

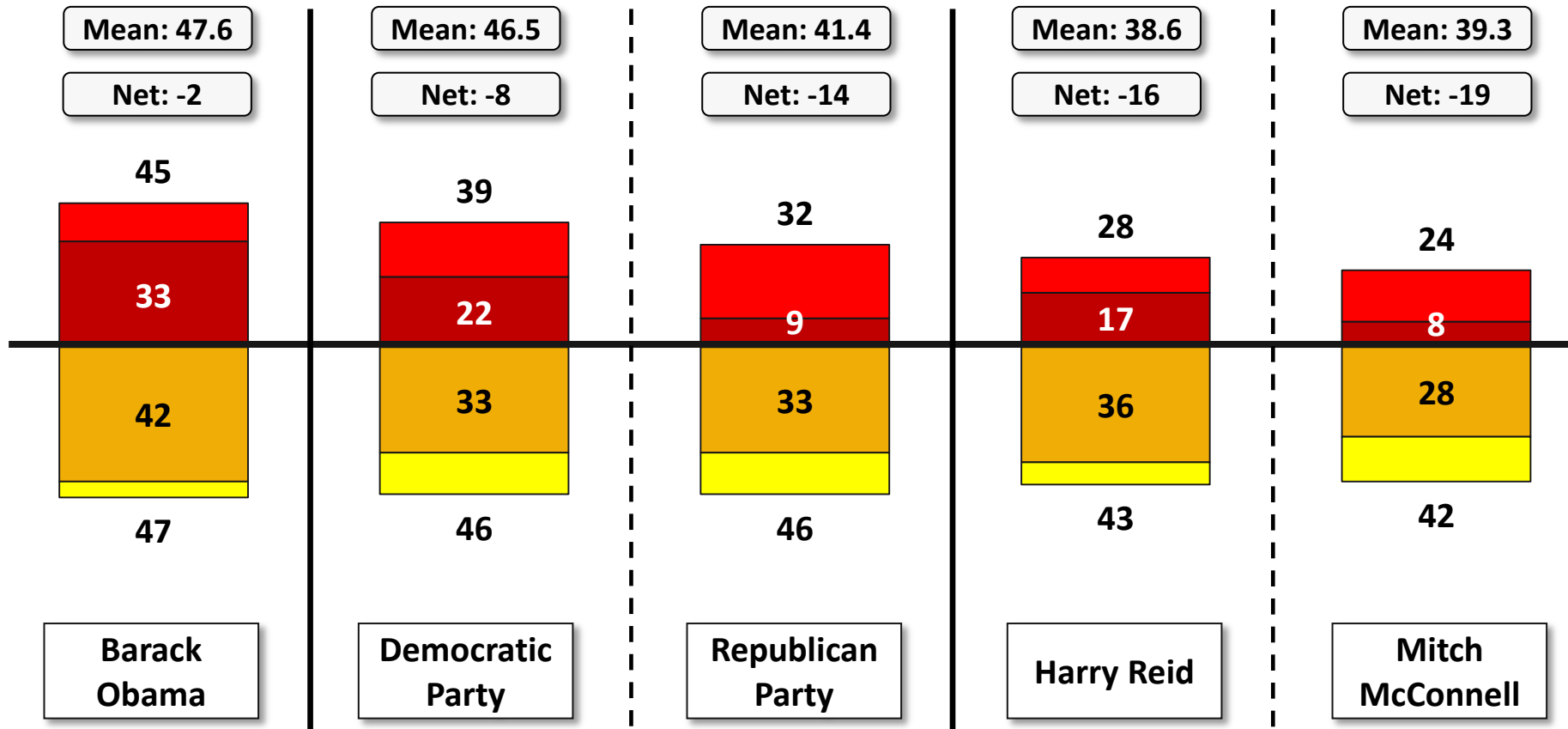

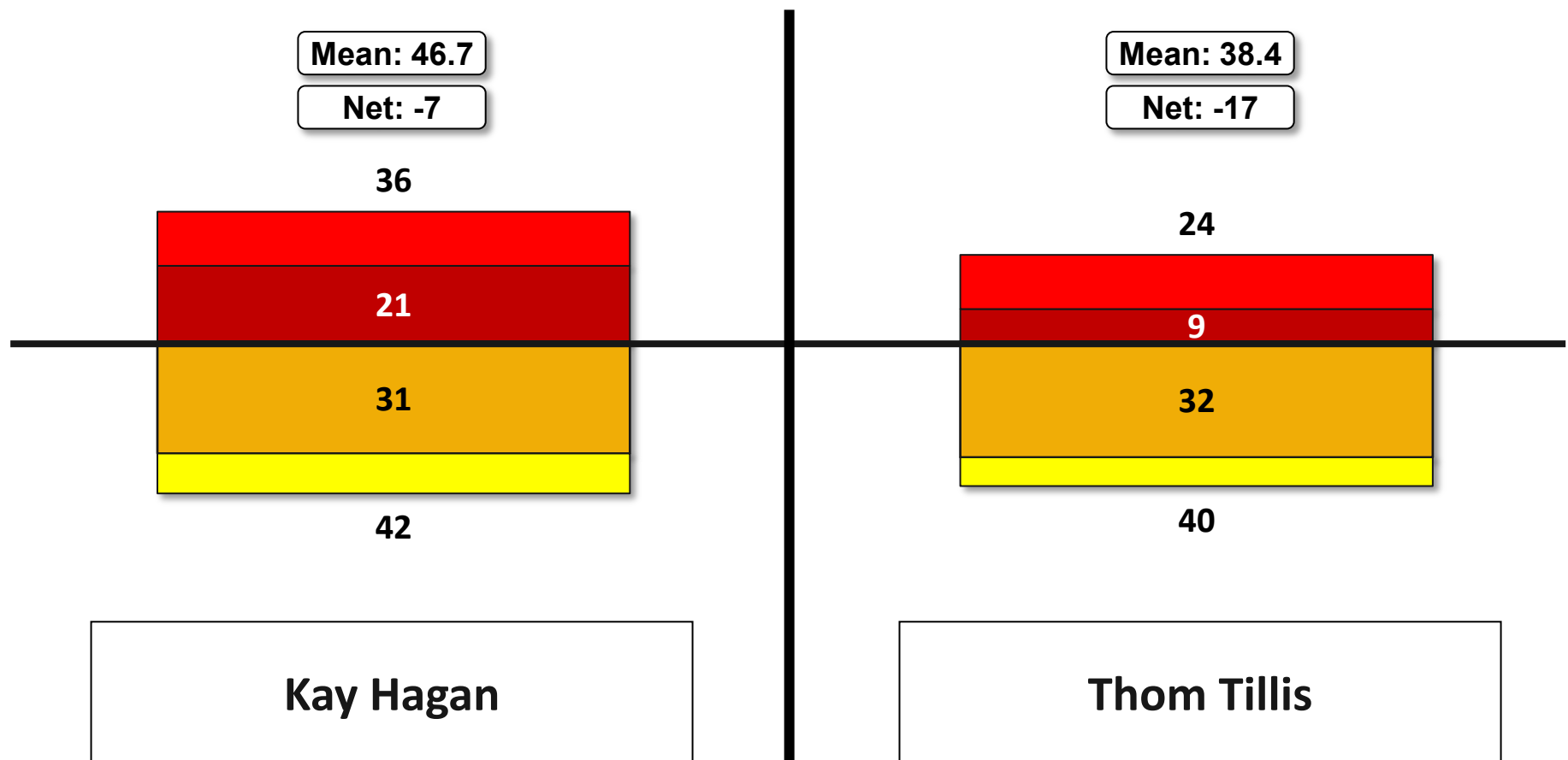

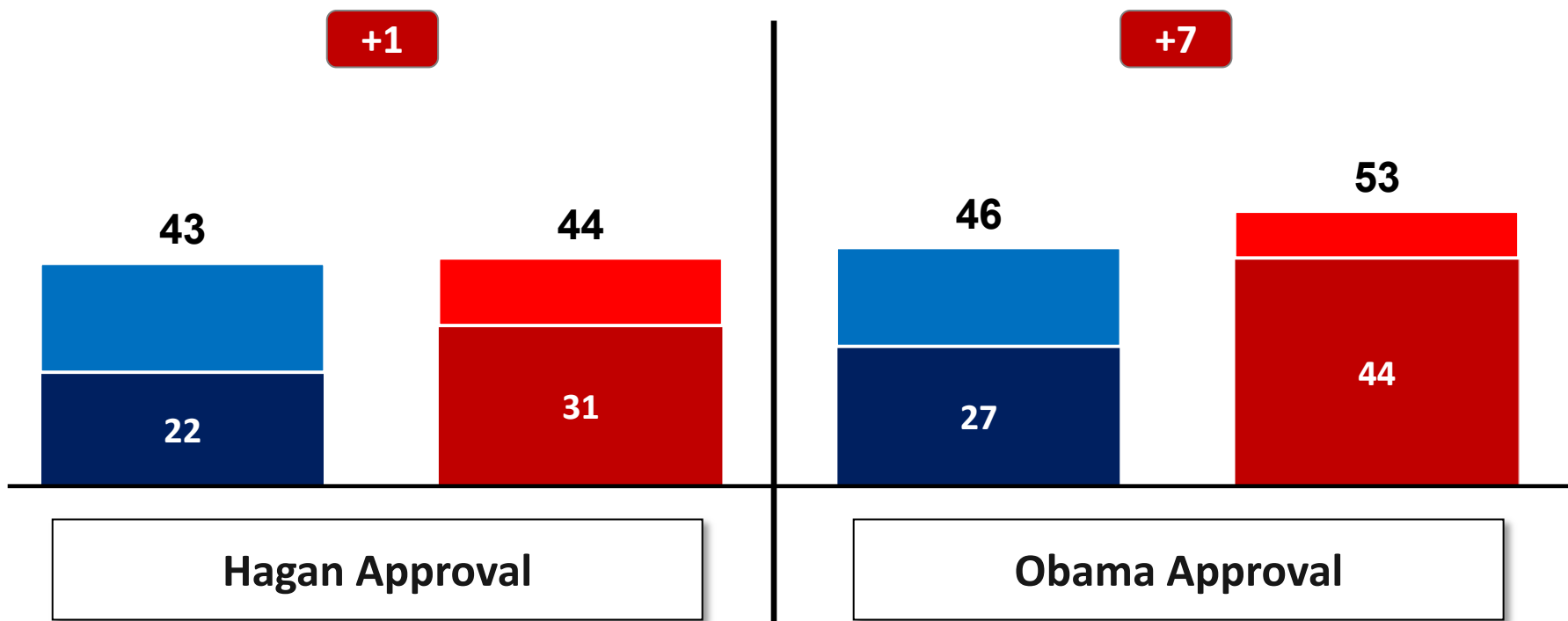

Do you approve or disapprove of the way Barack Obama is handling his job as president?

