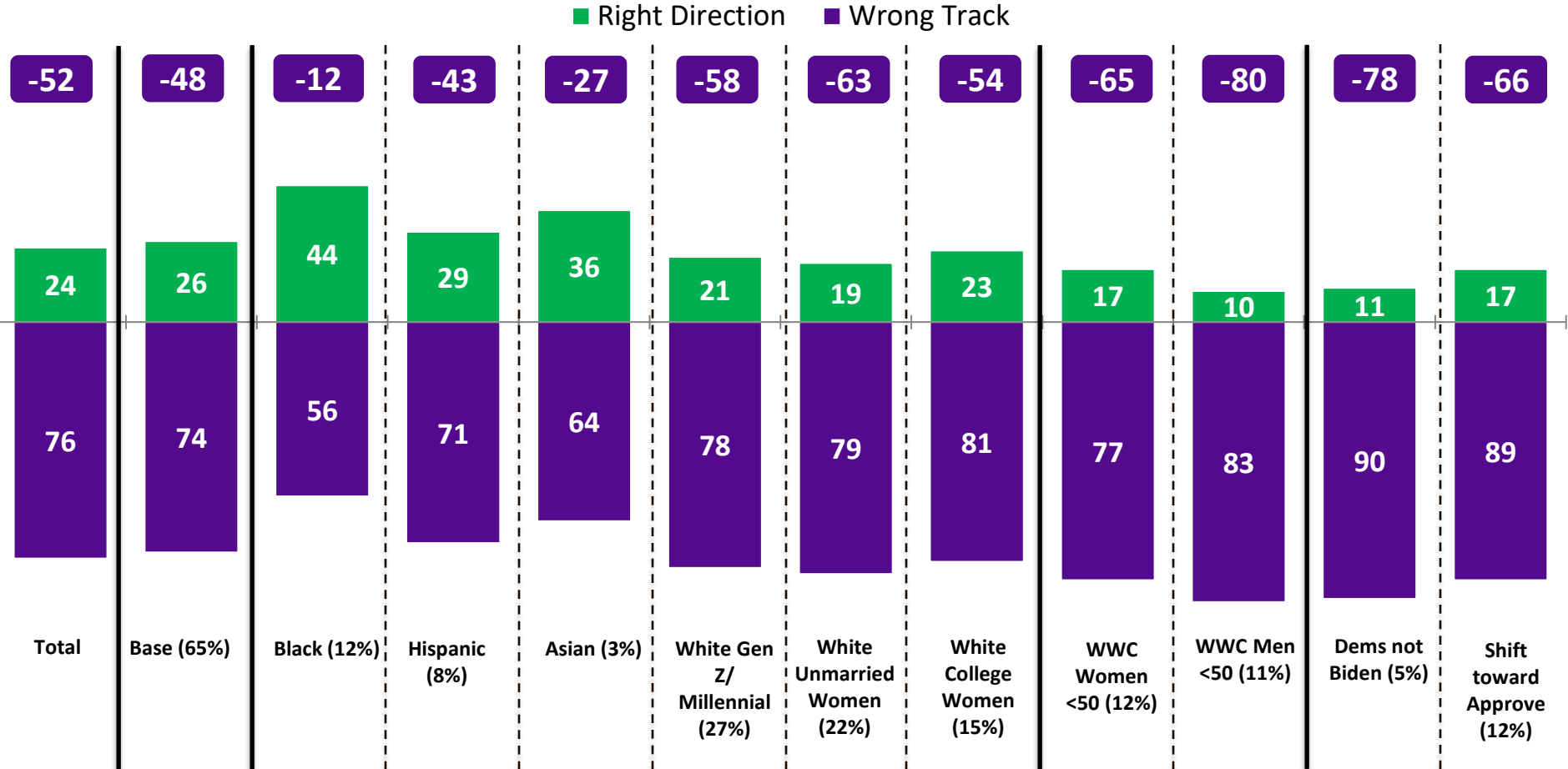

Generally speaking, do you think that things in this country are going in the right direction, or do you feel things have gotten pretty seriously off on the wrong track?

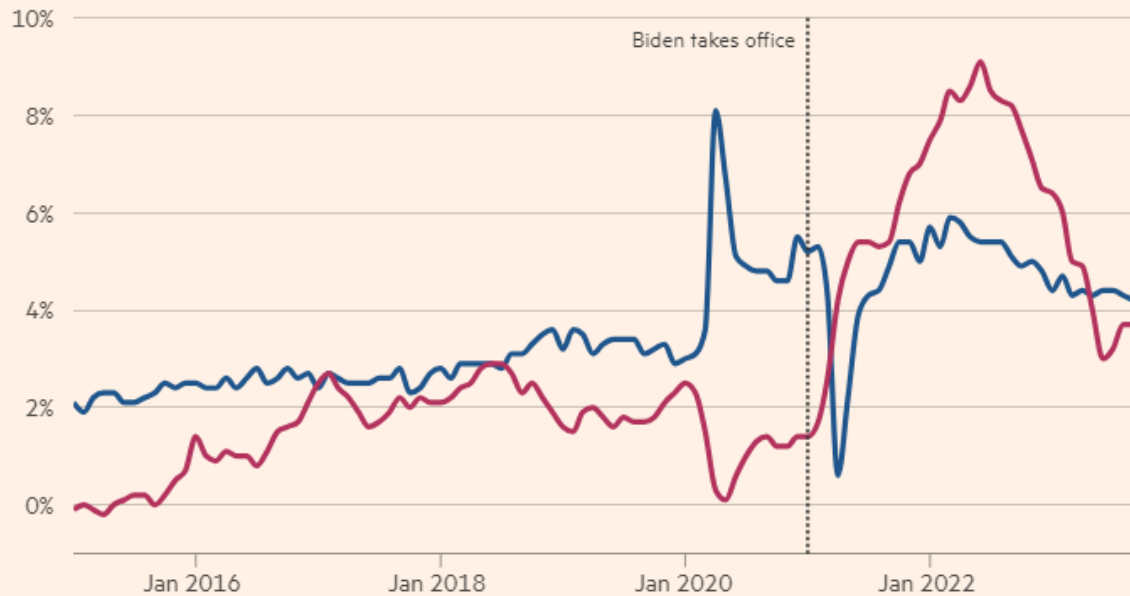


The difficult reality: Biden presides over an inflationary period when real wage decline, after Trump showed real wage gains

