### Methodology: cell and demographic change

This presentation is based on our latest national survey conducted by Greenberg Quinlan Rosner for Democracy Corps.

The survey of 950 2012 voters (950 weighted) and 852 likely 2014 voters nationwide was conducted from January 10-14, 2013.

Unless otherwise noted, margin of error= +/-3.18 percentage points at 95% confidence.

New this year, we now reach 50 percent of our respondents by cell phone, in order to account for ever-changing demographics and trying to accurately sample the full American electorate.

The demographics of the likely electorate reflect new estimates of the likely electorate for off-year elections, including 75 percent white and 24 percent seniors.

### Half give GOP negative rating; just 6 percent give Republican Congress positive rating

### And NRA sees spike in negative ratings, but still viewed positively by many