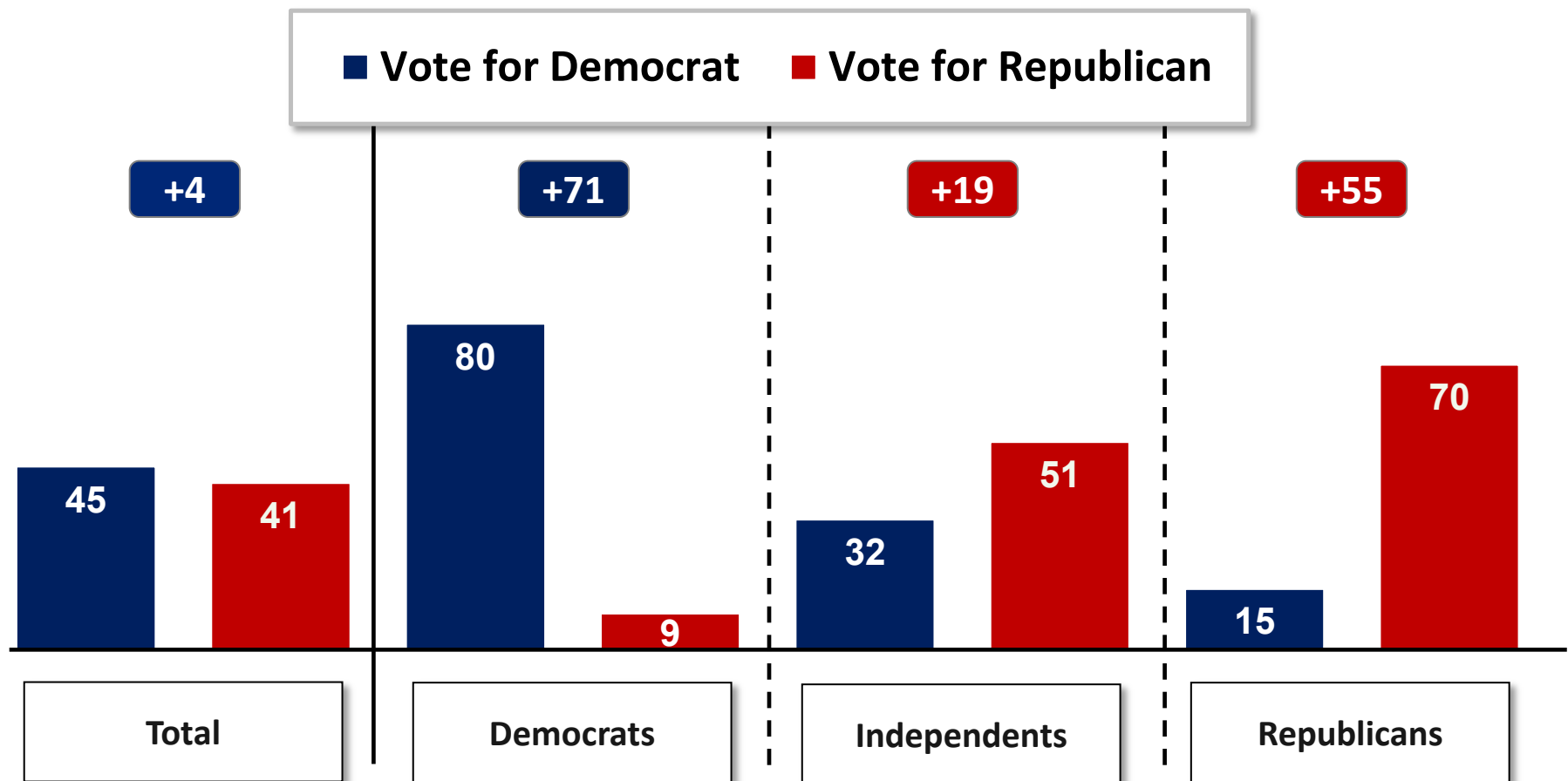

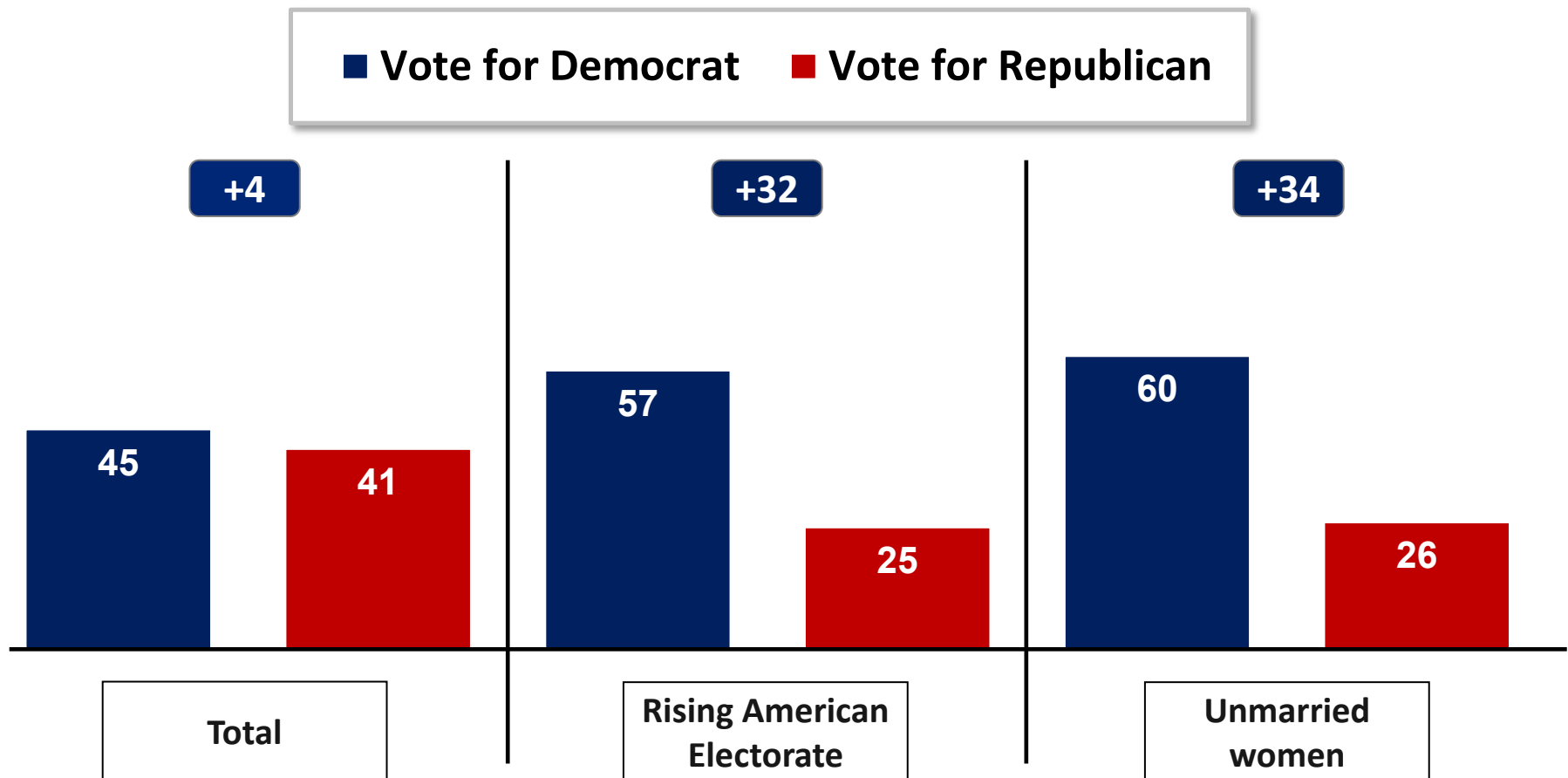

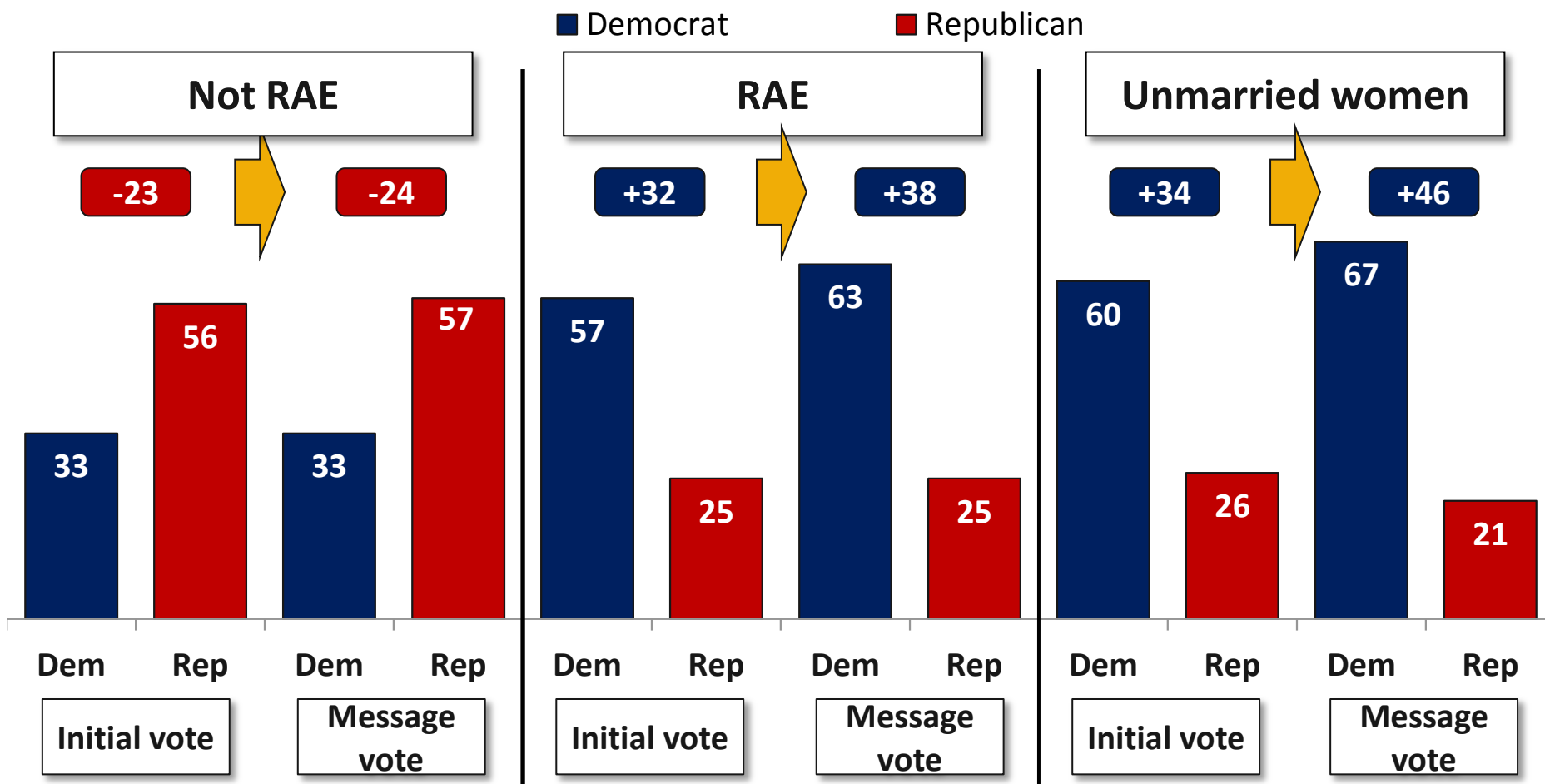

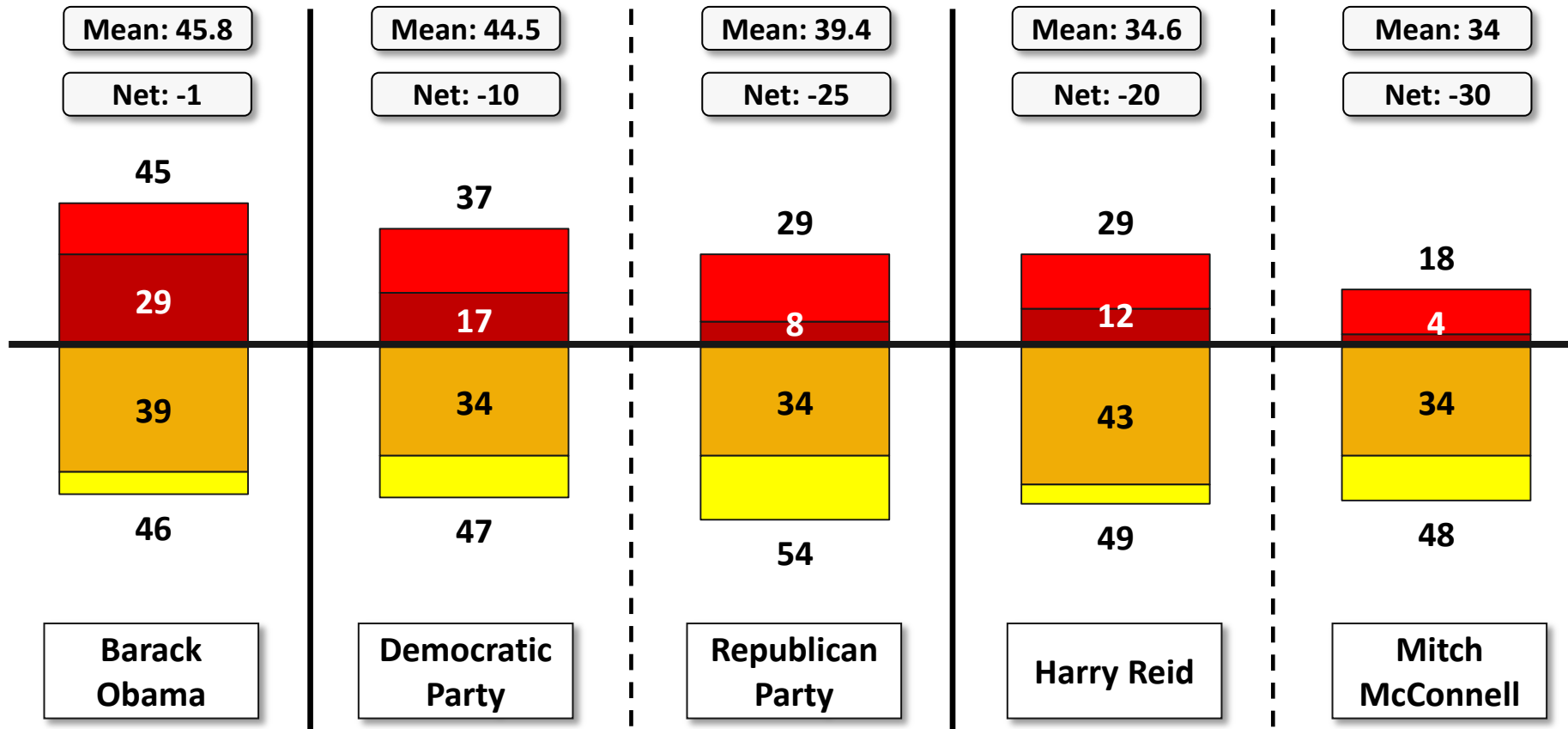

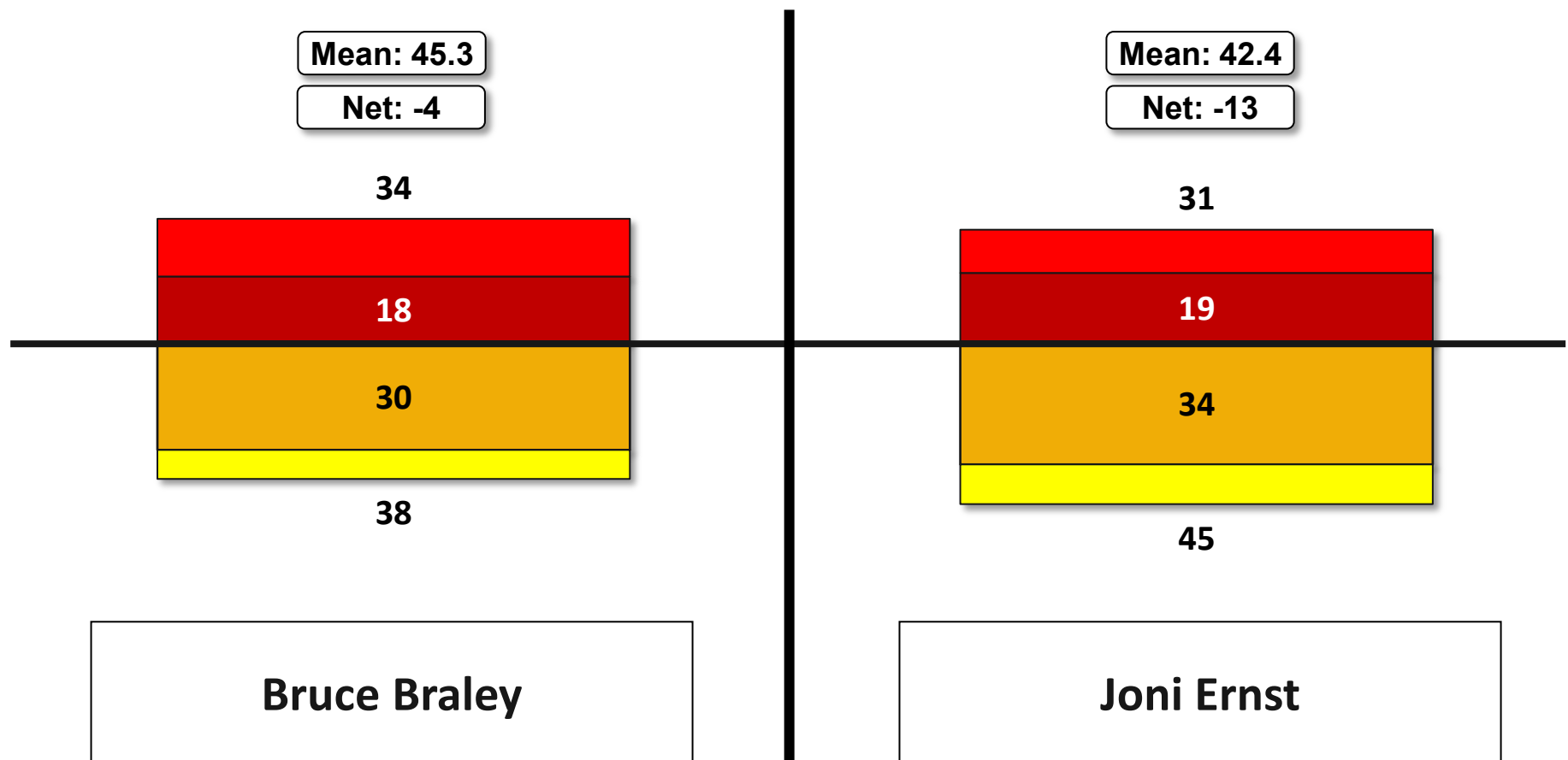

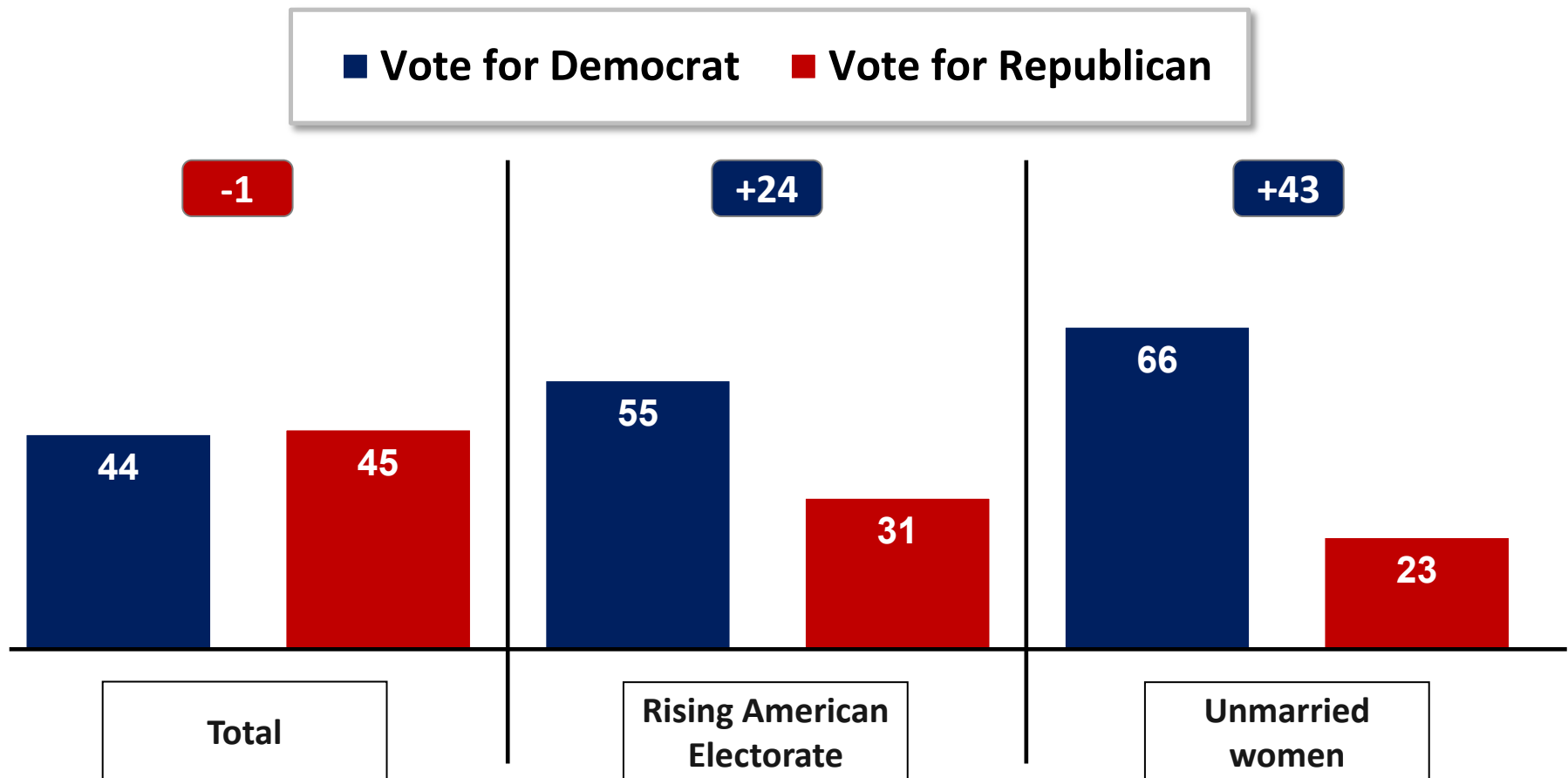