■ Wages ■ Inflation

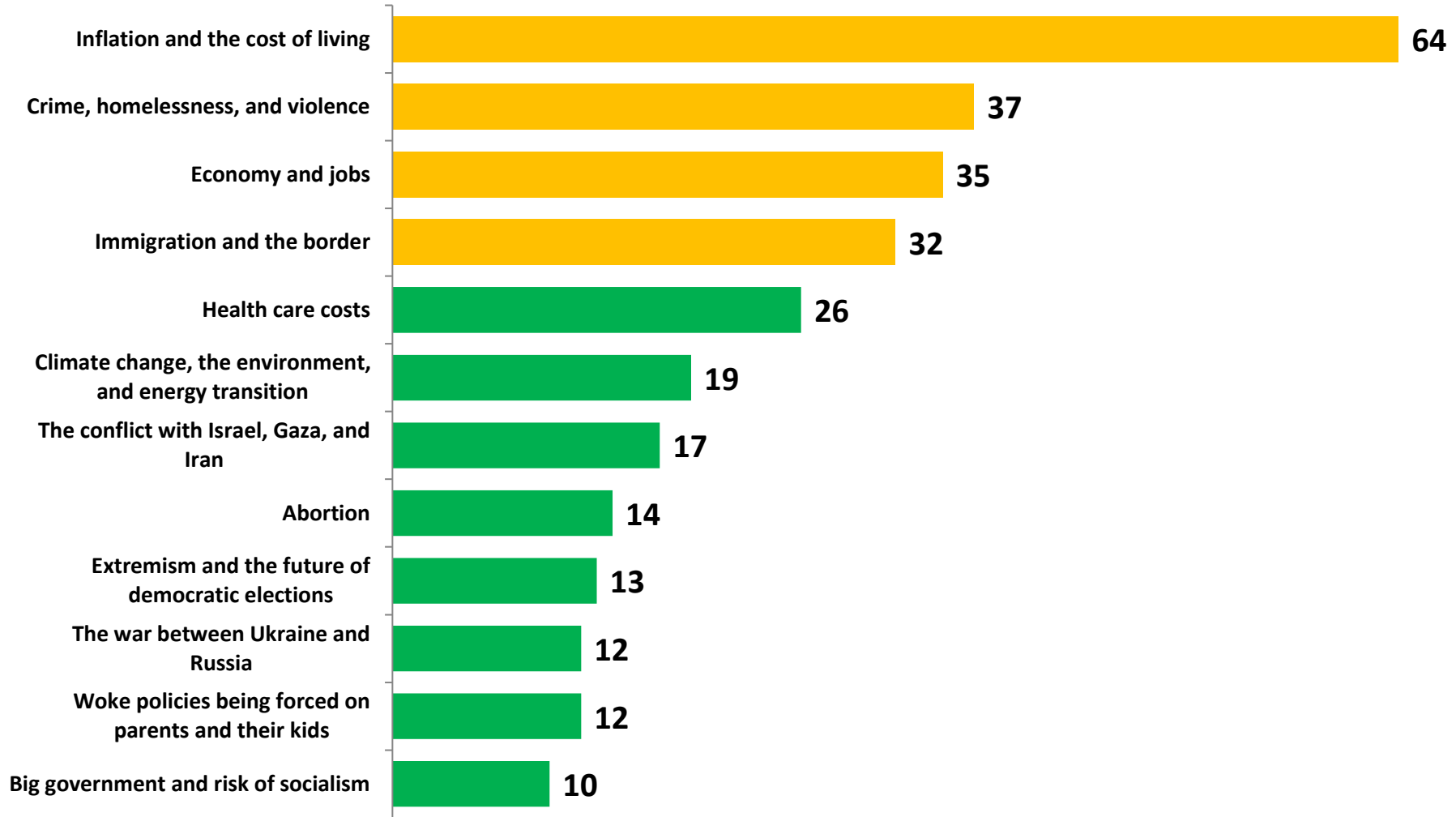

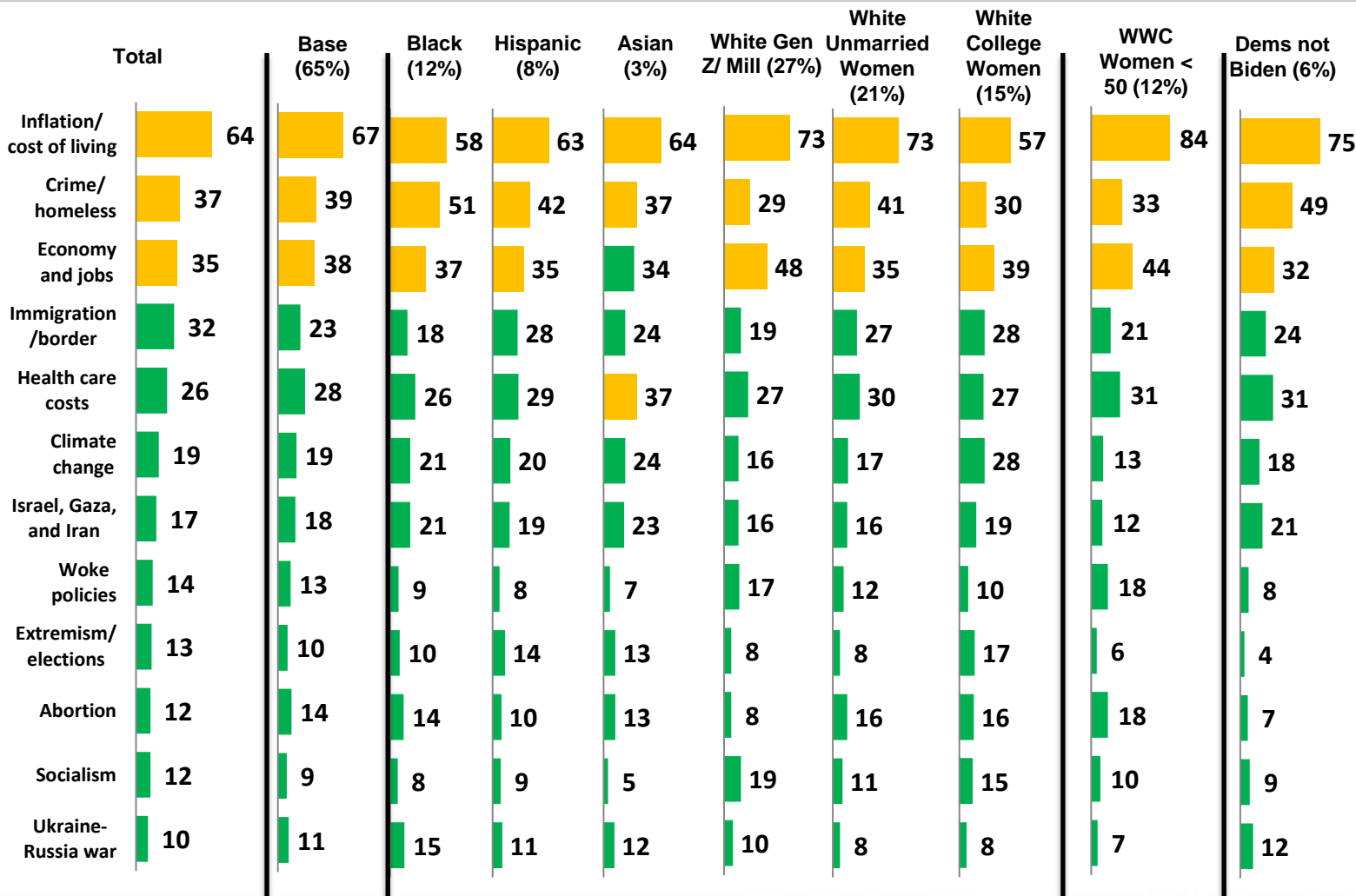

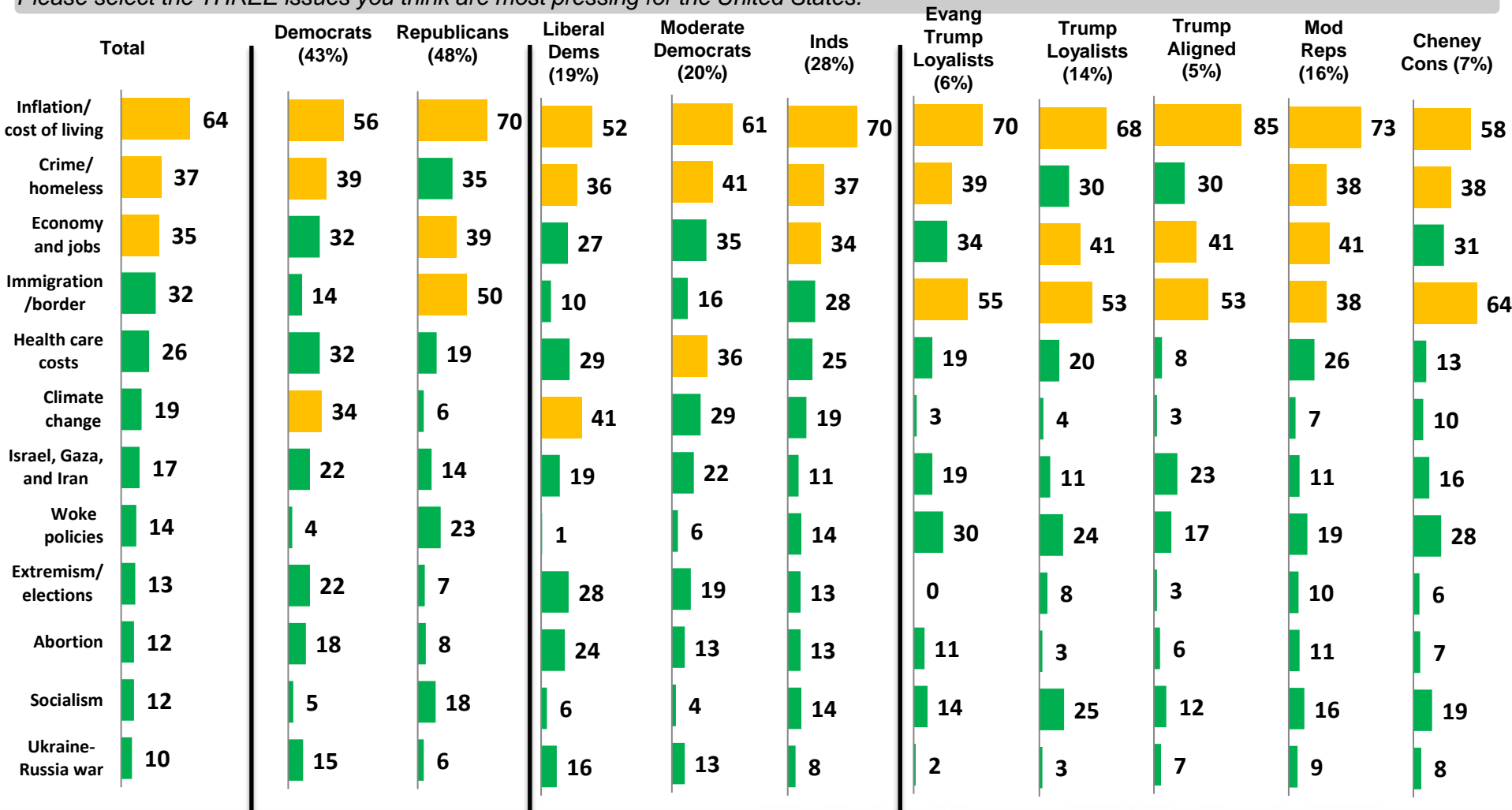

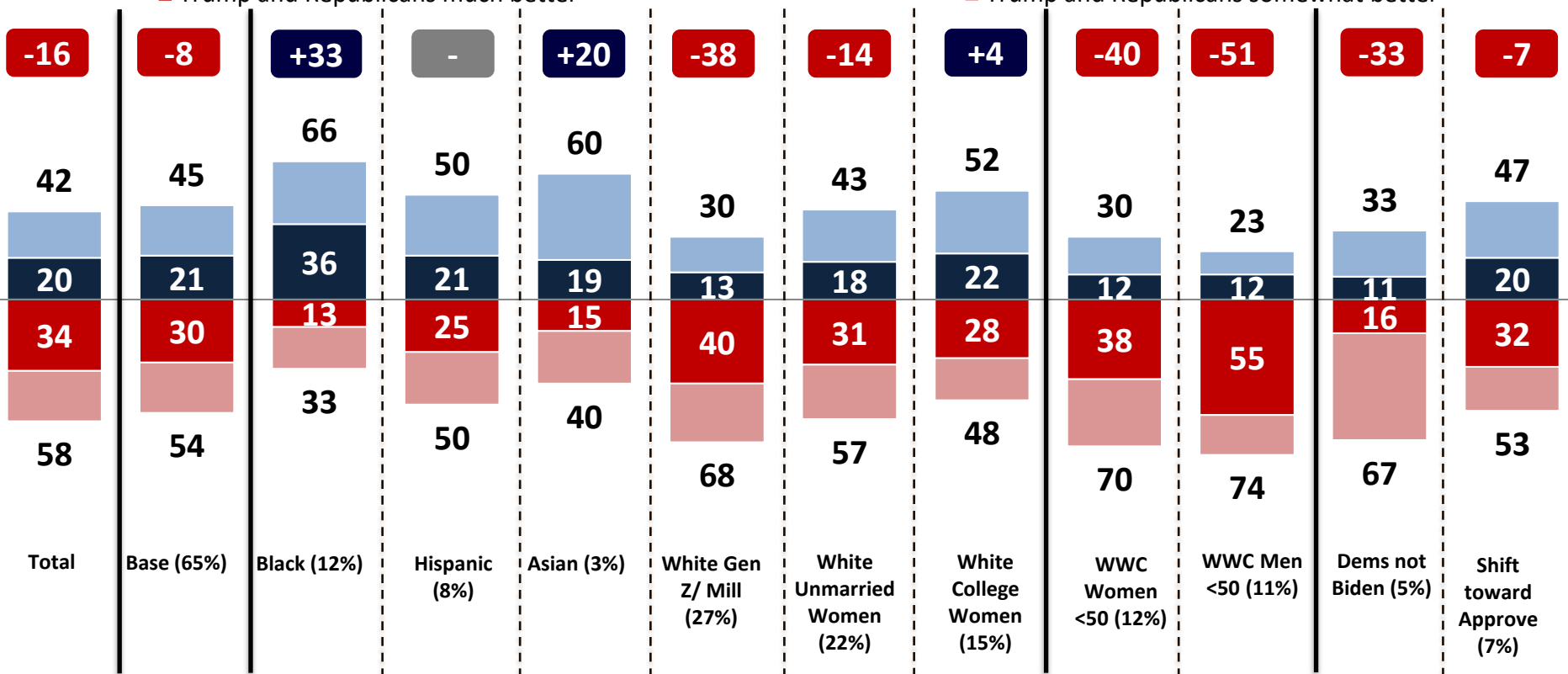

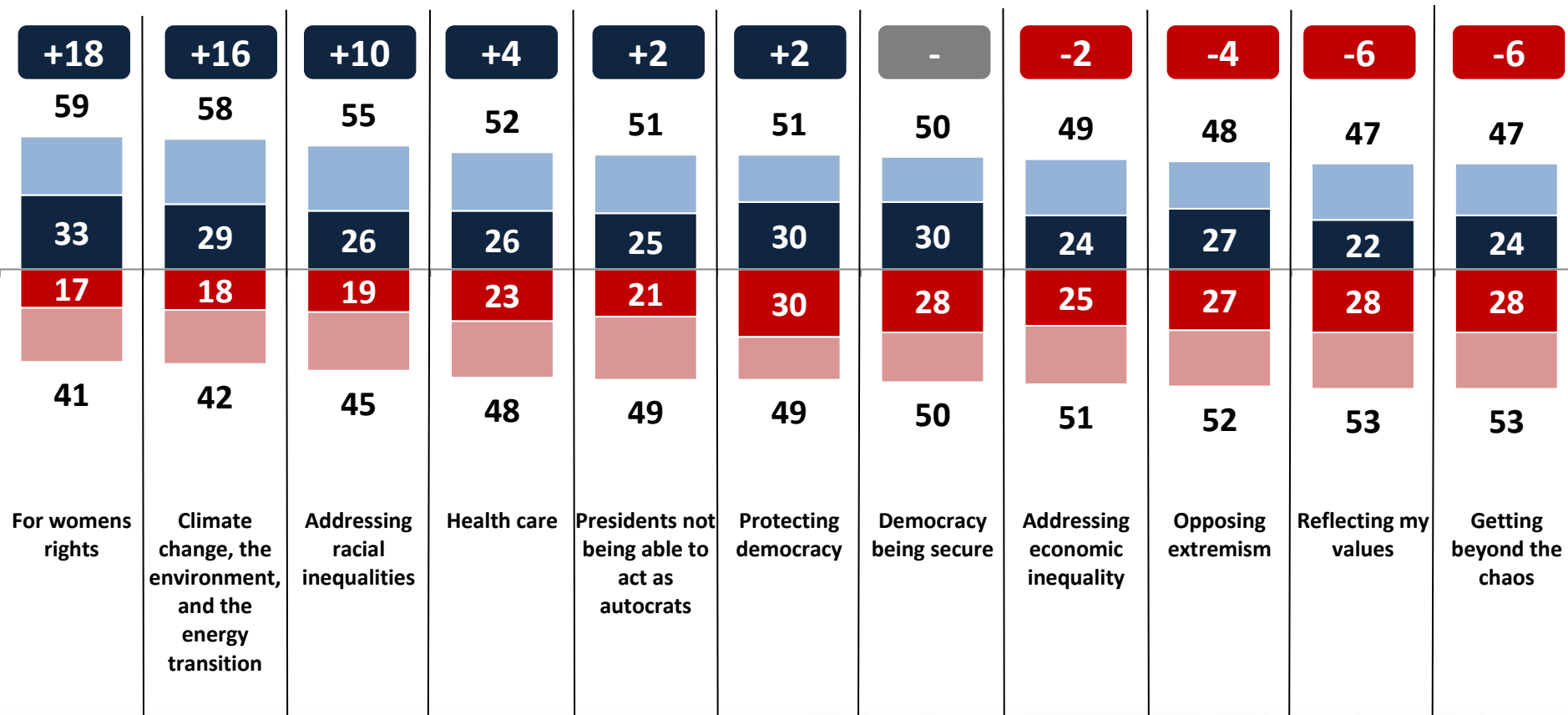

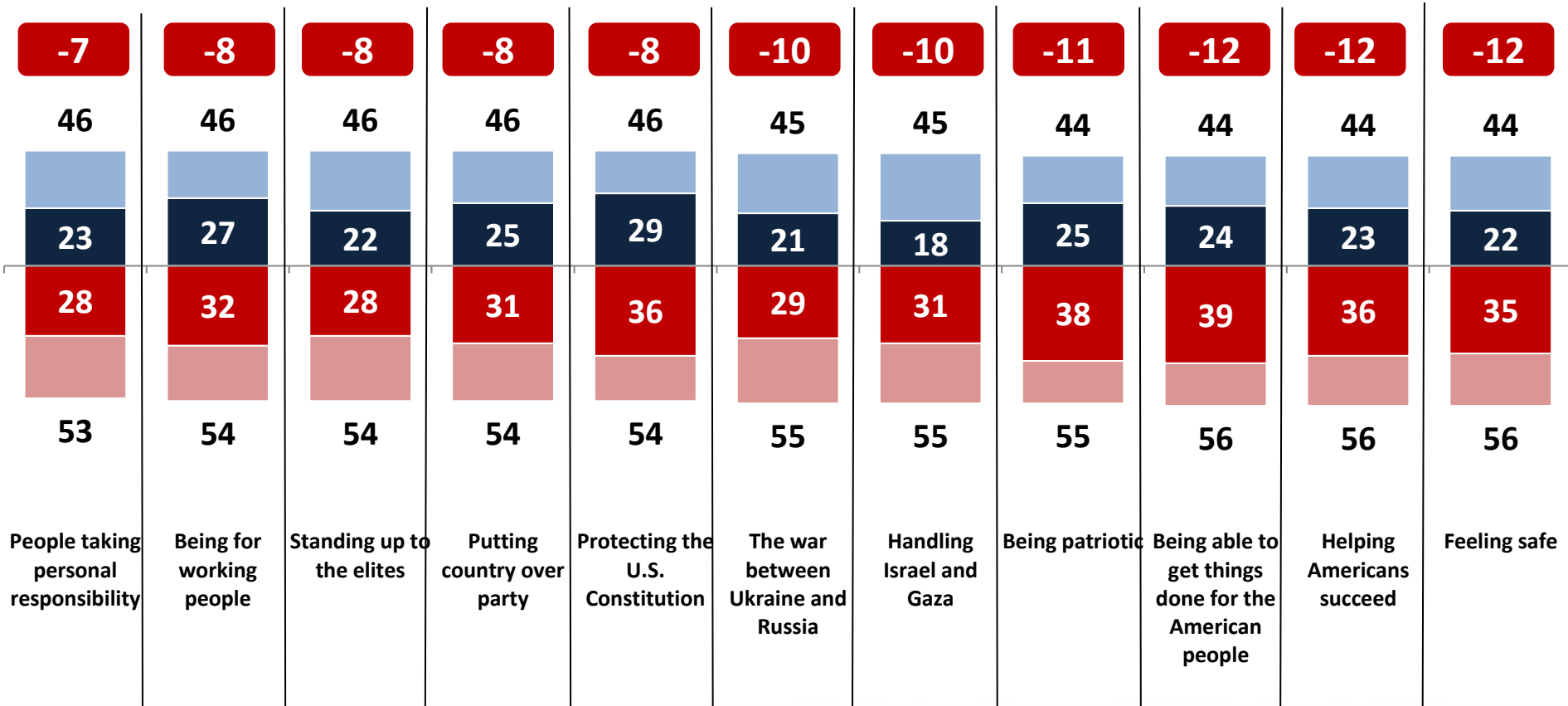

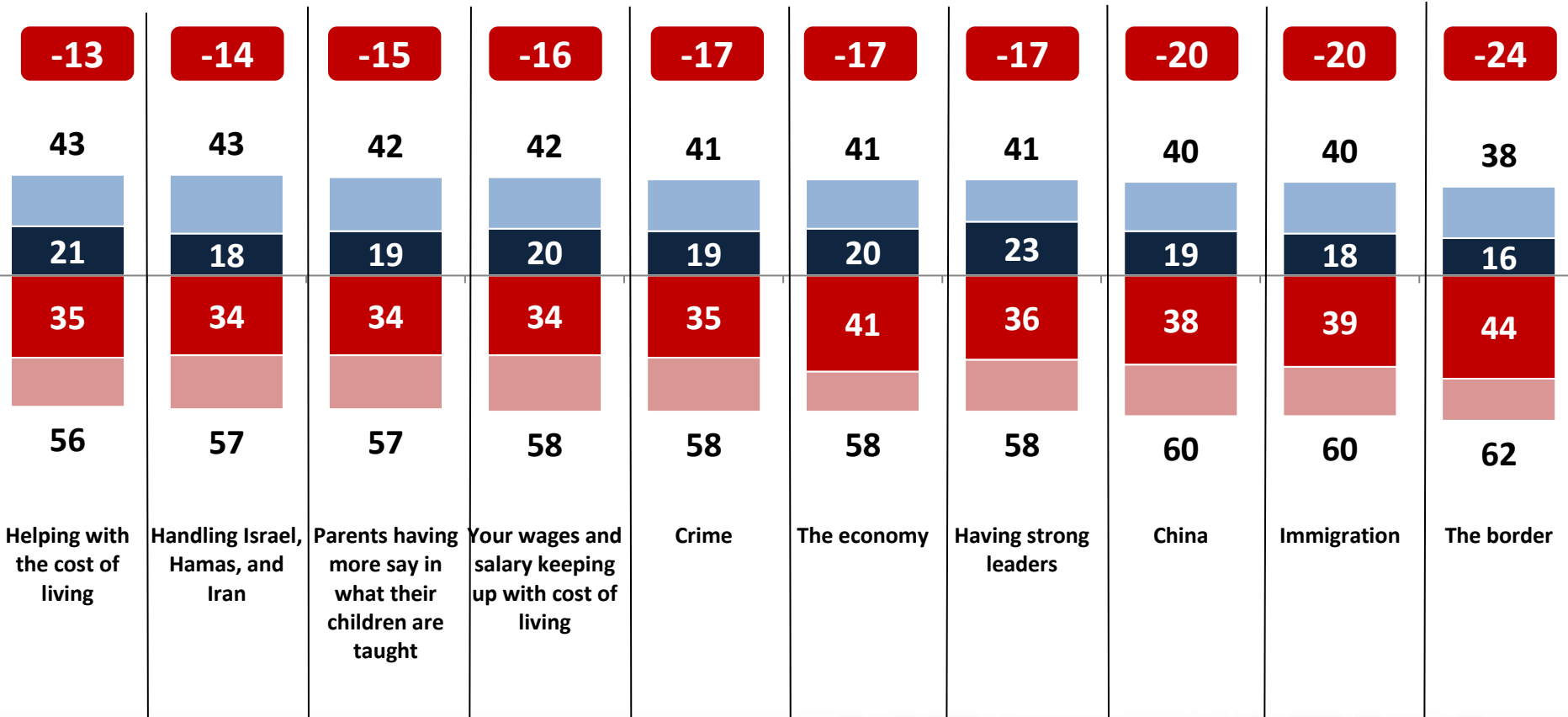

People Want Economic Help & More Power



Biden accomplishments – full text

(HEALTH) The new law passed by Democrats capped out-of-pocket drug costs at \$2000, reduced insulin to \$35 a month, and allows Medicare to negotiate lower prescription prices for the first time.

