A wave election in 2018

DIRECTIONS:

Build the three conditions that produced past wave elections (1976, 1994, 2010, 2014)

- 1. Energized & consolidated Democratic base and anti-Trump voters
 - + Drives up margins for Democratic candidates
 - + Increases turnout among Democratic supporters
- 2. Independents & persuadables breaking against Trump & GOP Congress + Reacting against Trump and GOP overreach
- 3. GOP base and Trump voters becoming demoralized & divided
 - + Trump voters don't vote in off-year election
 - + Republicans don't turnout and GOP margin is disappointing



A wave election in 2018

INGREDIENTS: The Rising American Electorate +*PLUS*

The persuasion and turnout audiences most inclined to vote for Democrats but have disappointed to varying degrees in terms of turnout and vote in 2010, 2014 and 2016:

- 1. Blacks & Hispanics minorities failed to turnout in 2010 and 2014 and even 2016
- 2. Unmarried women unmarried women, white unmarried women especially, have underperformed for Democrats since 2010, and also need to be targets
- 3. Millennials They are the least inclined to vote in midterms, but also failed to turnout at the rates expected in 2016. Their vote for Democrats has been declining since 2008, led by the white millennials who voted for Romney in 2012.
- White working class women These voters gave the GOP landslide margins since 2010, but WVWVAF knew Clinton was poised to over-perform with them – until the campaign walked away. Their margin matters.

LIFE: Their new plan allows insurance companies in some states to push people with a history of cancer or a pregnancy into a high risk pool and to substantially increase prices for people with pre-existing conditions. That means more people will go without medical treatment because of costs and some will die. *[This plan is unacceptable to anyone who respects and cherishes human life.]*

SENIORS : Their new plan allows insurance companies to charge older Americans a lot more and makes dramatic cuts to Medicaid, the primary source of payment for nursing homes. Older Americans have been paying in their whole lives and we can't ask them to pay more when so many are struggling to retire. *[We must keep our promises and fulfill our duties to the elderly.]*

UNAFFORDABLE: Their new plan would make health care even more unaffordable when people haven't seen a raise in years. Instead of lowering costs, their plan will raise premiums by 20 percent and out-of-pocket costs and deductibles will grow even higher. [This plan betrays the forgotten Americans who voted to make it easier to take care of their families.]

RECKLESS: Their new plan was rushed through the House of Representatives in just two weeks. No public hearings with experts were held during that time and most congressmen never read the bill. They voted before the non-partisan budget office could say whether it increased the deficit, how many people could lose coverage and how much more insurance would cost. *[If you love your country, you do not act this way.]*