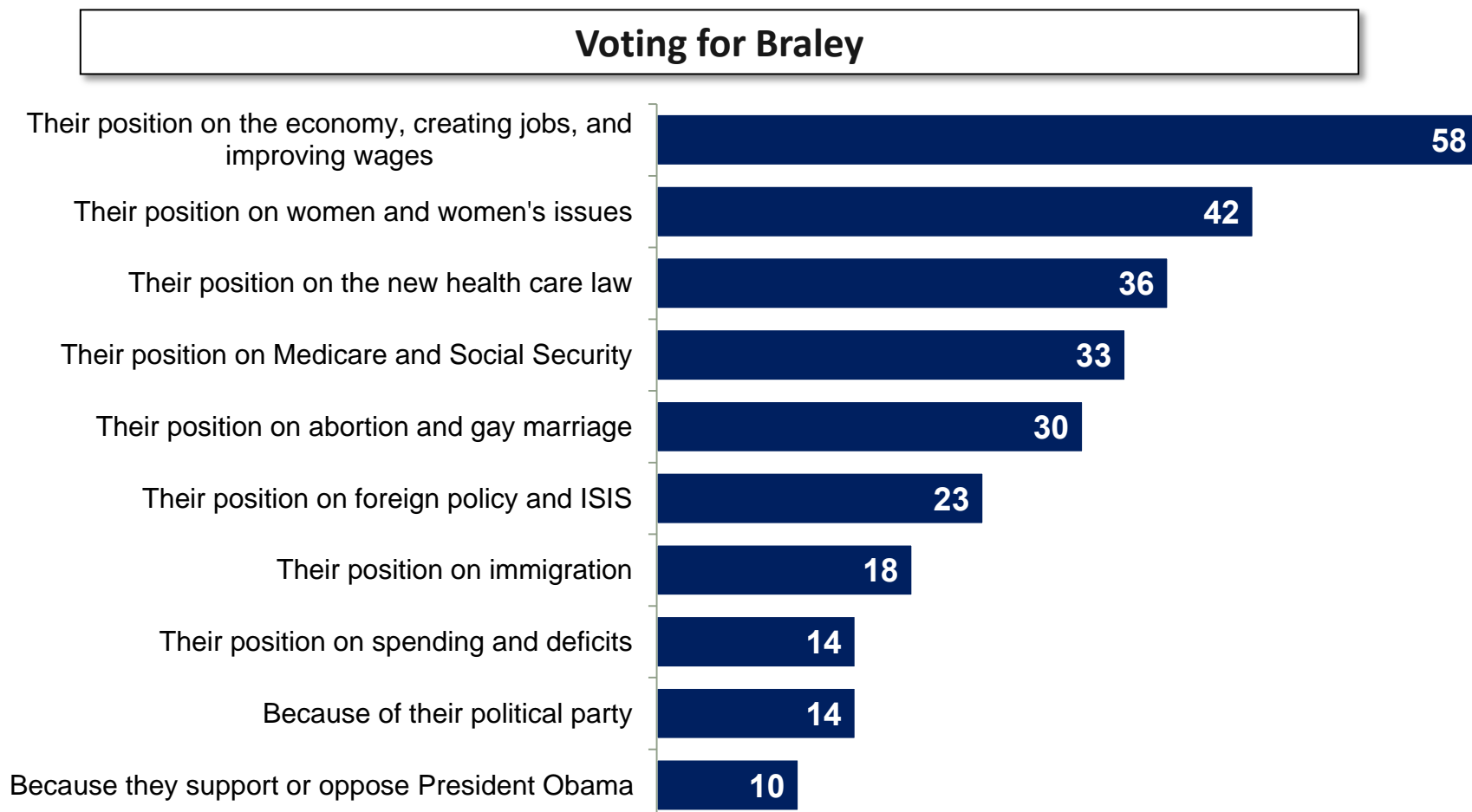

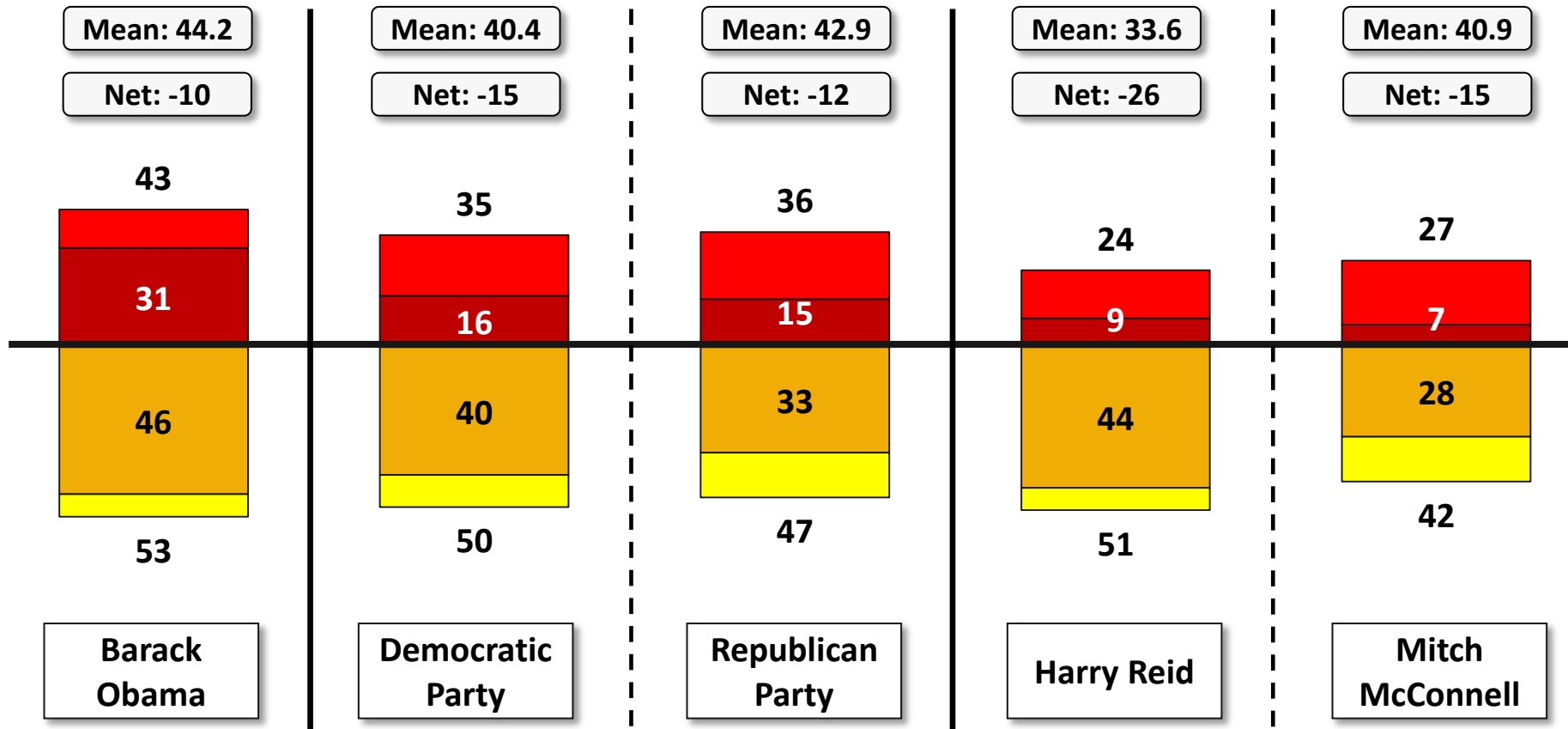

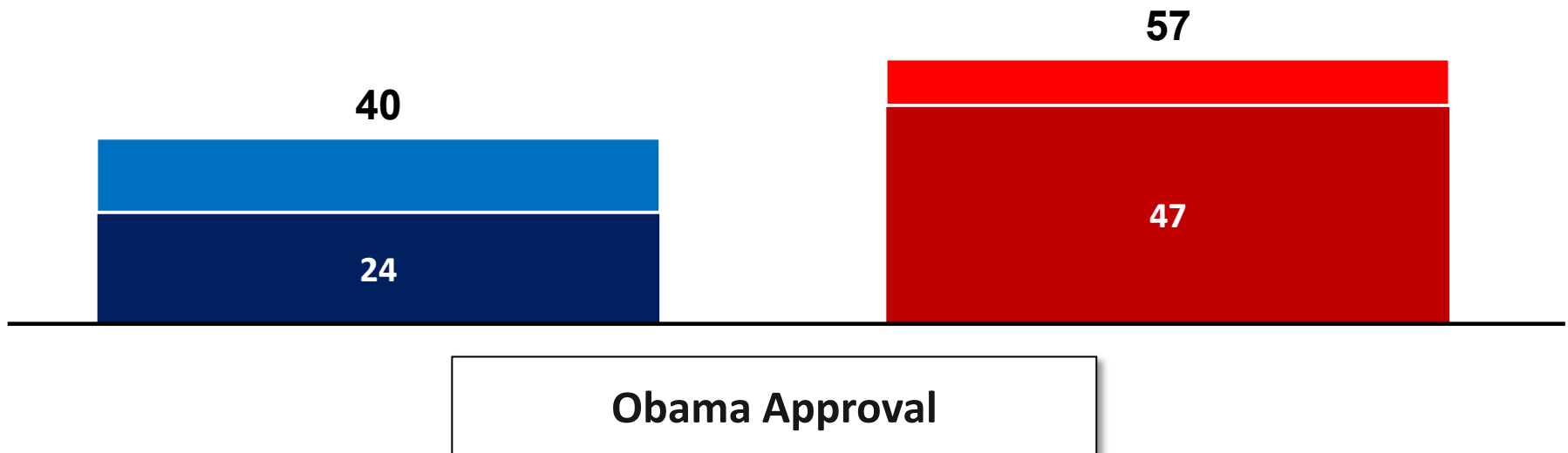


Obama unpopular

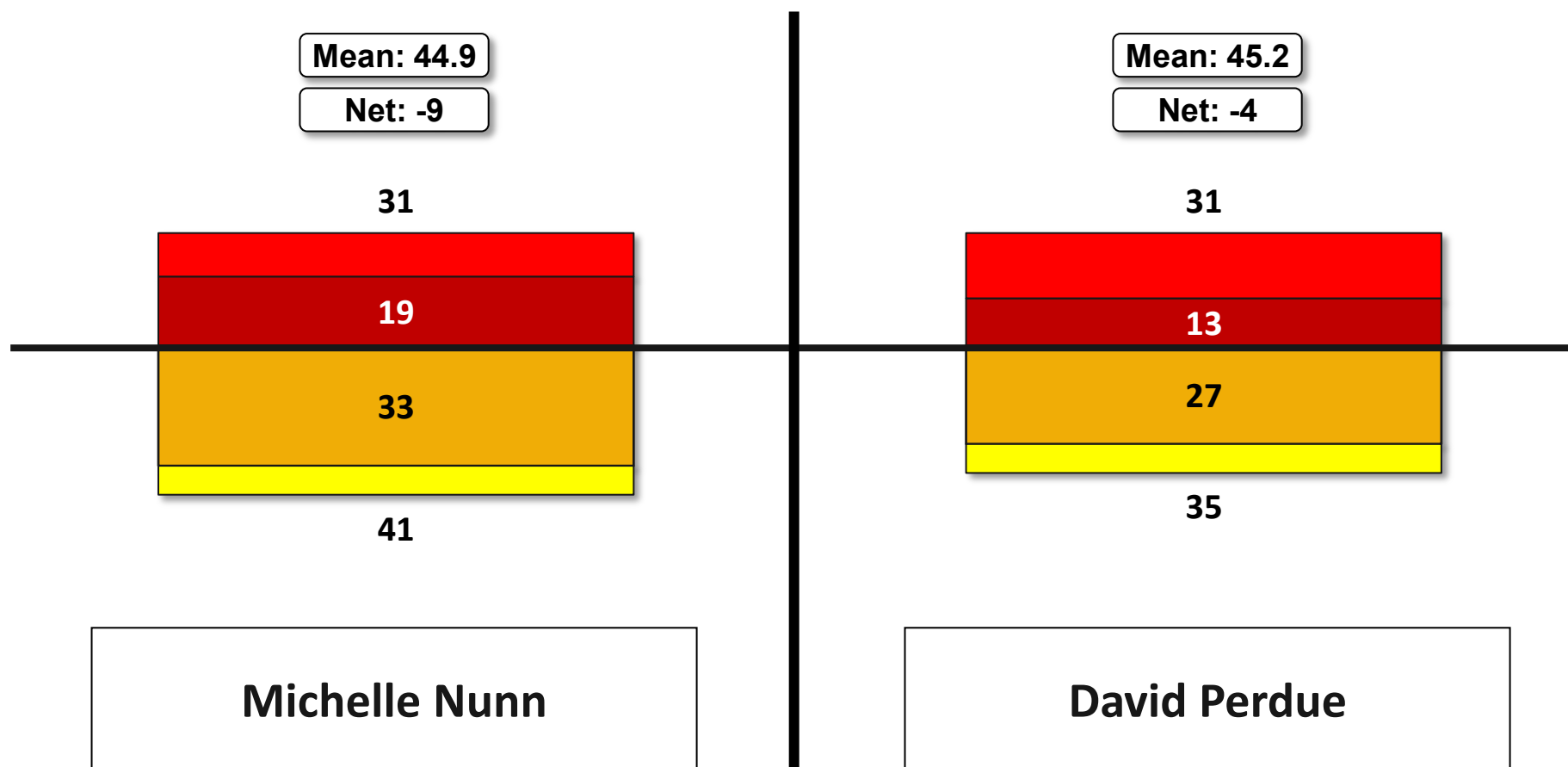

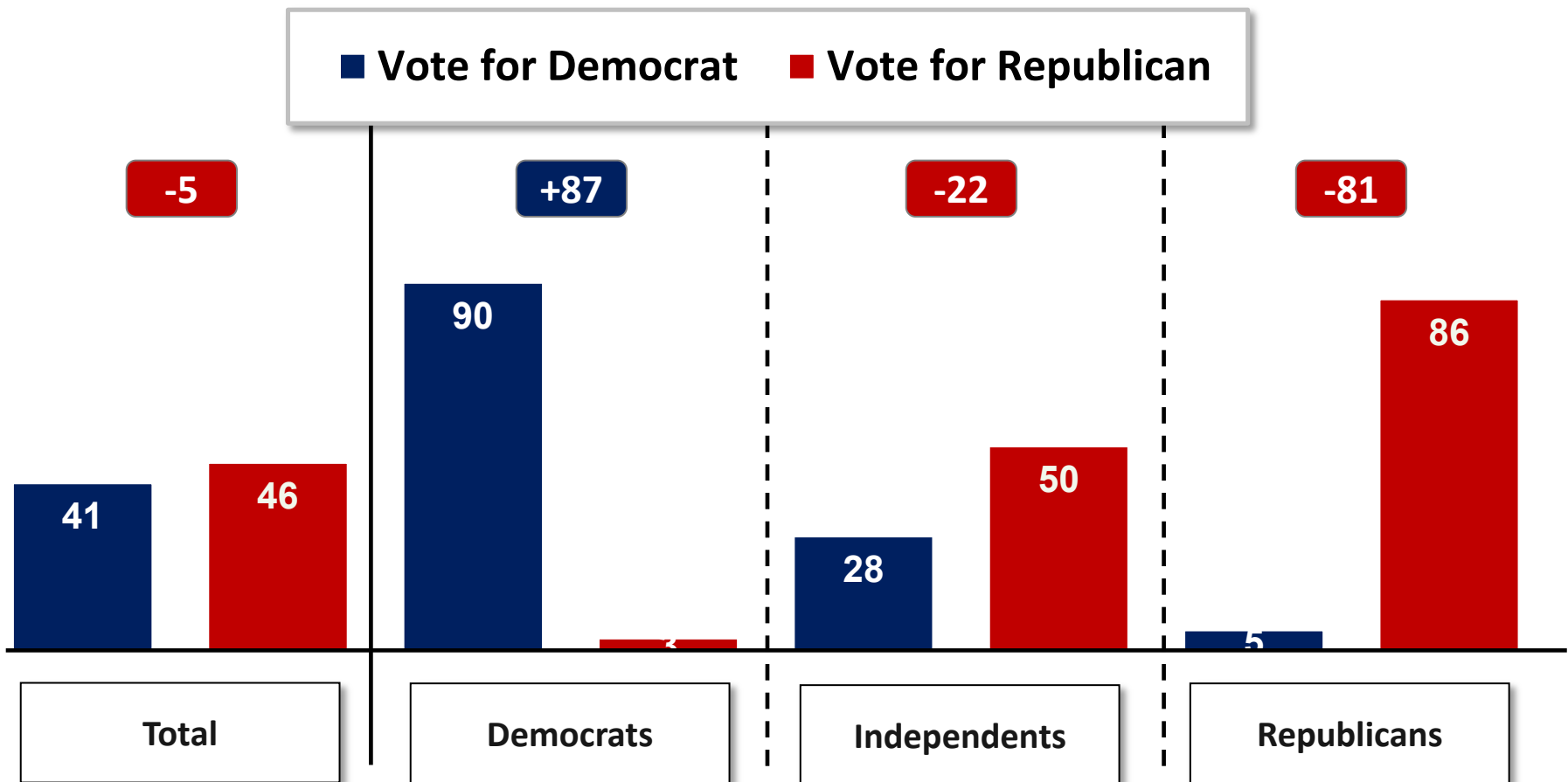

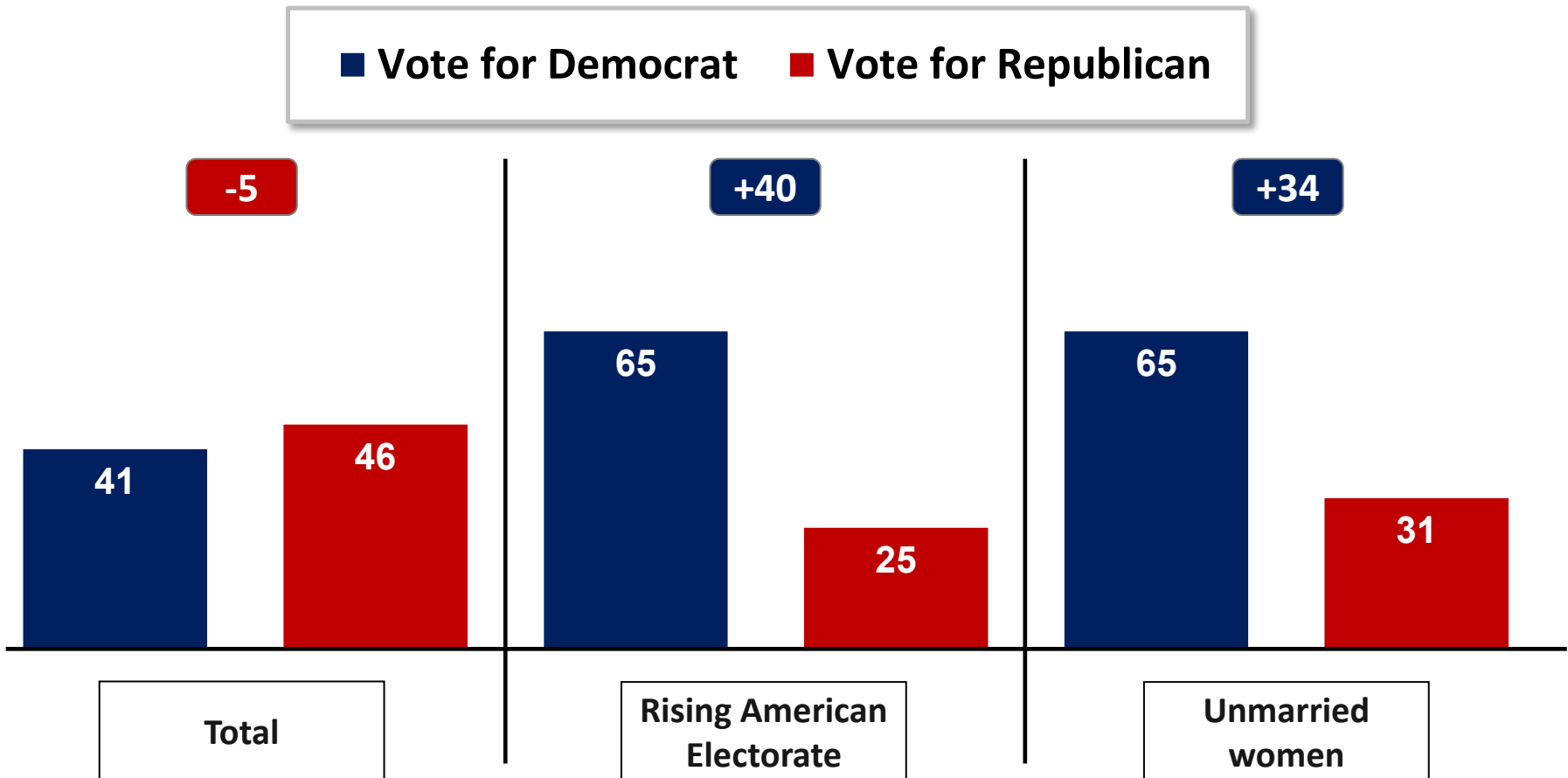