(CHILD TAX CREDIT) Increased the Child Tax Credit received monthly that provided tax relief for poor, working, and middle-class families with children. It was the biggest tax cut for working families ever and it cut Black child poverty in half.

(INFRASTRUCTURE) With bi-partisan support, is investing \$1.2 trillion in infrastructure to repair highways and bridges, modernize airports, improve rail safety and add passenger rail service, strengthen supply chains, reduce carbon pollution.

(JOBS) Rebuilding our economy from the middle out and the bottom up, the economy has added more than 13.9 million jobs, inflation has fallen for 12 straight months, down 60 percent from last summer, and unemployment is down to 3.8 percent.

(ABORTION) The Biden administration opposes Republican attempts to ban abortion and has taken executive actions to protect abortion access and improve contraception availability. He supports patients seeking out-of-state care.

(BORDER SECURITY) The Biden administration requests \$14 billion in funding for border security, fentanyl control, and asylum processing. The requested funds cover an additional 1,300 border patrol agents, inspection machines for fentanyl detection, 1,600 asylum officers, 375 new immigration judge teams, and support for recent releases, among other critical measures.

(MADE IN AMERICA) Biden is bringing manufacturing back to the U.S., with a \$13 billion investment in electric vehicles and \$24 billion in batteries. This creates jobs by building in America and by forcing federal government agencies to buy in America.

(BIG CORP) Passed law providing more funds to the IRS to crack down on tax evasion by the wealthy and big corporations, put in a 15 percent minimum tax so they pay taxes, and a 1 percent fee on stock buybacks used by big oil companies making super profits.

(UKRAINE / ISRAEL) Biden led a united NATO focused on the war in Ukraine, standing up to Russia and protecting democracy. He enacted multiple bi-partisan support packages to Ukraine that increased our national security. He did the same in Israel when Hamas terrorists hit Israel with support of Iran.

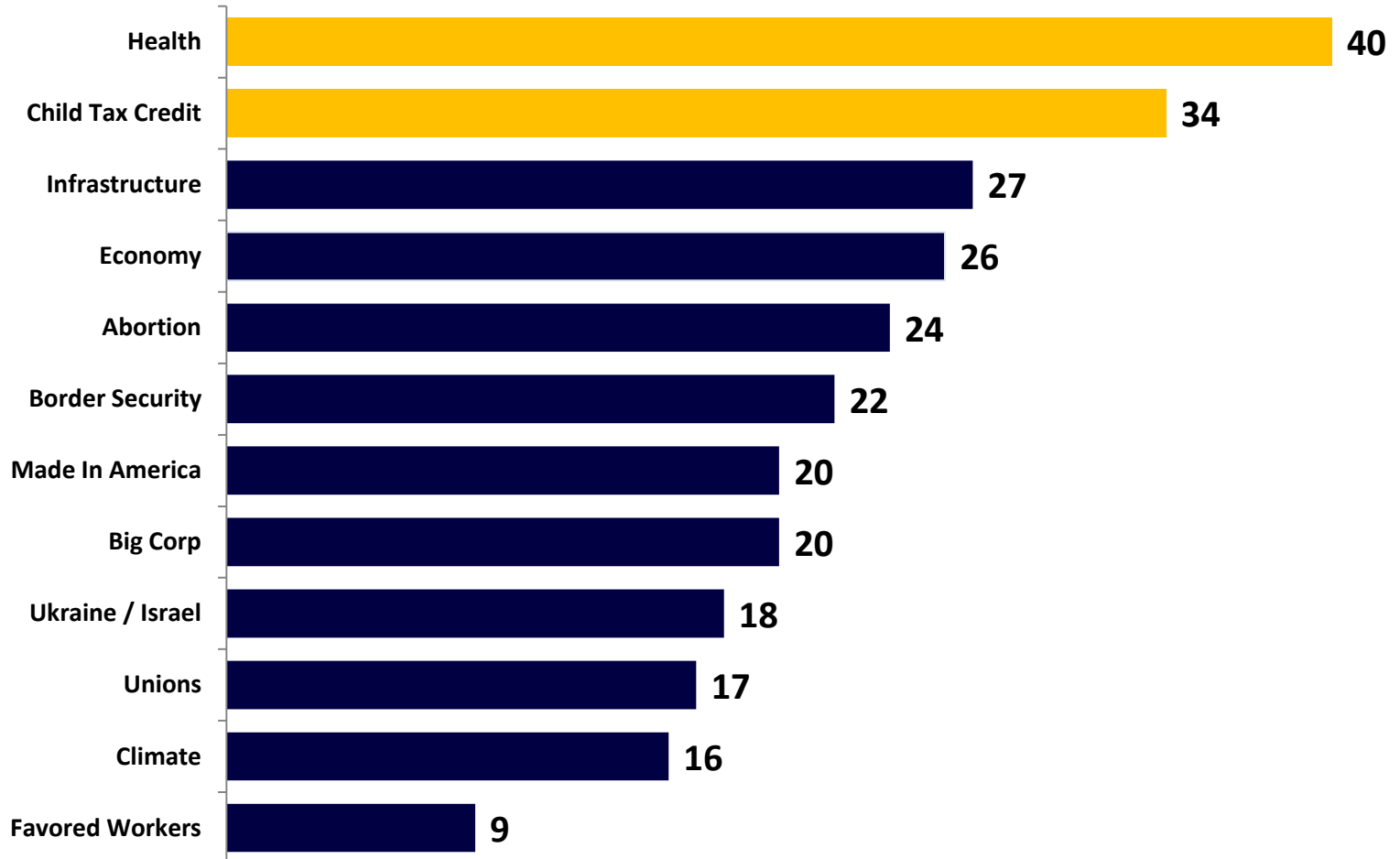
(UNIONS) Showing his support for unions, Biden joined on the picket line. He has increased real wages by 3.5 percent, with the lowest-paid workers benefiting most. New rules propose extending overtime protections to over 3.6 million workers, and penalizing companies with unfair labor practices, like Starbucks and Amazon.

(CLIMATE) Made historic investment in new laws to reduce what you spend on your energy bills and reduce carbon pollution. It gives big rebates to help families buy energy efficient appliances, and major tax cuts to buy new electric cars and install solar panels. It saves the average family \$1800 on energy costs.

(FAVORED WORKERS) His appointments to federal agencies and commissions have shifted the balance away from the biggest corporations to workers. They have filed anti-trust actions against Amazon and a monopolization suit against Google.

