The problem I didn't like with it is why do I owe all this money per year if I don't want health insurance. I just want to go to a walk in clinic once every couple of years and pay 100 bucks. D, is he pledged to drain the swamp, but his cabinet is full million dollar campaign donors with a record number of Wall Street bankers. Why did four of you choose that one?