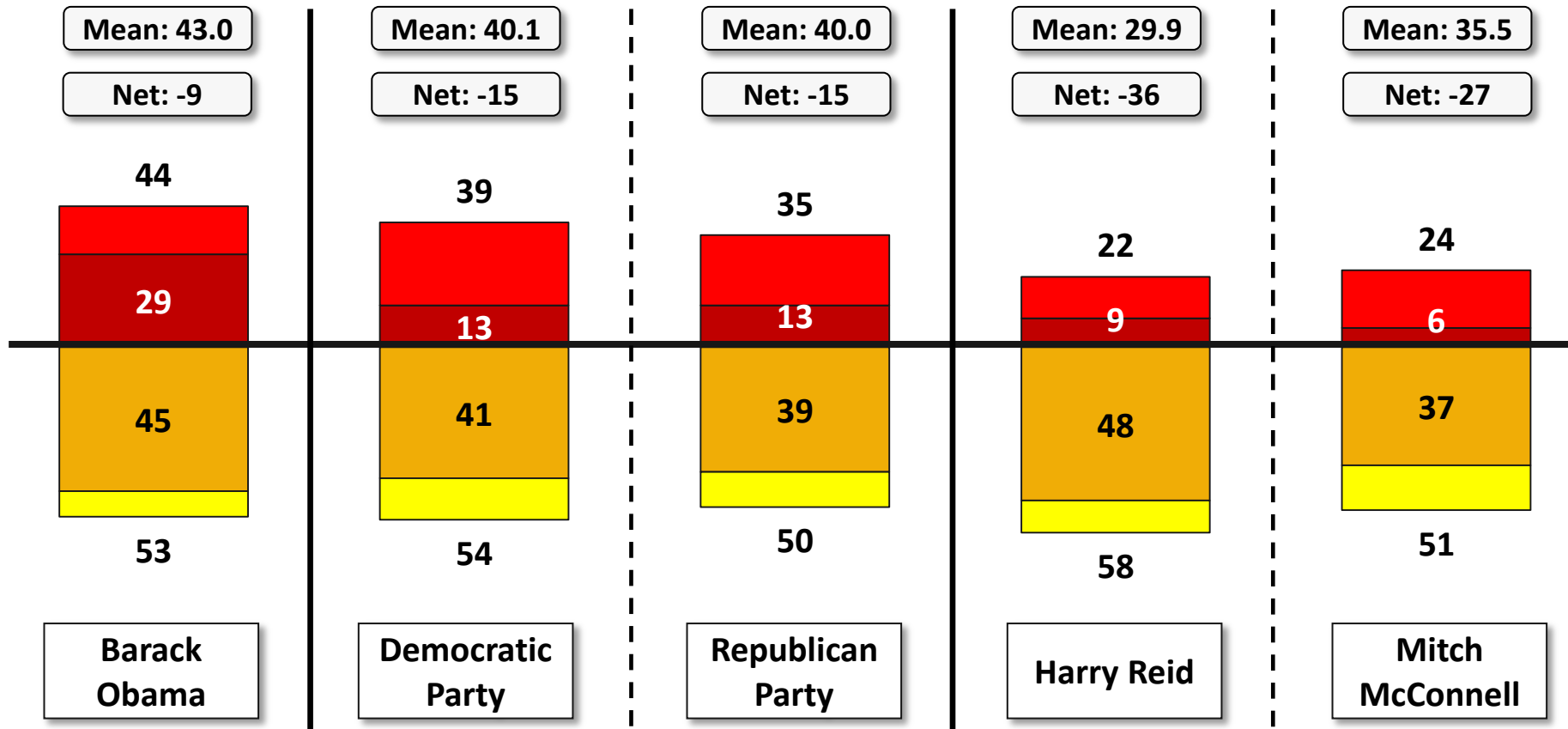

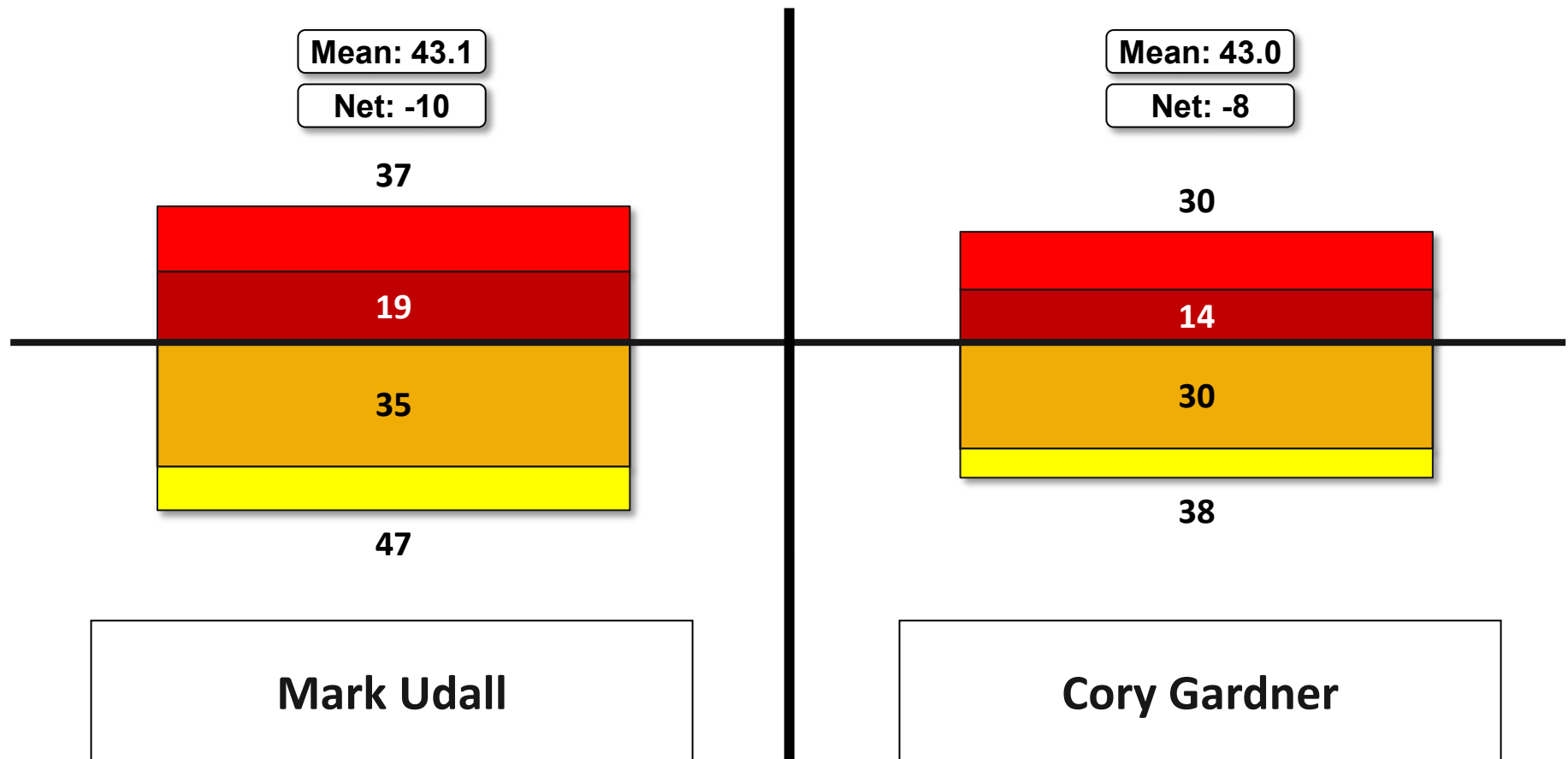

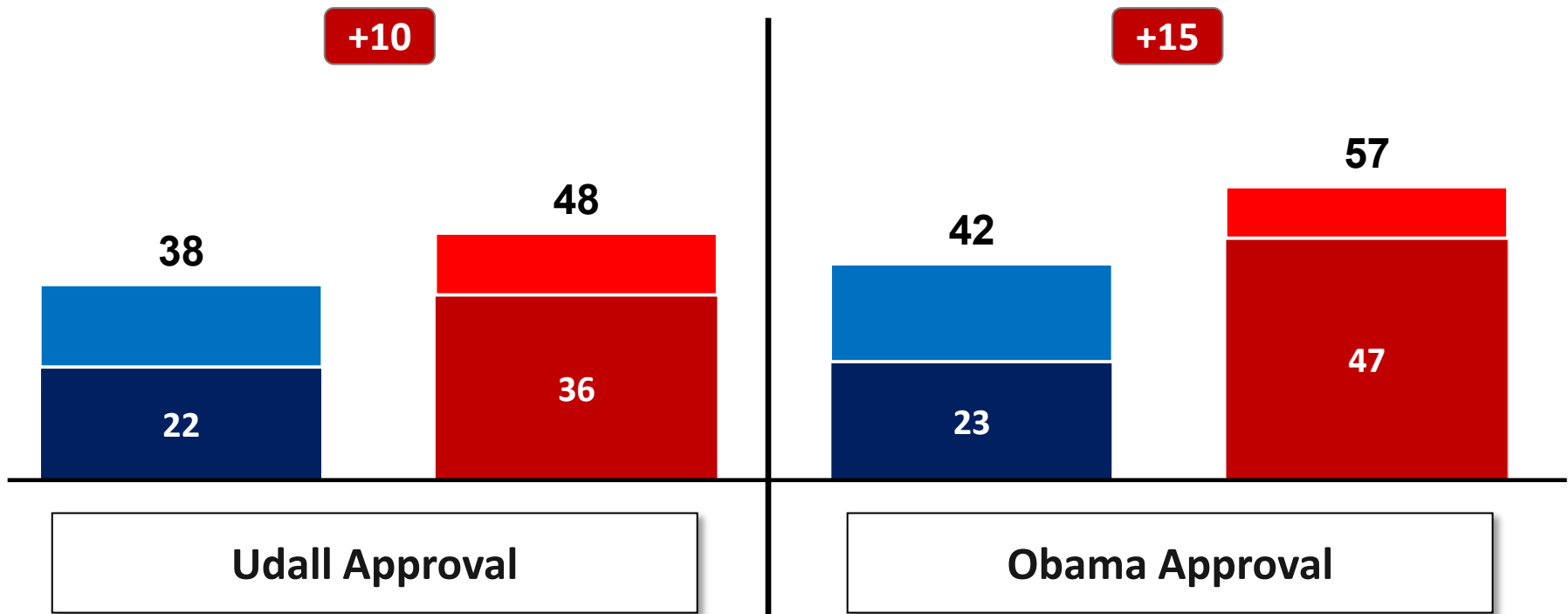

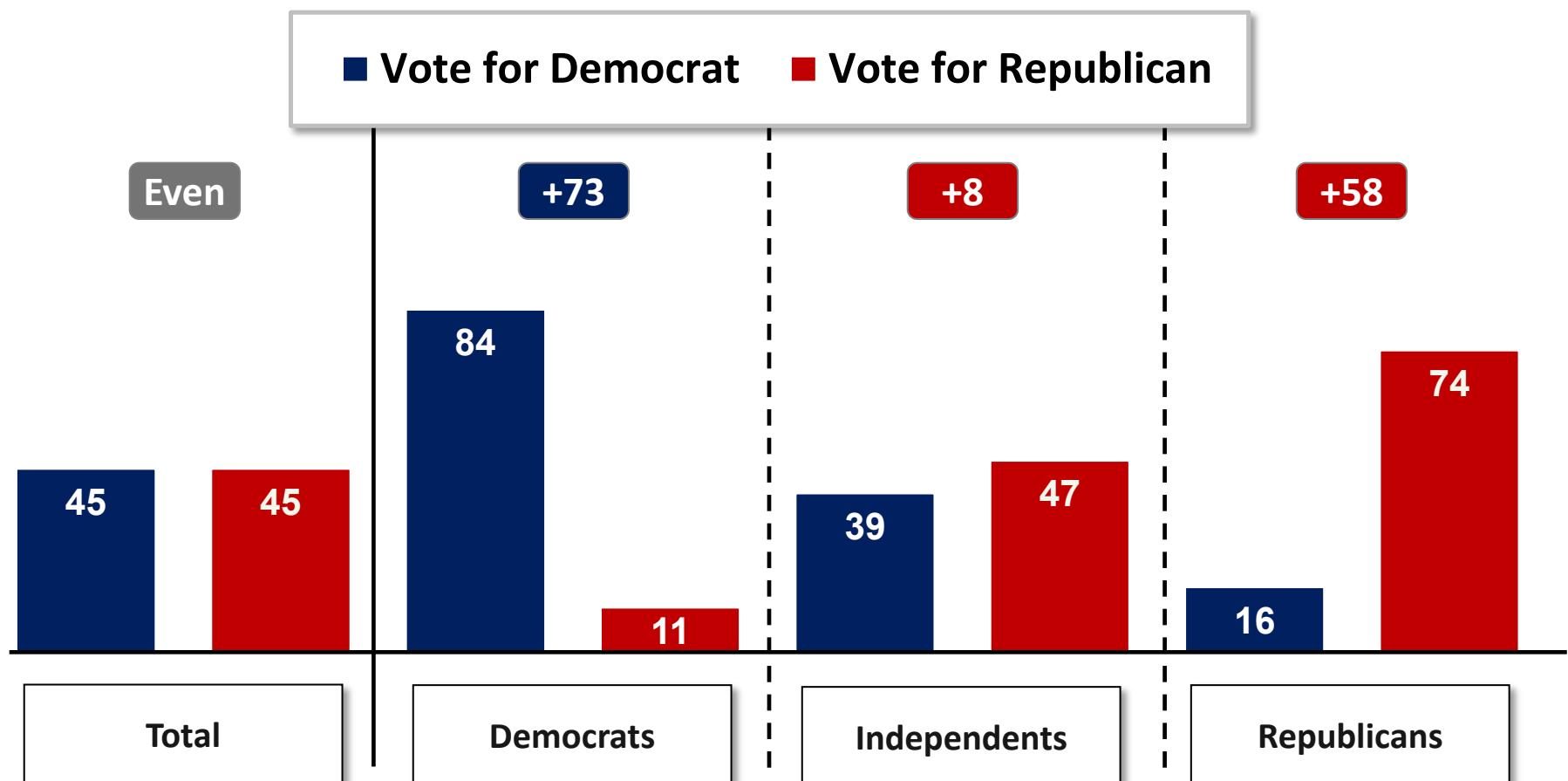

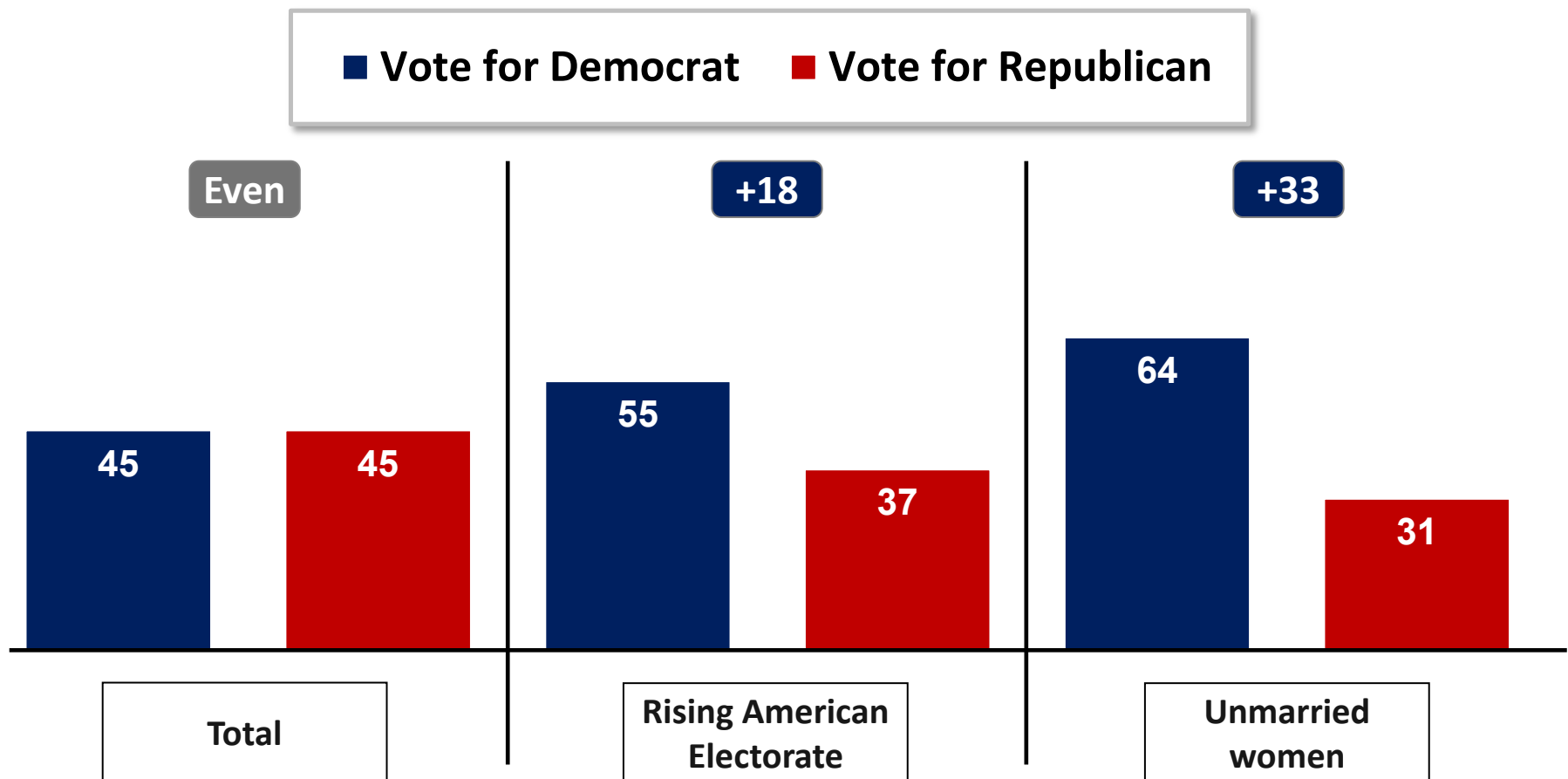

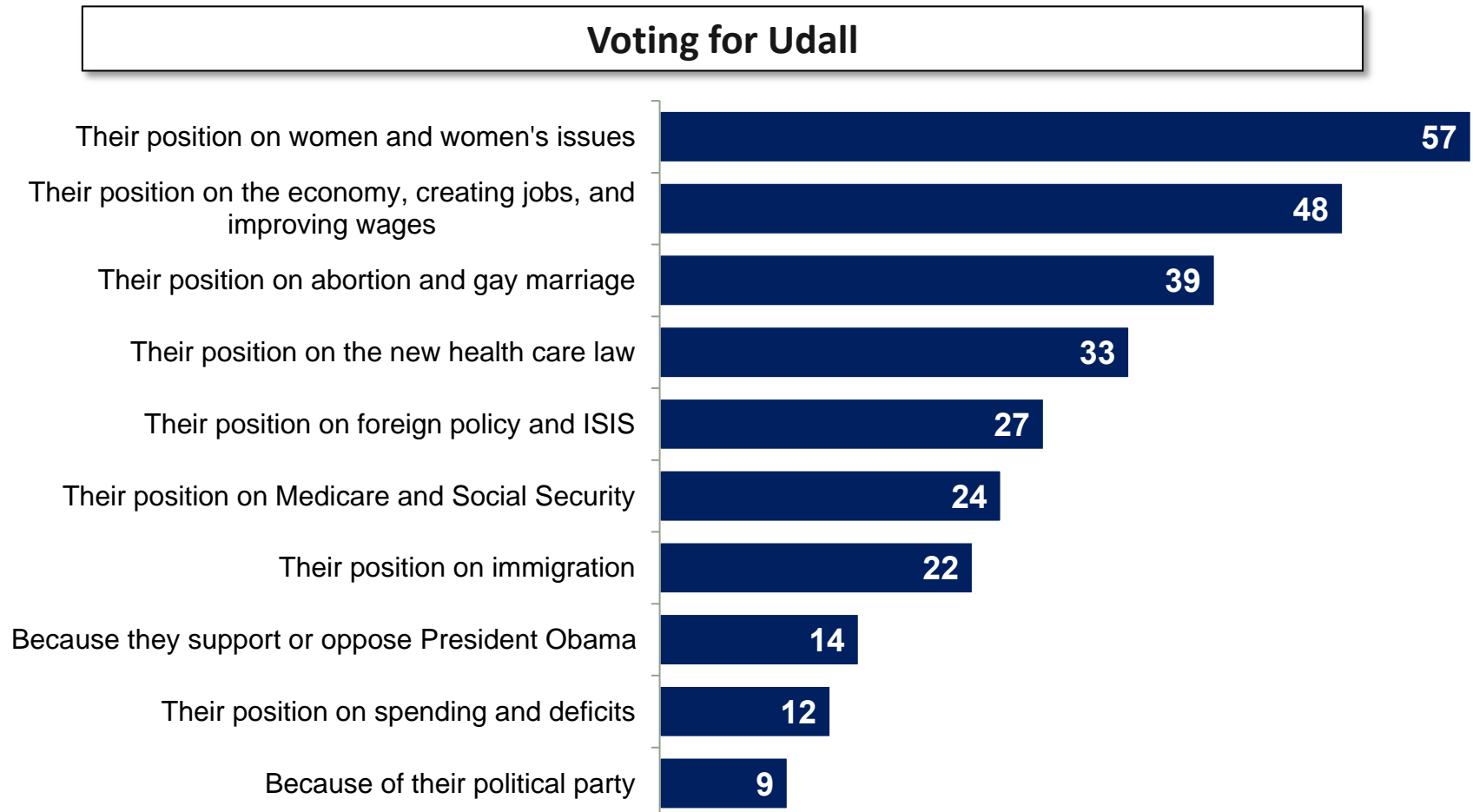

Finally recognize that working mothers need help by **protecting pregnant workers and new mothers** from being fired or demoted, making sure they have paid sick days and access to affordable childcare

Pass a Constitutional amendment to **prevent wealthy special interests and big corporations from spending unlimited amounts of secret money to buy elections**, so we can take the power away from a few billionaires and give the power to regular citizens.

Raise the minimum wage to ten dollars an hour and expand access to scholarships and affordable college so working women and men can continue their education and train for better jobs with higher wages.

Support a responsible "all of the above" approach on energy to boost production of natural gas and alternative energy and create new businesses and jobs.