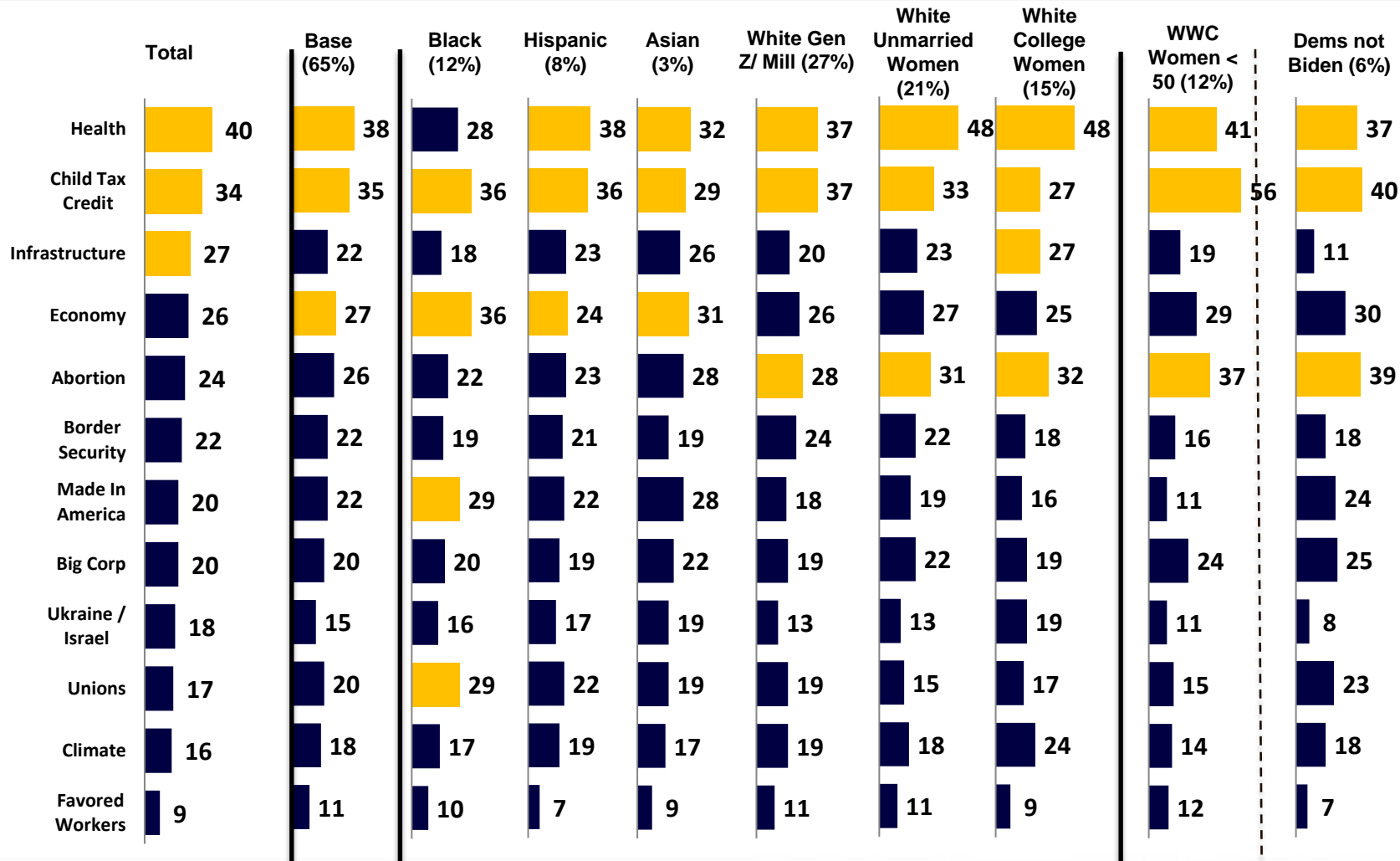

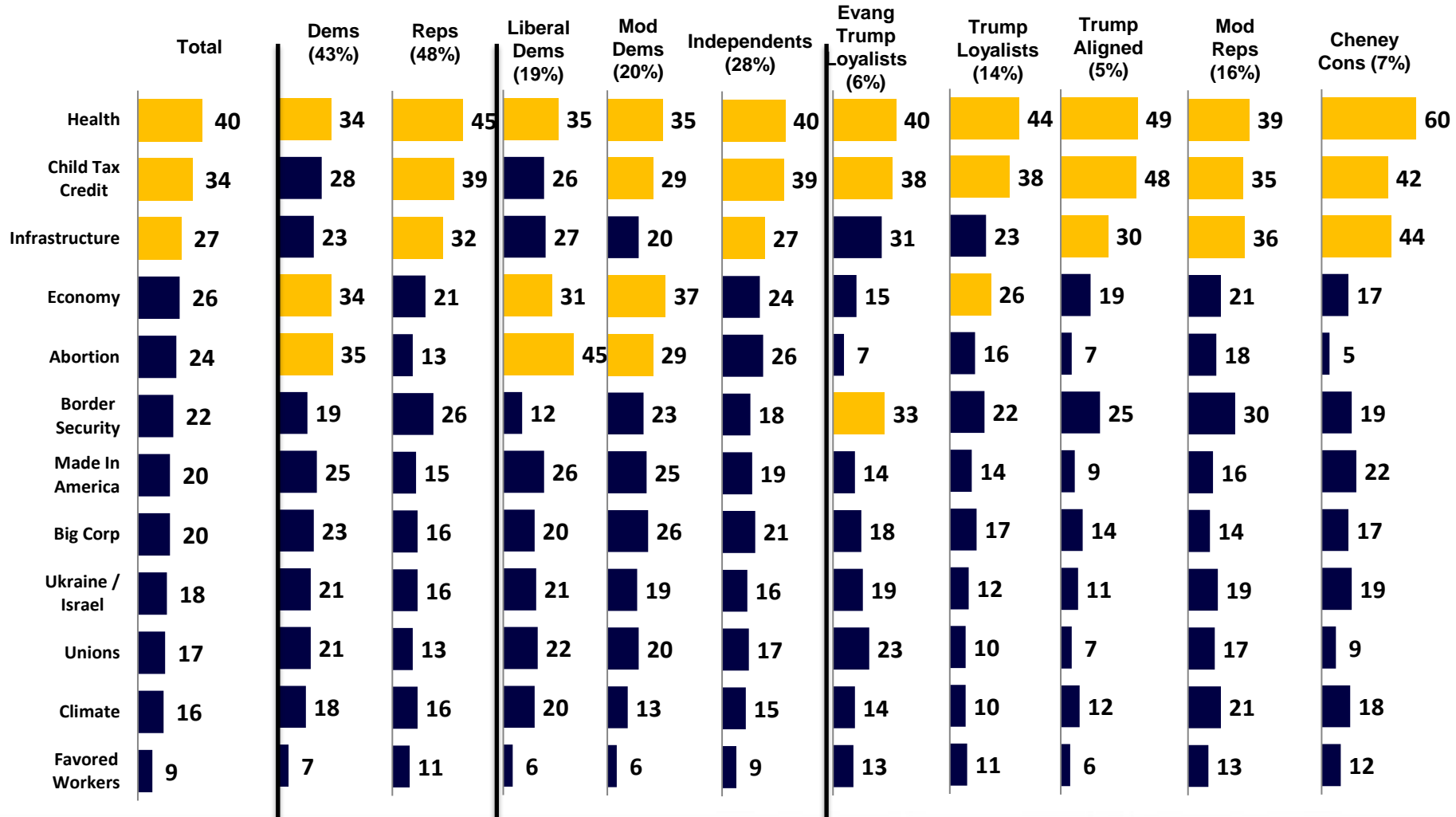

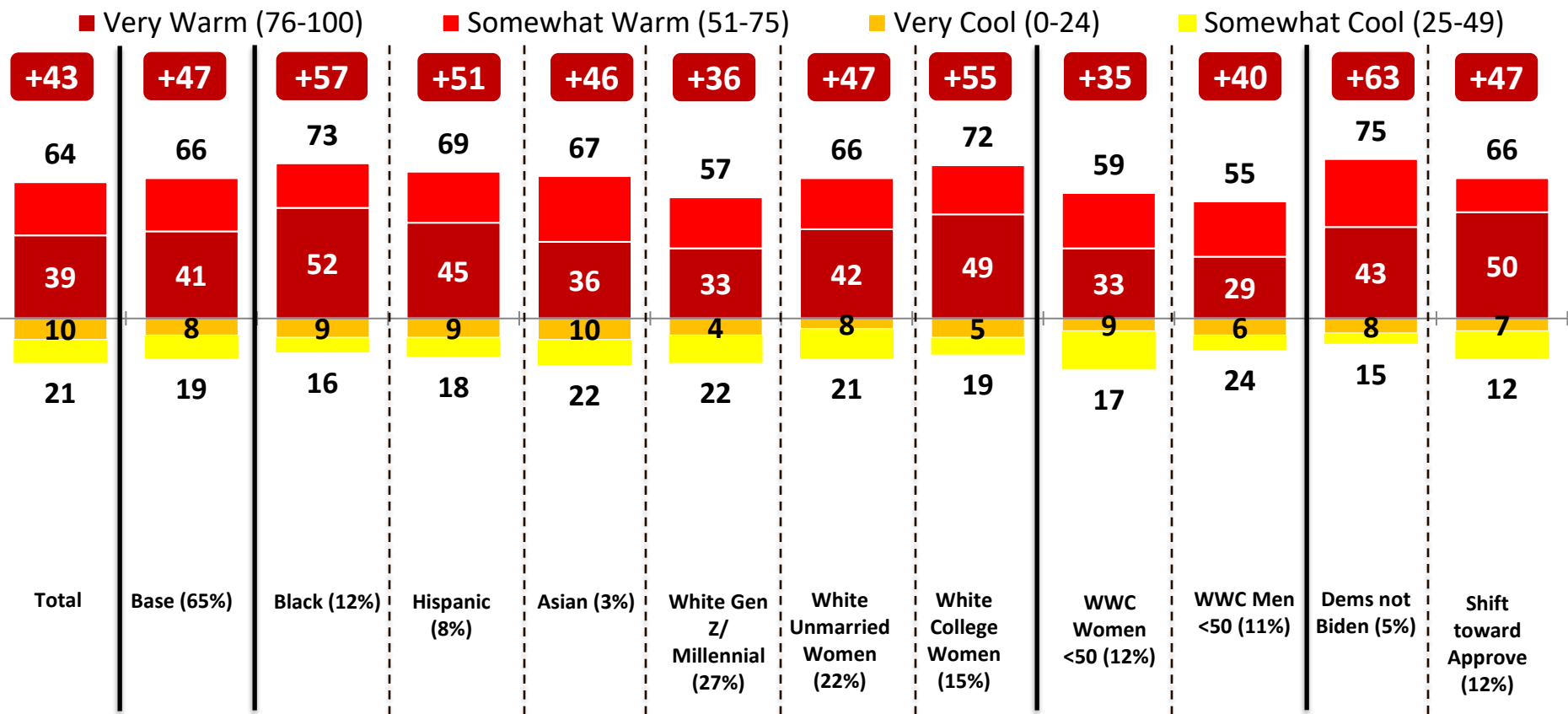

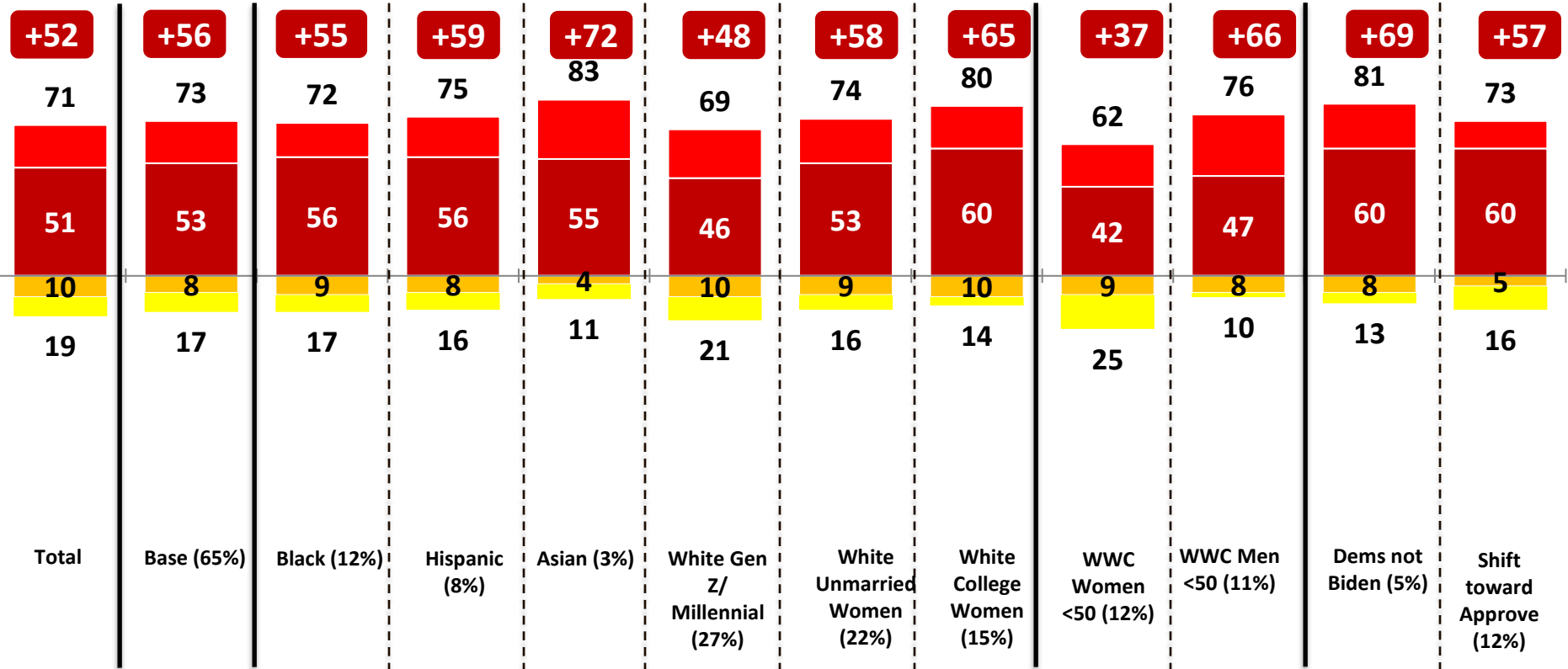

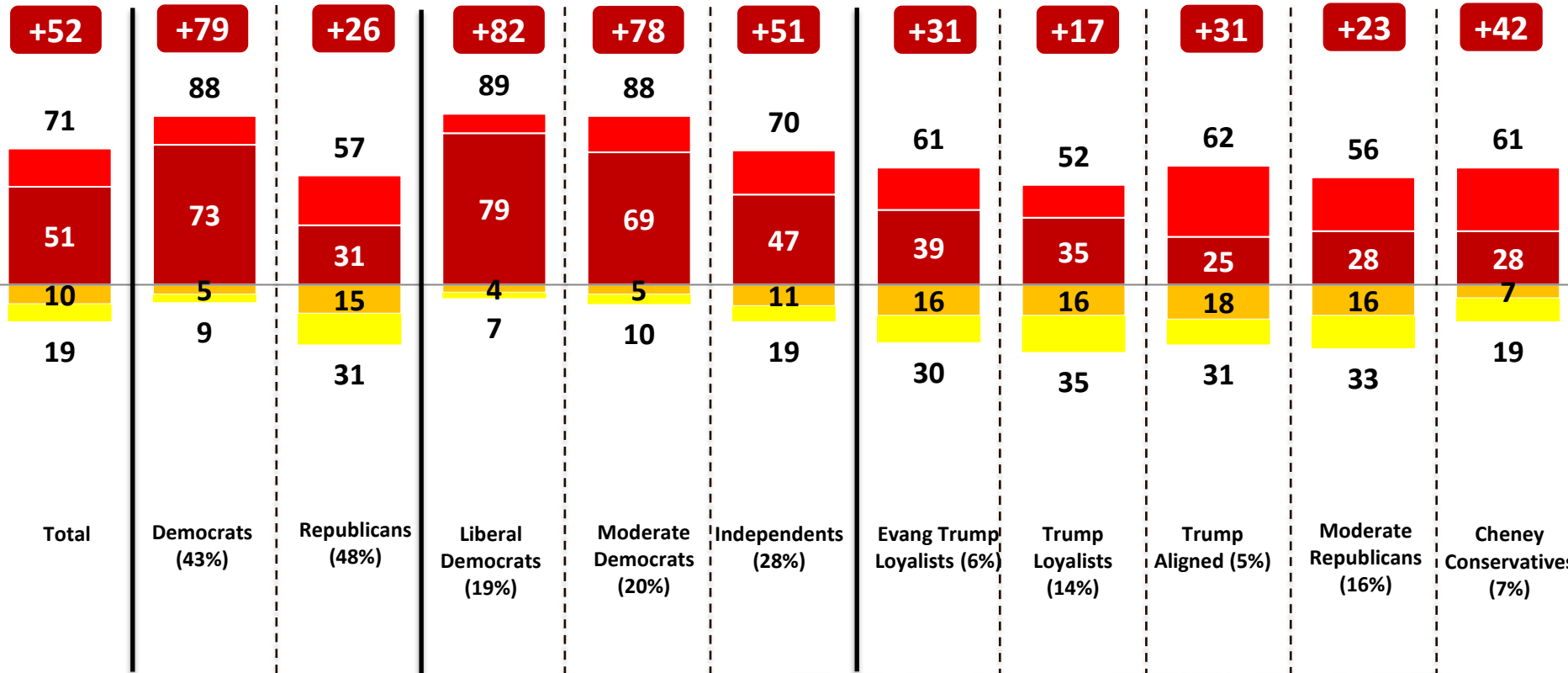

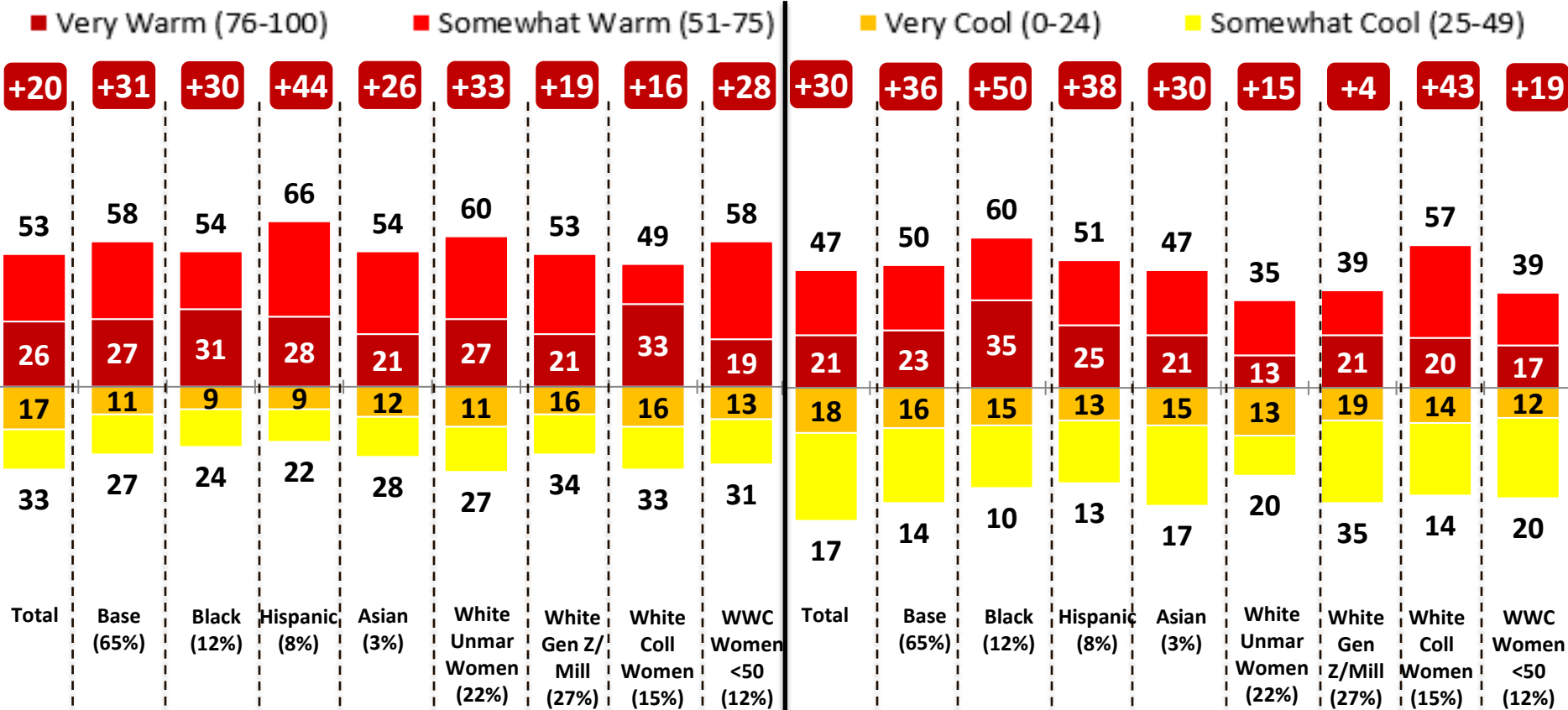

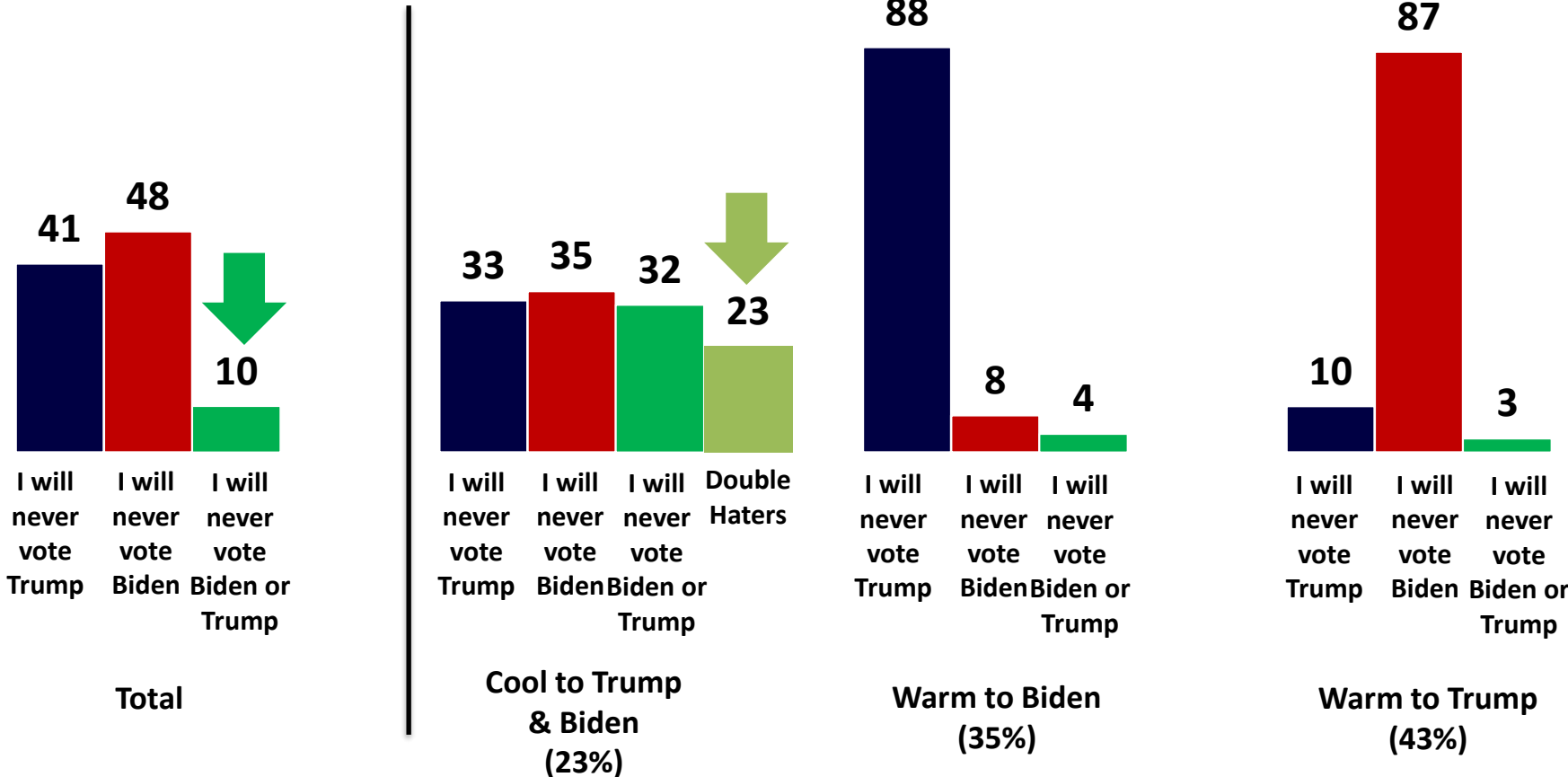

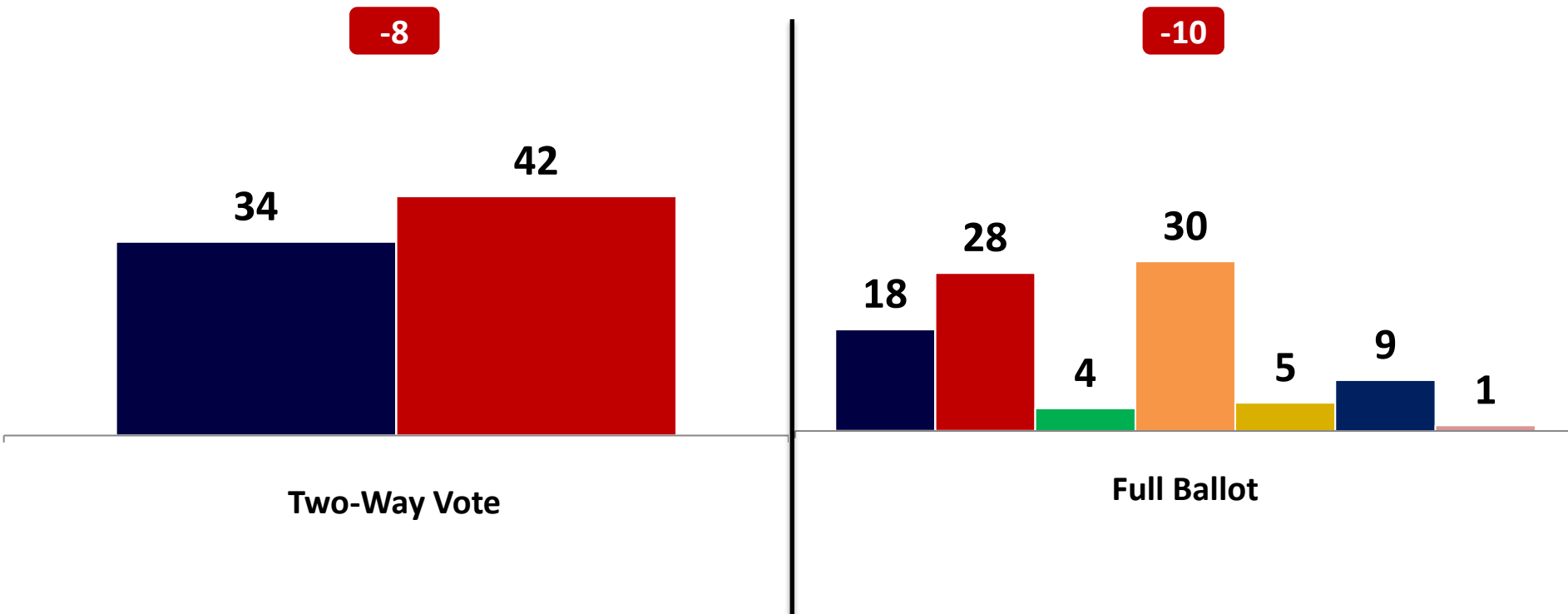
Which of the following best represents where you stand?