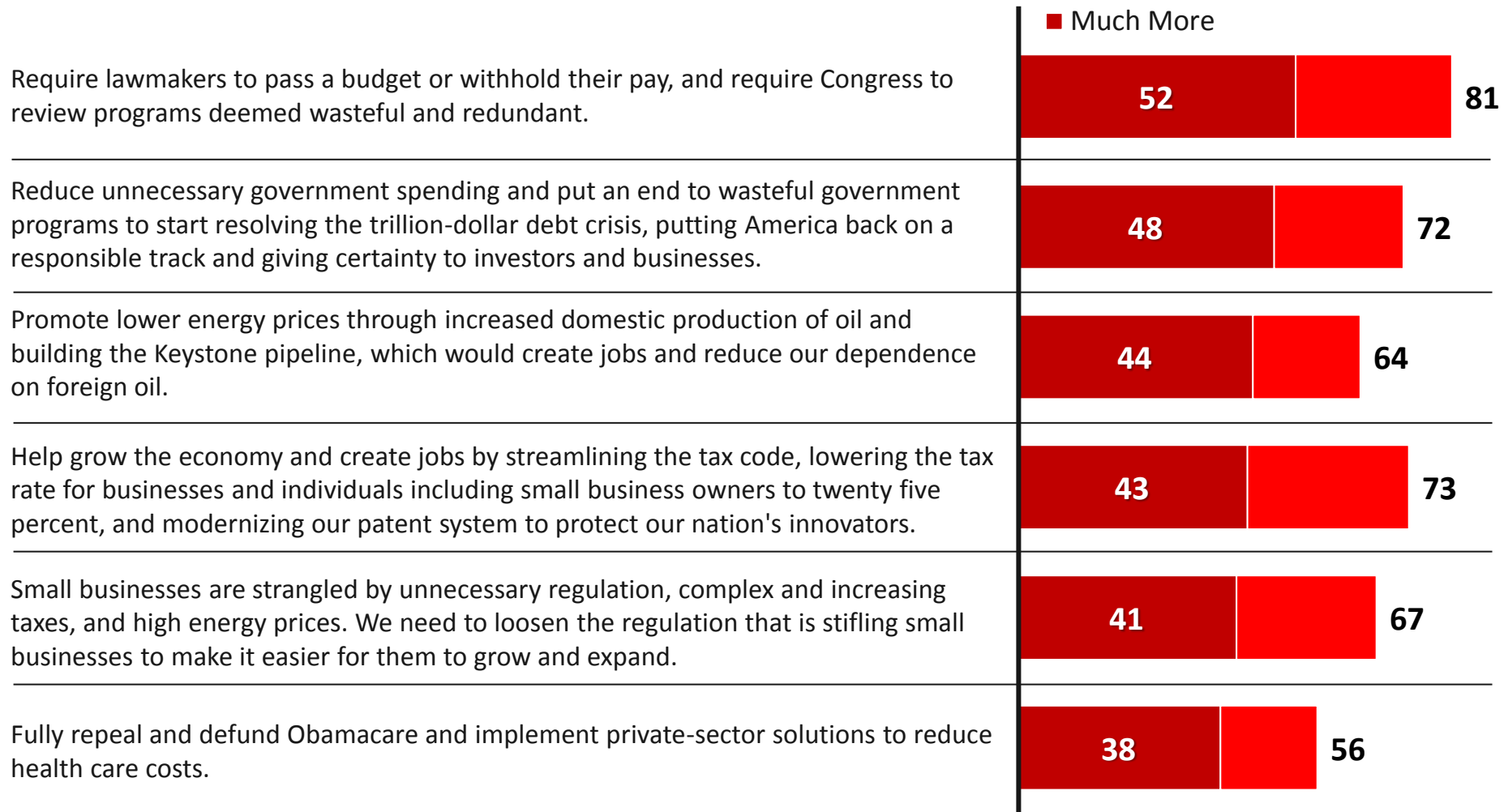

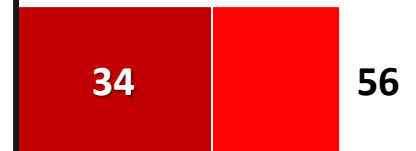
■ Very serious doubts

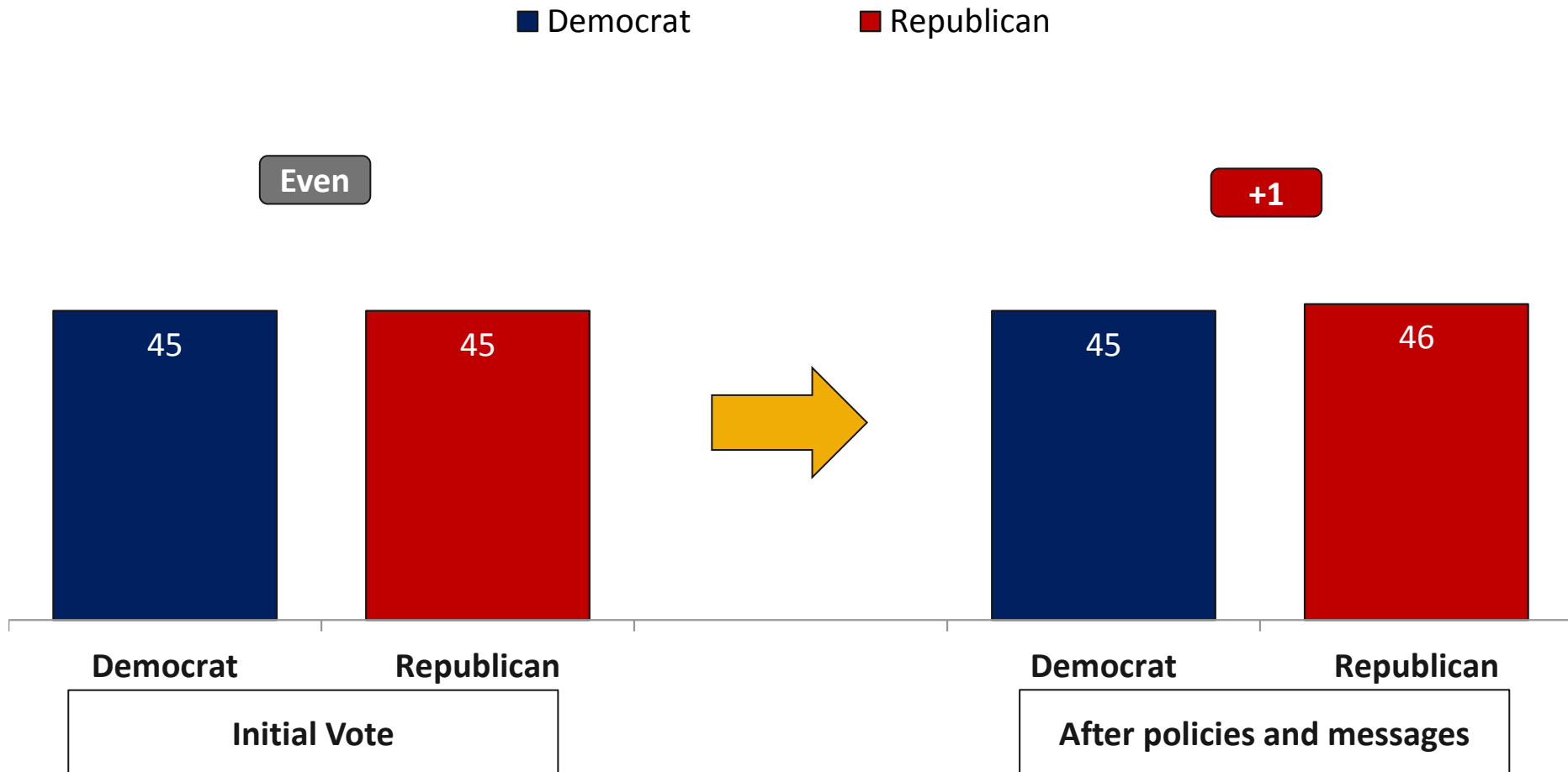

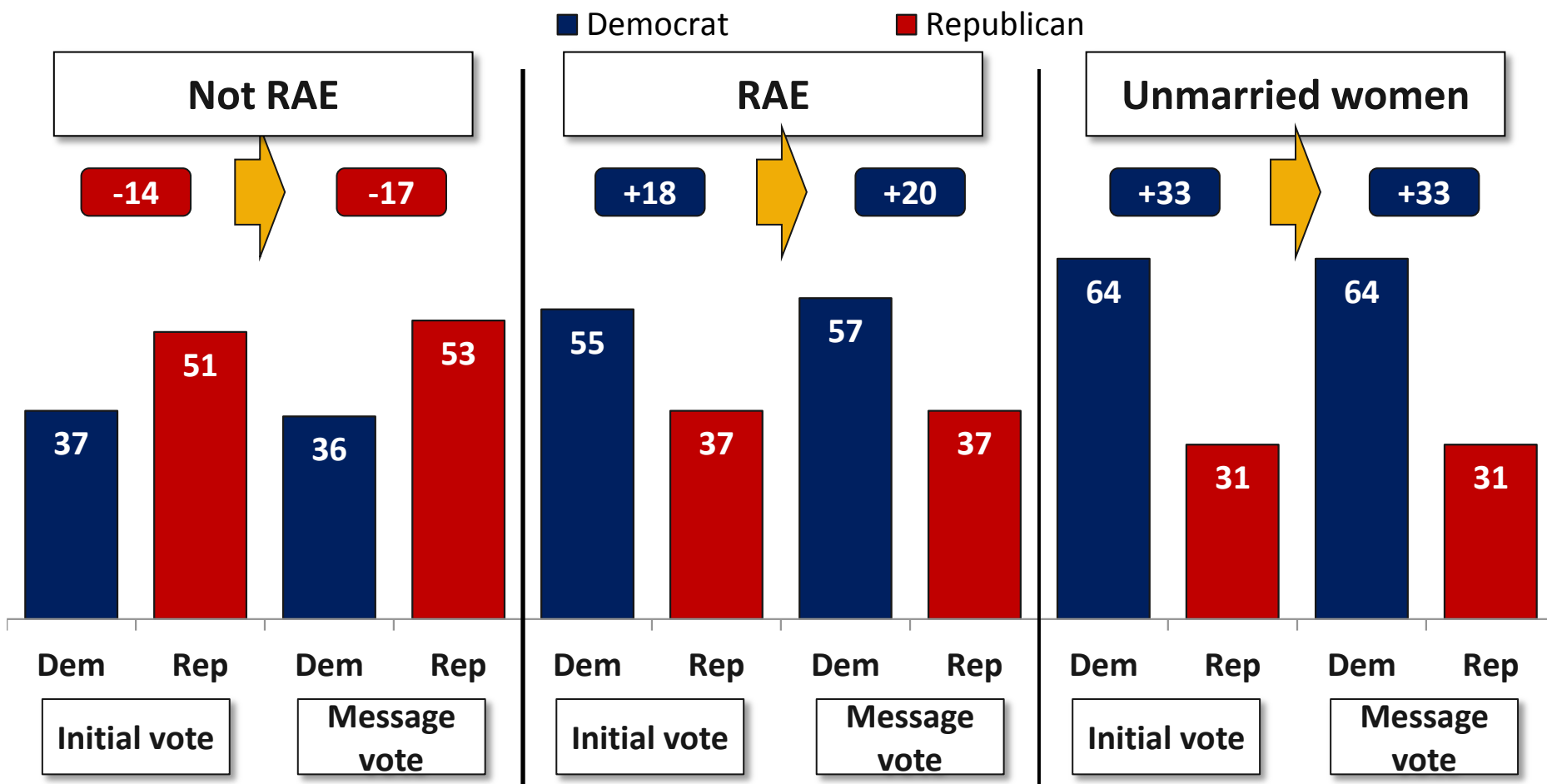
Race fairly locked in – no movement in vote after back and forth