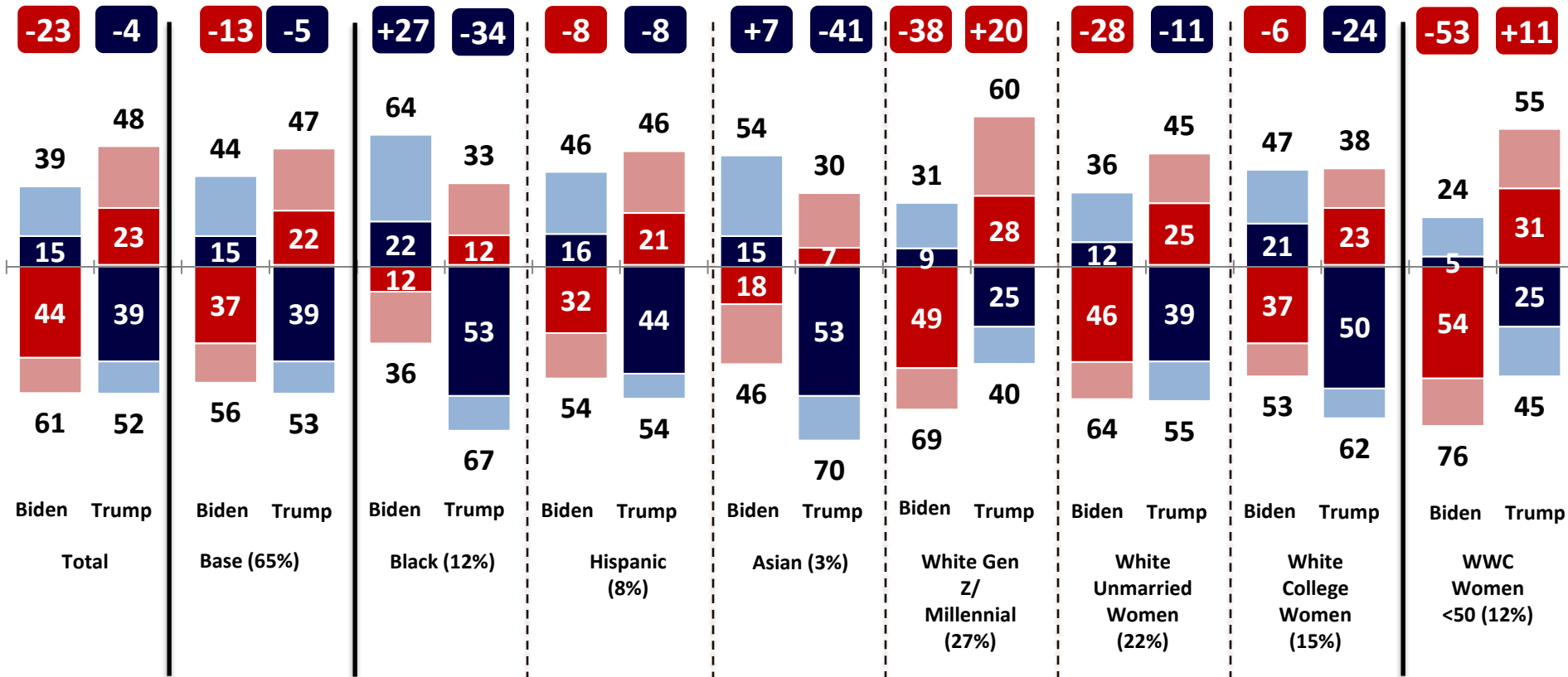

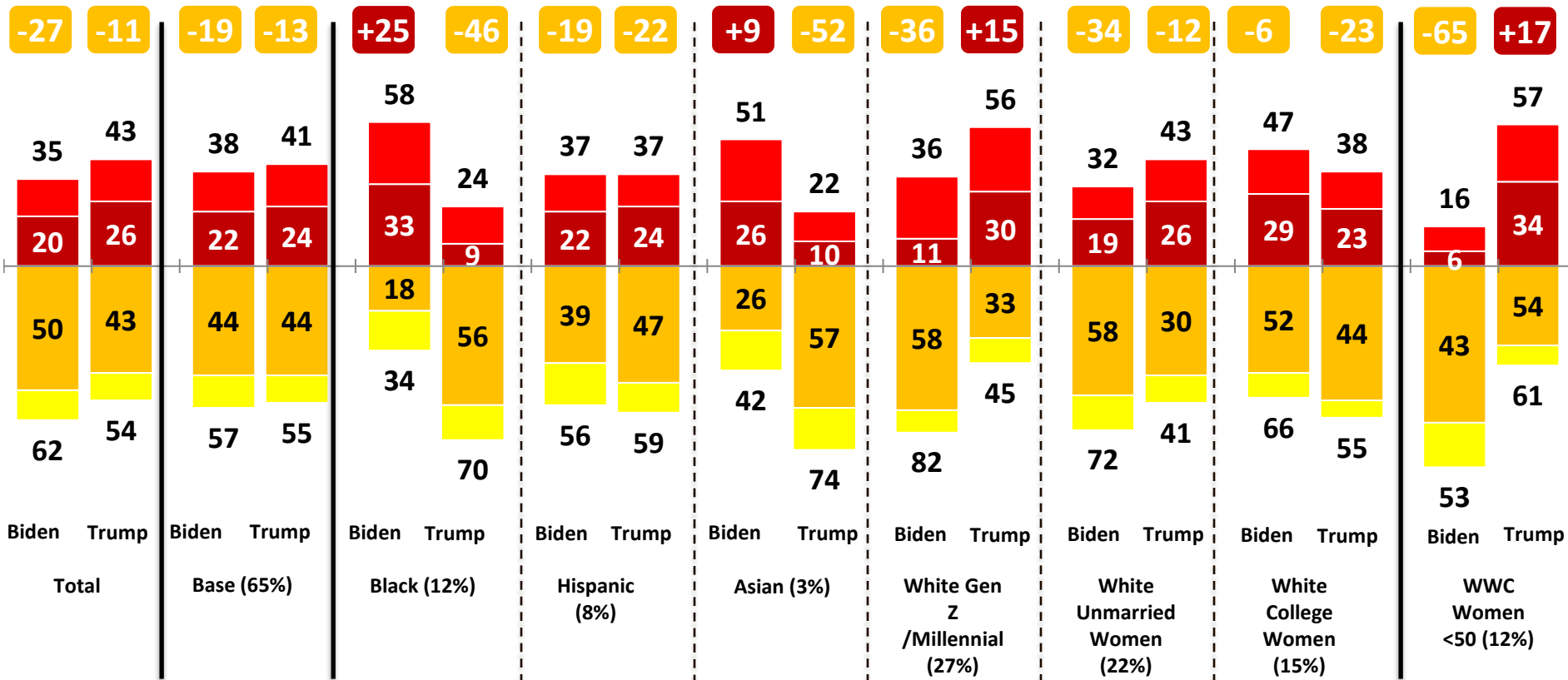

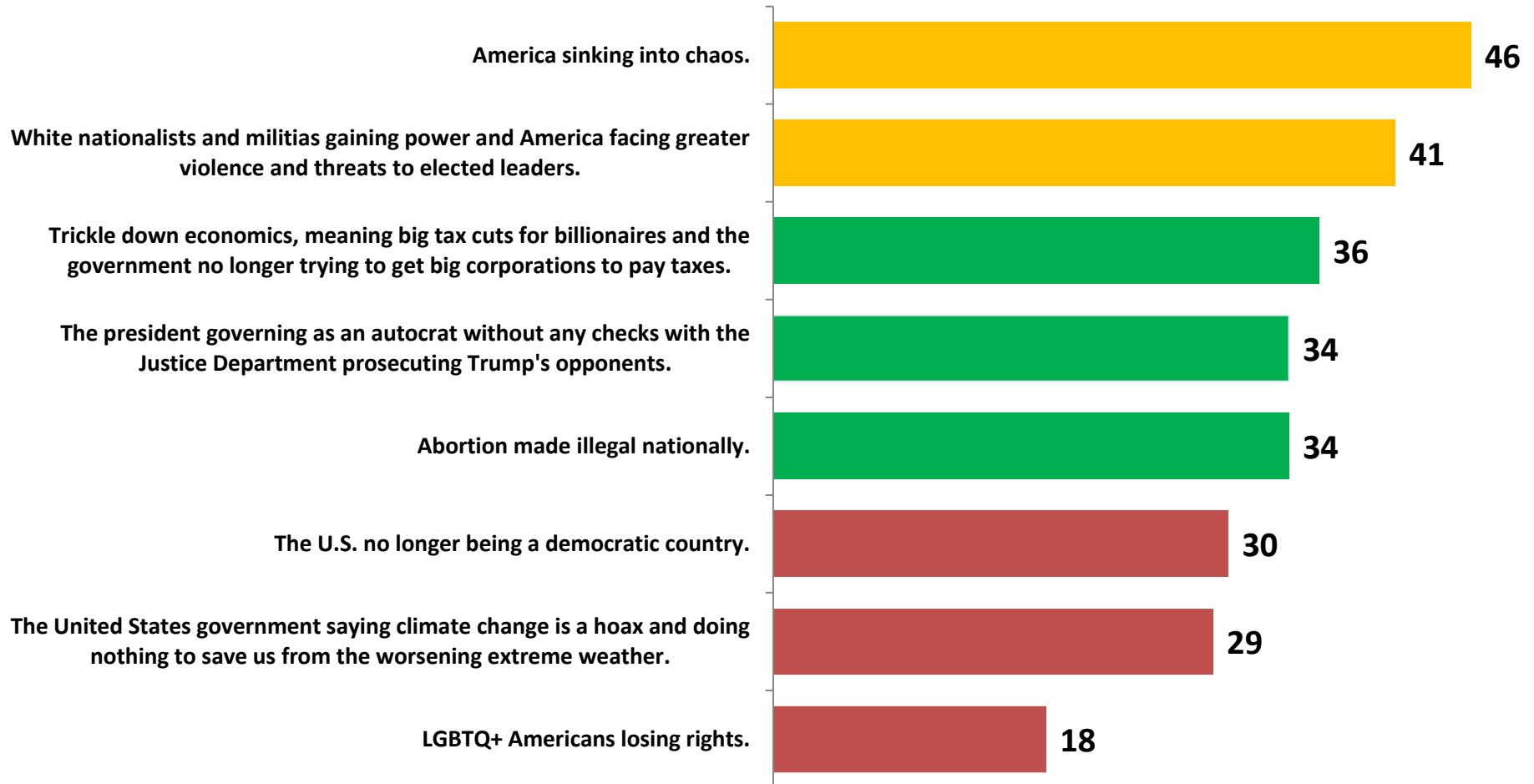

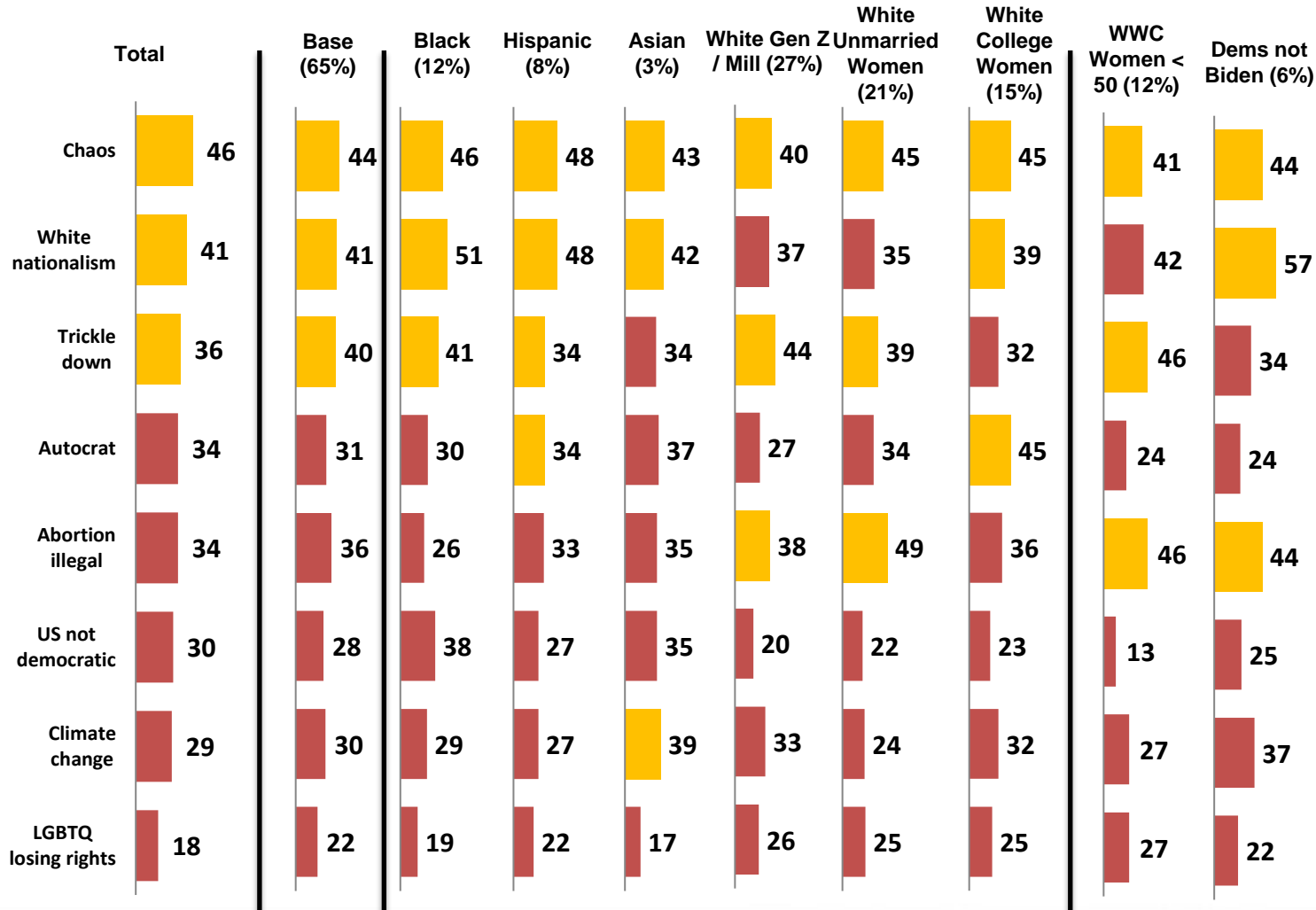

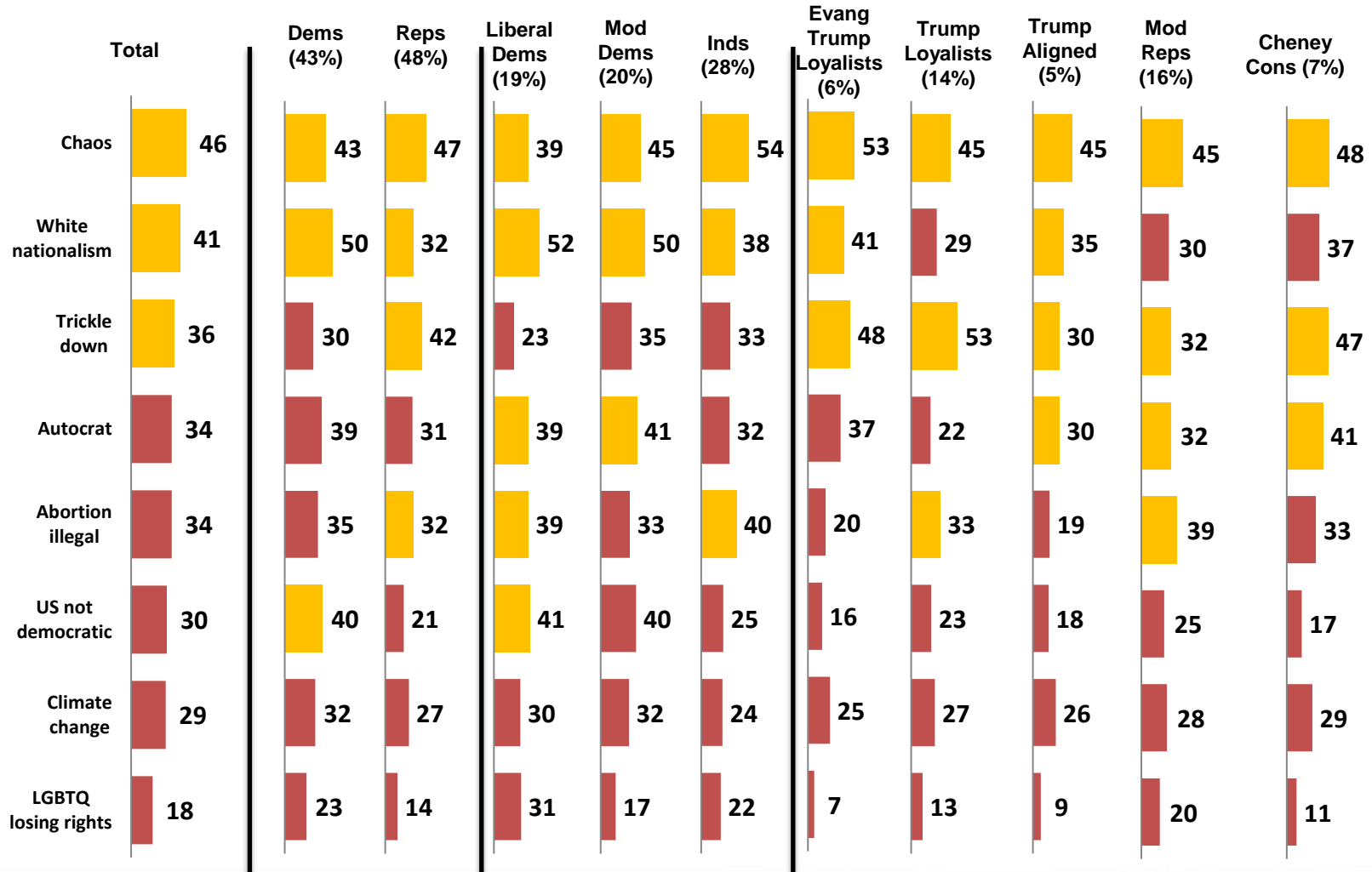

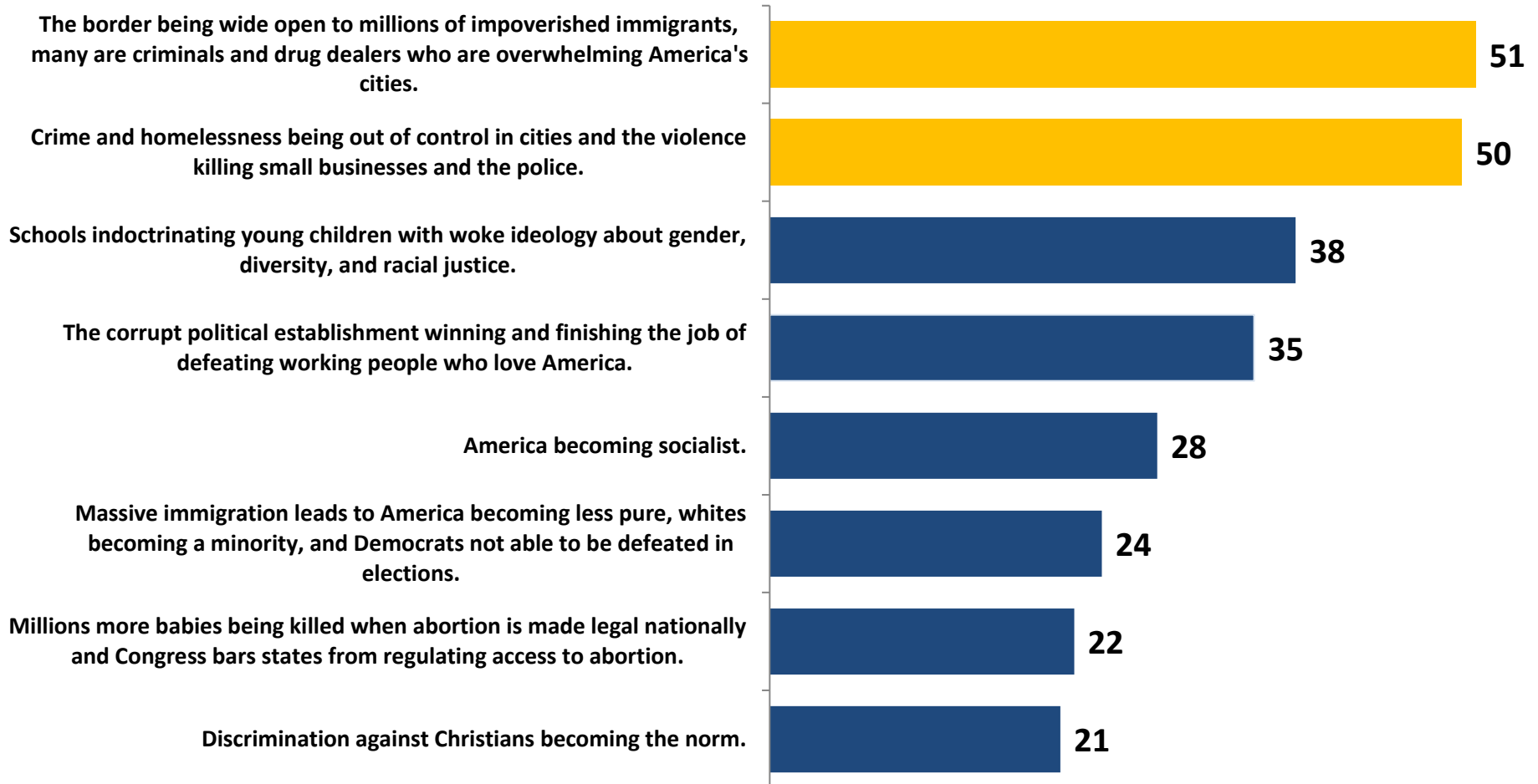

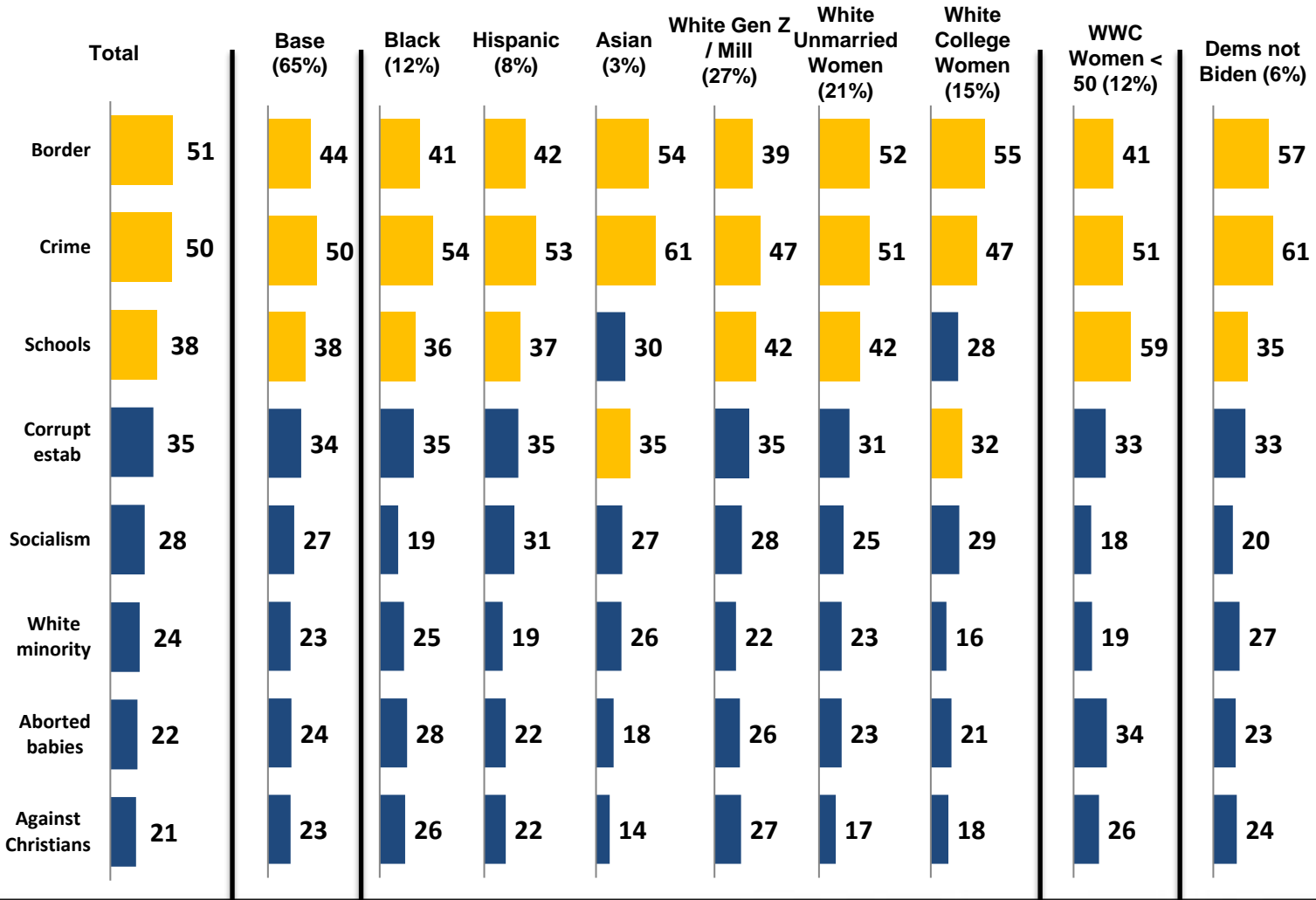

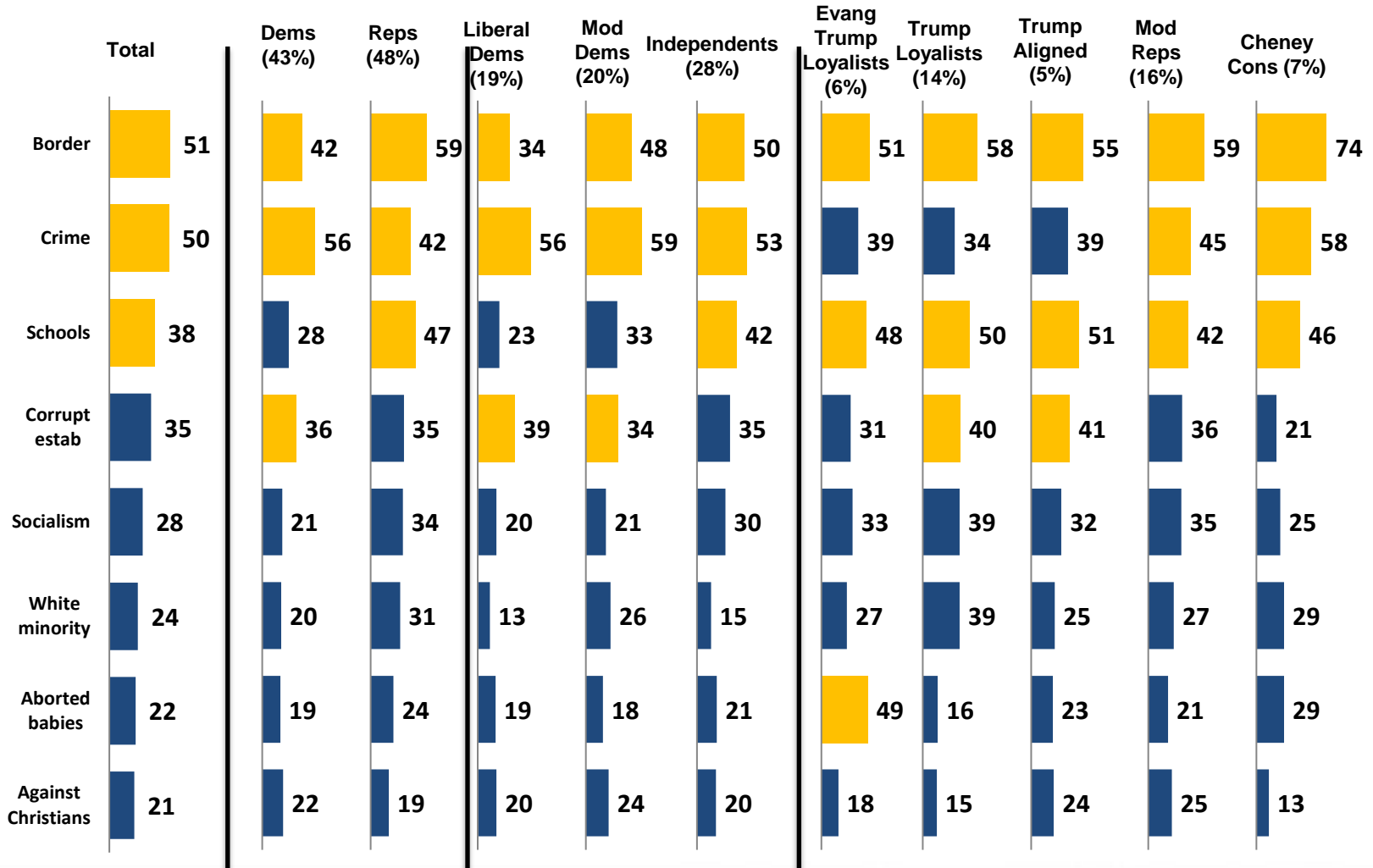

Attacks on Republicans and Democrats



Attacks on Republicans – full text

(SOCIAL SECURITY) They have passed major cuts to the Social Security Administration that slow services for seniors and the disabled. The new Speaker supports major cuts, raising the full retirement age from 67 to 69, putting many more seniors in poverty, and eliminating the cost-of-living adjustment for those with higher incomes.

(MASSACRES) Despite the weekly massacre of kids, they have only been willing to support small changes to gun laws. They wouldn't even consider comprehensive background checks or banning high-capacity magazines. Most important, they blocked raising the age to buy assault weapons from 18 to 21 years.

(FAMILIESDRUGSCTC) Every Republican in Congress voted against the law to reduce the price of insulin and allow Medicare to negotiate lower prices. They also voted against the increased and expanded Child Tax Credit that gave monthly checks to working families with kids.

(CORPORATE TAX) They voted against the biggest corporations paying a minimum tax of 15 percent and voted against increasing IRS enforcement to ensure billionaires pay tax too. They voted against a 1 percent fee on oil companies using their excess profits for stock buy backs, rather than lowering prices.

(PUBLIC EDUCATION) They want to cut funding for public education by cutting Title I grants by 80 percent, cutting the Education Department's budget by 30 percent, and are calling to shut down the Department of Education altogether.

(CHAOS) House Republicans' in-fighting left the House without a leader, with no one third in line to the president. The chaos makes America look weaker.

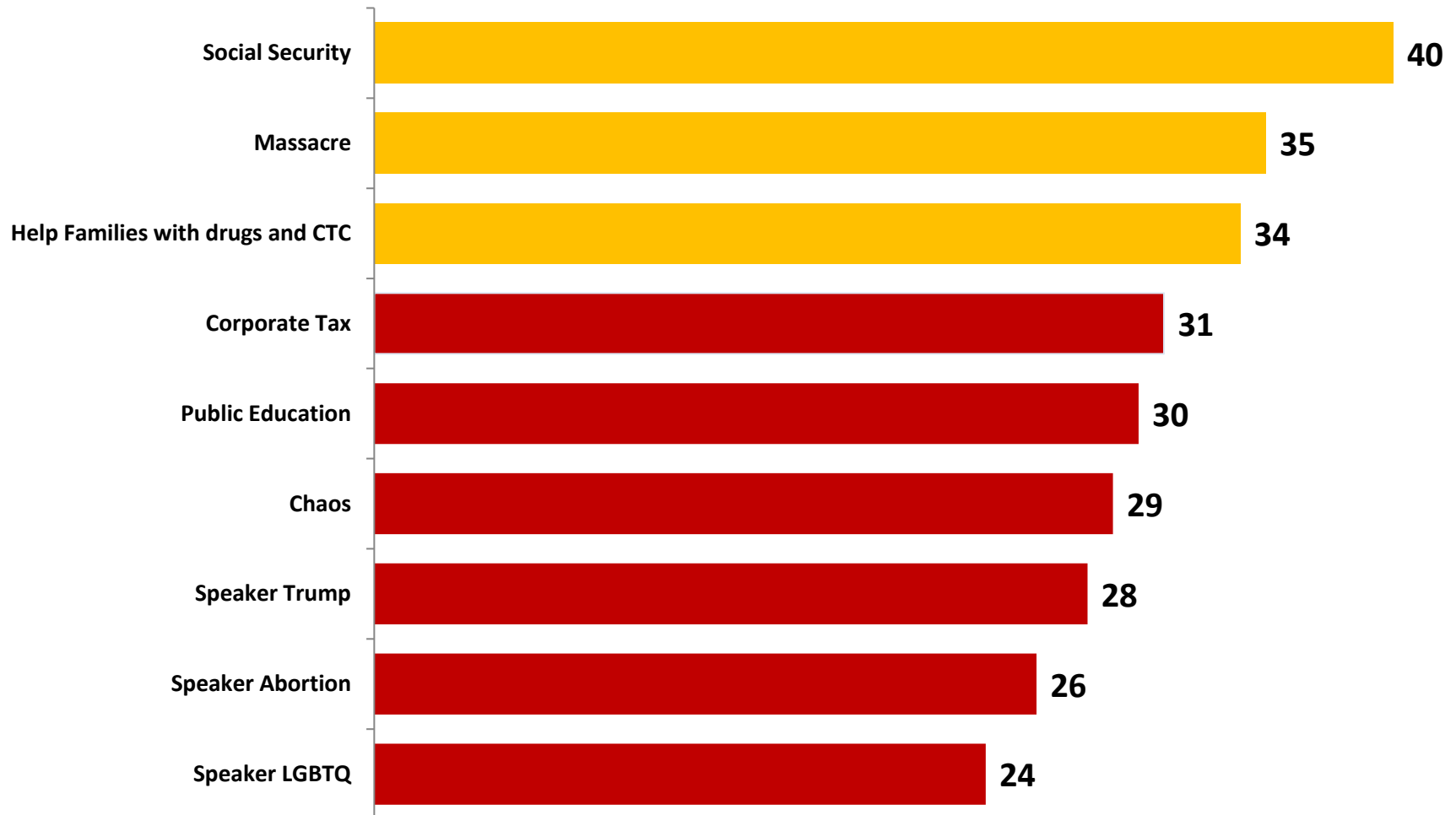
(SPEAKER TRUMP) The new Republican Speaker led the efforts in the House to overturn the last presidential election and won because he was backed by Donald Trump.

(SPEAKER ABORTION) The New Speaker is a religious conservative who wants to make abortion illegal nationally.

(SPEAKER LGBTQ) His Evangelical faith leads the new Republican Speaker to view homosexuality as "inherently unnatural," comparing it to bestiality, and believed the Supreme Court was wrong to legalize gay marriage.

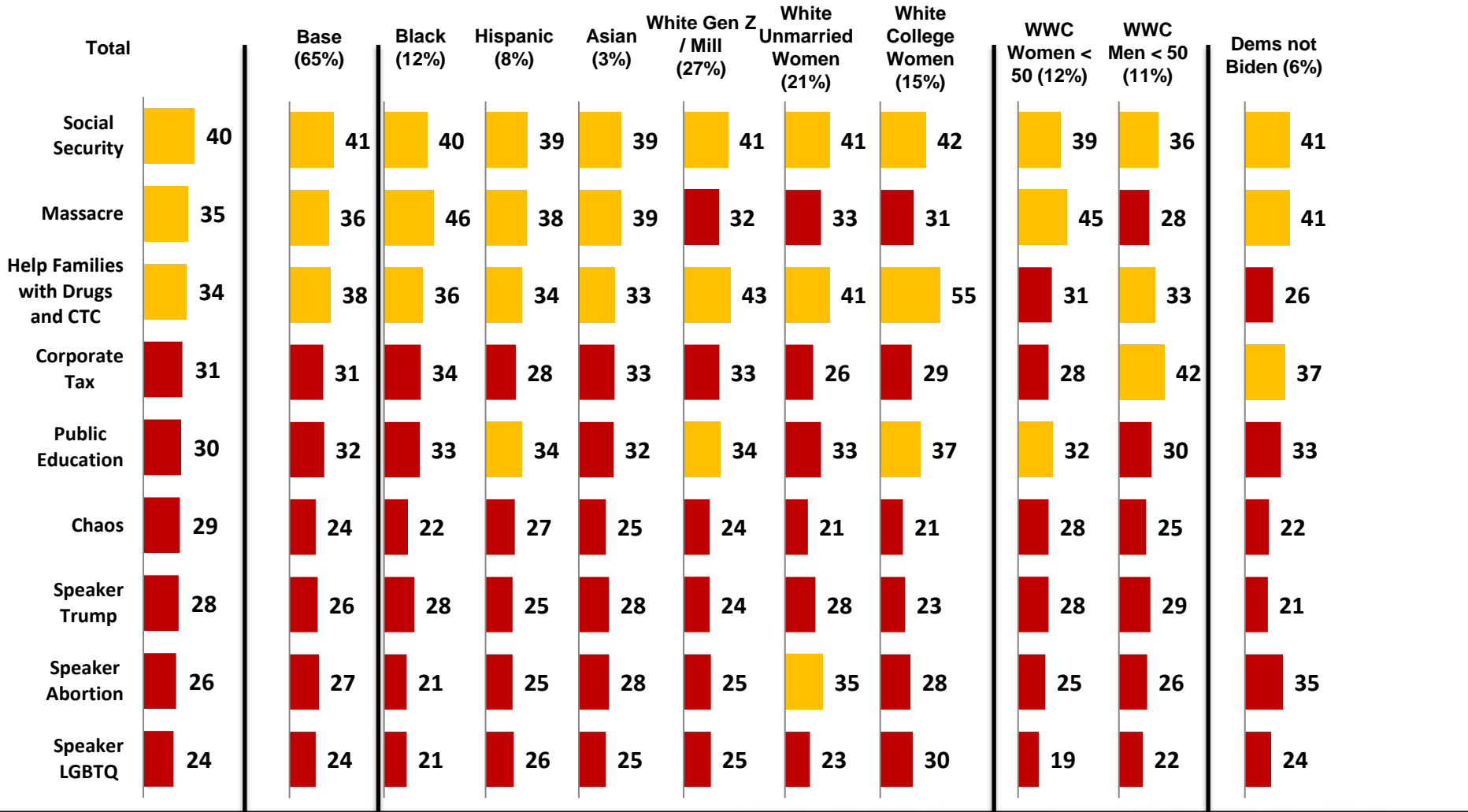

Attacks on Democrats – full text

(IMMIGRATION) Under Biden, the southern border has been abolished and millions of illegal aliens have been released into our communities. They are coming in from mental institutions and prisons that are being emptied. Democrats voted to defund border security, end border wall construction, and support sanctuary cities.

(CRIME) They are defunding the police, while hundreds of officers across the state have left their jobs. 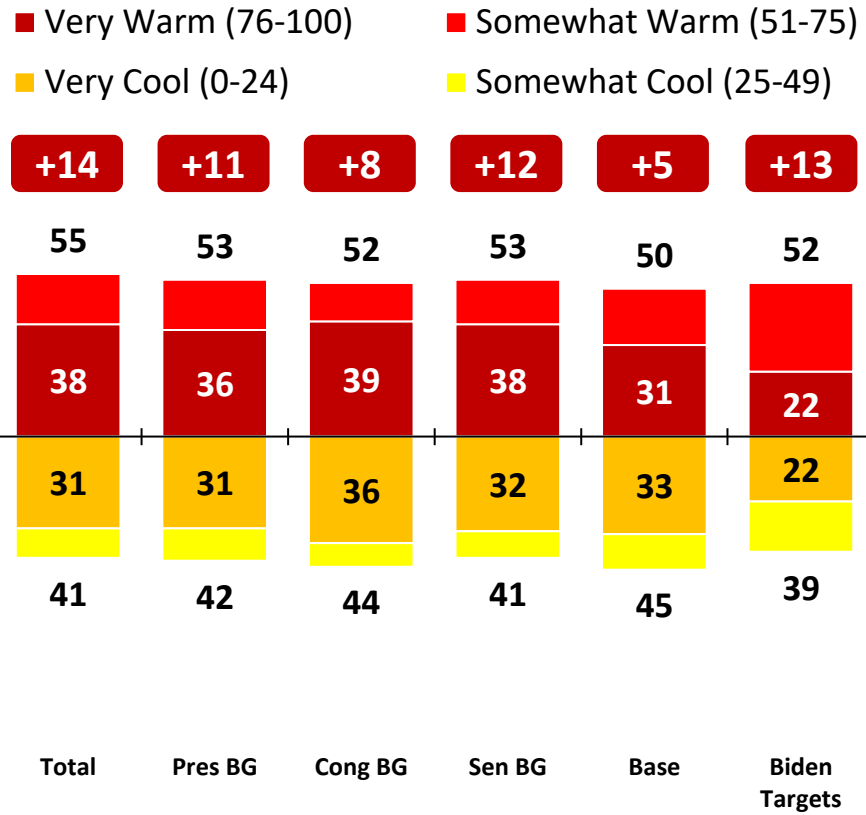

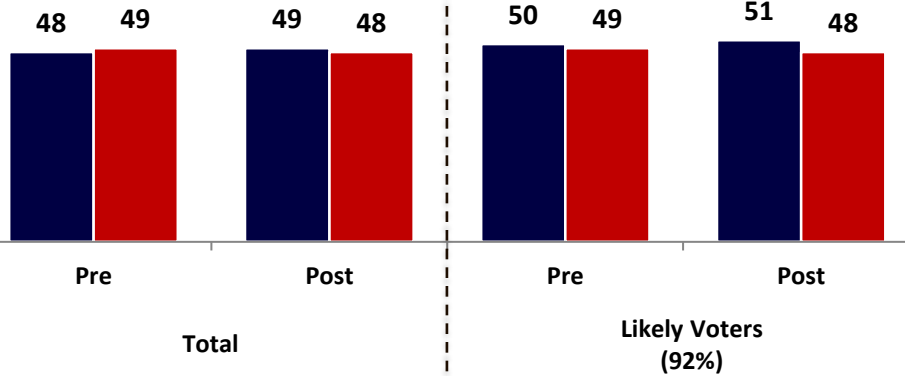

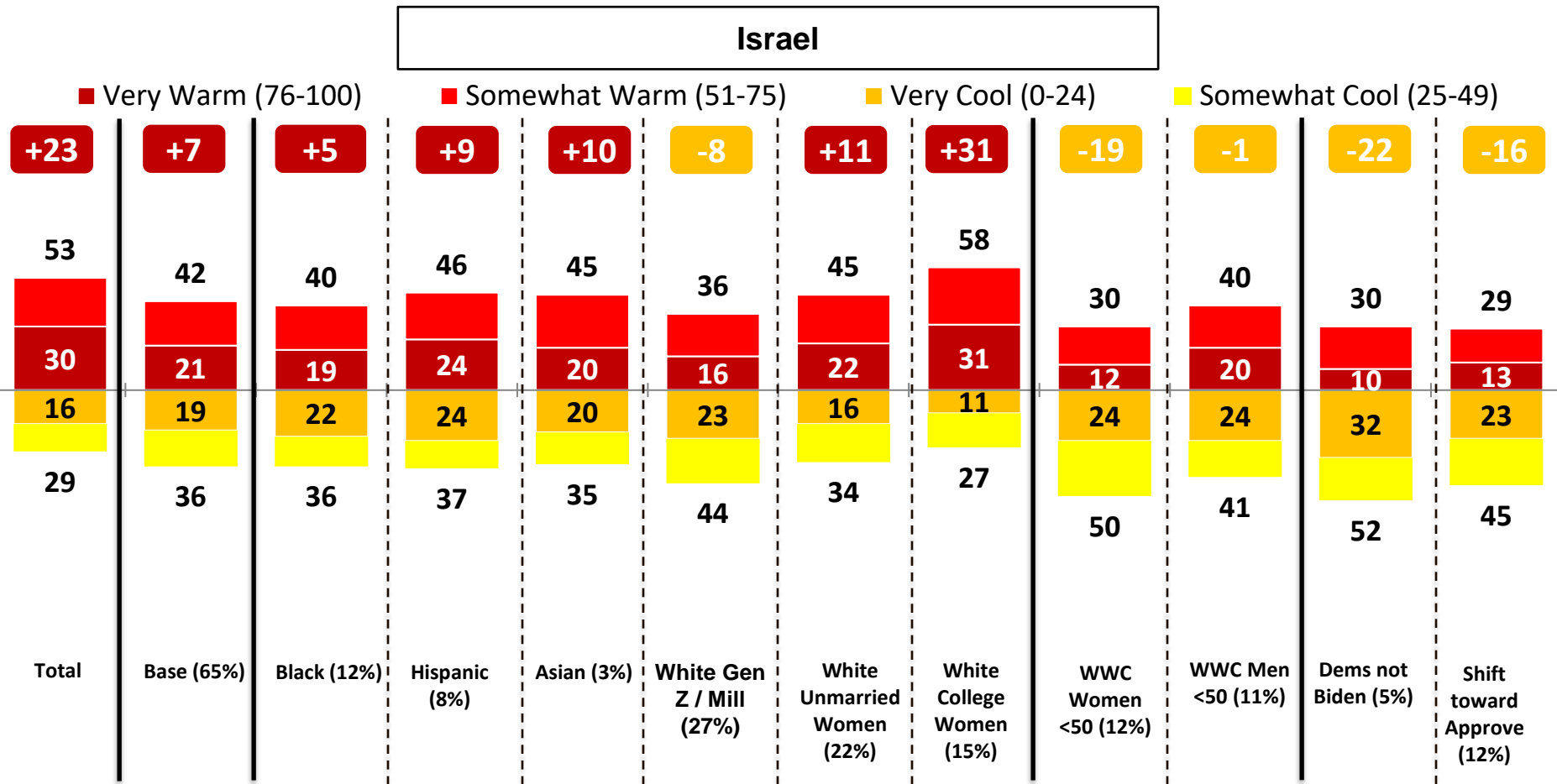

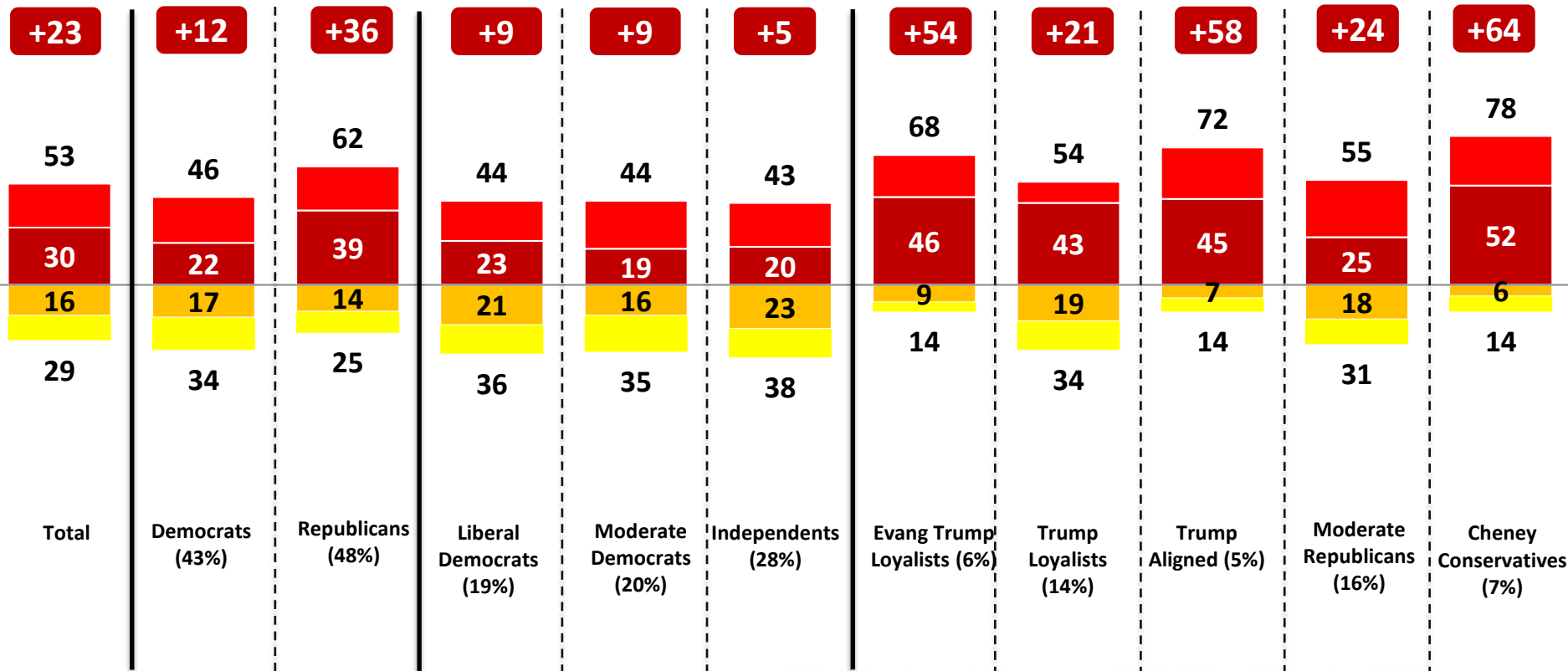

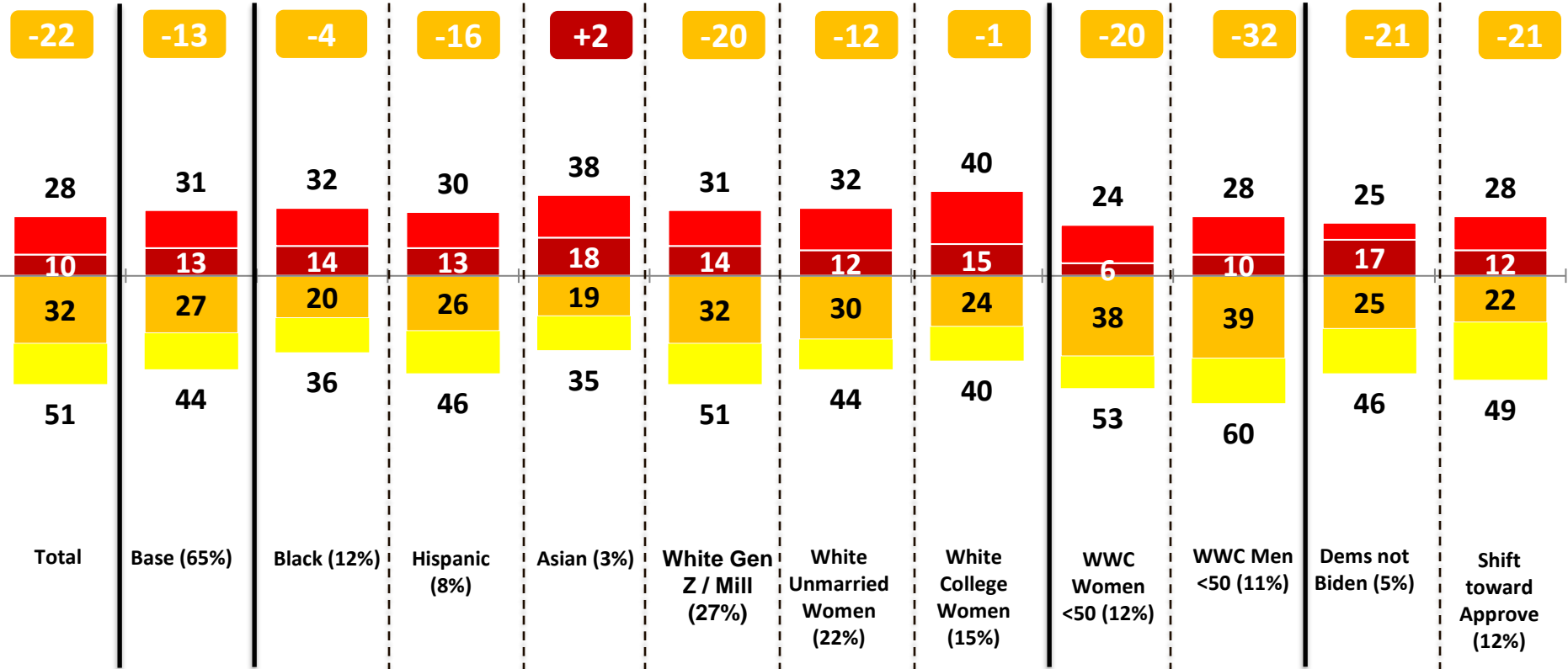

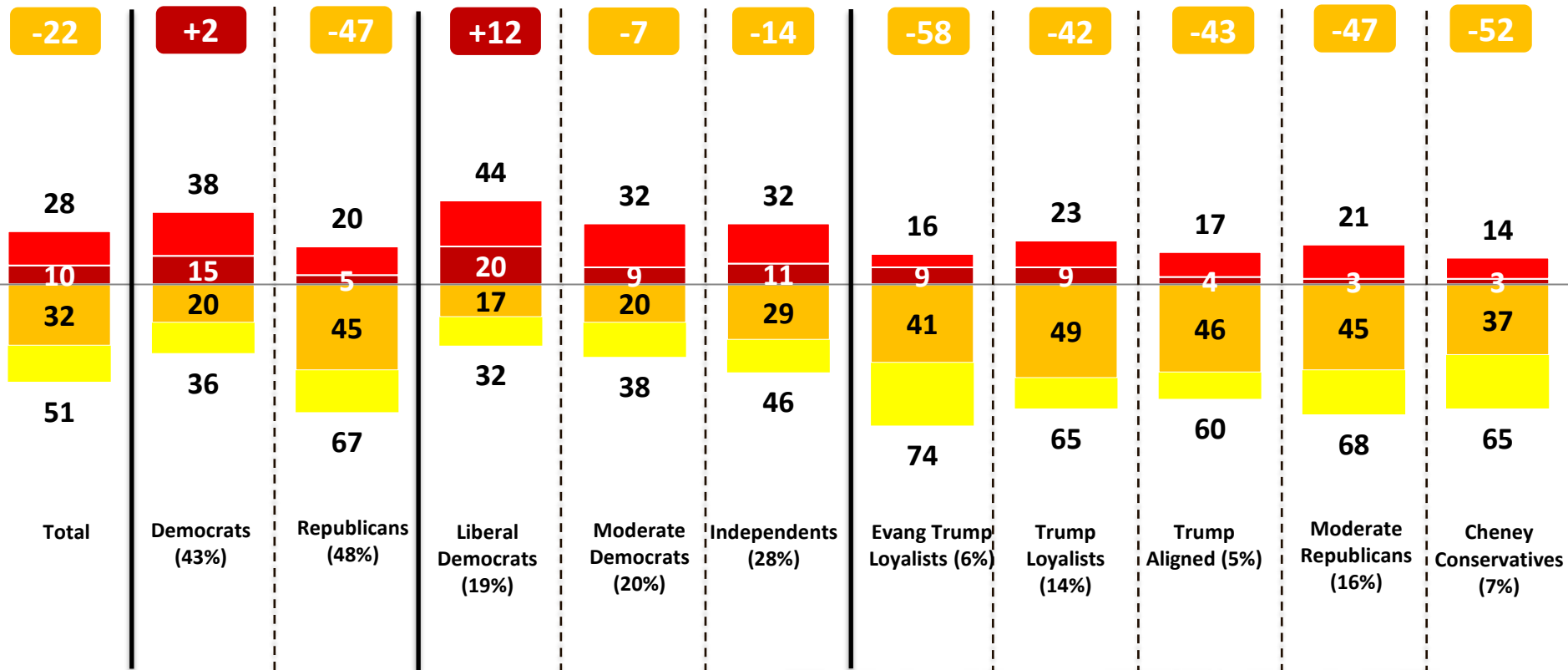
